PUBLIC STATEMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE FORCES.

The attention of all members is directed to the provisions of AMR & Os 309 and 310 and to GROs G103/1942, G.466/1942, G 561/1942 and G192/1943.

Members are forbidden to communicate with the press or to give interviews for broadcasting or other media of publicity on military matters, whether by correspondence, personal interviews with press representatives or by any other means except in accordance with para. 3 hereof.

Members who have been on active service may give interviews on first hand experience in battle to uniformed accredited war correspondents, provided that every proposed statement of the nature referred to in this paragraph will be submitted before publication for the approval of an officer of the Directorate of Public Relations. The publication of names of members above the rank of Lieutenant is prohibited unless specifically authorised.

No restriction is placed on members in regard to articles, stories or poems for publication in the press, in periodicals or other publications, provided that these do not deal with military matters and that no indication of the military rank or unit of the contributor is given.

LOSS OF OR DAMAGE TO GOVERNMENT PROPERTY BY FIRE.

The number of fires occurring, particularly in tented camps, has resulted in serious losses of equipment and is impeding our war effort. Many of these fires could have been prevented. Particular attention will be paid to the following :-

In buildings, etc., in which smoking is prohibited, notices to that effect will be displayed prominently and the prohibition will be rigidly enforced.

In no circumstances will authority be given for smoking in garages, forage barns or dumps, stables, magazines, in the vicinity of petrol or oil stores or in any other buildings in which inflammable materials are stored.

Grass will be kept short in barrack areas, hutments and camps.

Special arrangements will always be made for the storage of petrol, oil and grease. Tins of sand will be kept available in such places, in addition to tins for oily waste etc.

Naked lights in tents are strictly forbidden.

Great care will be exercised when the tanks of vehicles are being replenished. Engines will be stopped and any petrol spilled will be immediately wiped up or liberally sprinkled with sand.

taken into or used in the vicinity of an inflammable liquid or material store or in power houses, nor will the use of such lamps be permitted when filling petrol tanks of vehicles at night or where there are loose inflammable liquids.

This Coy's Camp Fire Orders will be complied with in every detail.

241. SHAVING

In view of the acute shortage of razor blades, which until further notice will be issued to each member at the rate of 1 blade every 21 days, men will be required to shave before 0845 hrs. p.m. only on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays.

228 DIRECTIONS - PROHIBITION AGAINST MEMBERS OF THE A.M.F. OTHER THAN PARLIAMENTARY CANDIDATES ADDRESSING POLITICAL MEETINGS

Members of the A.M.F. on full time duty are required to wear uniform whenever they are in public (vide GRO 1669/1942). This requirement does not apply to members granted direction leave pursuant to GRO 1442/1943 (vide para 7 thereof).

In addition to its directions set out in GRO 1543/1943, the Commonwealth Government has further directed that members of the forces, whilst in uniform, will not address political meetings.

The result of the foregoing is that members of the A.M.F. on full time duty other than candidates are prohibited from addressing political meetings. Members of the A.M.F. will not act in a manner contrary to this prohibition.

229 SUPERANNUATION CONTRIBUTIONS - COMMONWEALTH EMPLOYEES

Whilst serving with the forces on continuous full time war service during the period of the present war, all male and female members of the Commonwealth Public Service and members of the A.M.F. are henceforth relieved of their liability to make superannuation contributions. Such contributions will be paid by the Commonwealth.

The relief from liability will, in the case of members serving on 9 Jul 43, be retrospective to that date inclusive. As on and from 9 Jul 43, all allotments in respect of such contributions will be cancelled and members' drawing rates increased accordingly.

Superannuation contributions payable in respect of any period prior to 9 Jul 43, will continue to be dealt with in accordance with instructions previously issued.

The provisions of this order do not affect contributions to any State superannuation scheme.

Income tax return forms will be made available by pay representatives.

A serious shortage of pencils of all types exists throughout Australia and there is no possibility of improvement in the position until further supplies of lead arrive from overseas. These are NOT at present in sight and production has actually ceased.

FIs can anticipate a considerable reduction in the numbers of pencils to be issued compared with normal requirements and the greatest economy must be exercised in the use of this article.

Consideration will be given by Fl Comds to the question of securing pencils by string to the tables at which they are used particularly in Fl O/Rooms, Supply Office, etc. and any other methods considered suitable will be introduced with a view to further economy.

215 MEMBERS OF SECURITY SERVICE TRAVELLING IN ARMY VEHs

A member of Security Service, whilst performing his duties as such, may be transported in an Army veh provided he has satisfactorily established his identity as a member of that Service. The fact that a member is wearing civilian clothes will not deter him from being so transported.

Work tickets of a veh carrying a member of Security Service will be endorsed with a statement of the general nature of the duty on which the member is transported.

216 COLOUR PATCHES

LHQ, Melbourne have advised that in GRO A491/1942 para 2 the expression "AIF" includes units classified AIF as well as original AIF units. A member transferred from a unit classified AIF, however, may not wear a miniature of its colour patch unless, before he transferred, he was a member of the AIF unit and unit was classified AIF.

A member of an original AIF unit who has since transferred to a unit classified AIF, may wear a miniature of the colour patch of the AIF unit of which he was previously a member. The position is the same if the unit to which he has transferred is a CMF or AIF unit. The right to wear a miniature colour patch is not affected by the fact that the unit has not served overseas.
