	21 June		Japanese suicide force attacked Company area just before dawn. 2/19 Aust. Tpt Pl (DUKWS) who were holding the Northern Side of the perimeter bore the brunt of the fighting and suffered casualties. Dvr. Hickson killed, Dvr. McMahon wounded, O.C. Capt Wales killed in ambush whilst taking casualties to hospital. The steadiness and coolness of members of the Platoon in enemy action is worthy of notice as many of the men were under their first taste of fire. Fire control of the NOO's and fire discipline of the men was outstanding. Fire was not opened until a suitable target presented itself and no man fired without an order. Numerous casualties were caused to the enemy, the known casualties inflicted on the enemy by the Platoon were three killed, two died of wounds, one wounded (POW). All documents etc were collected and forwarded to Coy HQ for Intelligence. Unloading of vehicles continued till time of attack when all personnel participated in beating off enemy's attack. At 1000 hrs Capt Wales and Dvr. Hickson were buried at Australian War Cemetery LABUAN. Personnel who could be spared attended the funeral.	
	22 June.		Lt. McLaren and 15 ORs returned to unit from operation COCONUT. 2 DUKWS and four ORs were left behind at LUTONG on detachment to 20 Aust. Inf. Bde. Lt. Walsh attached to Platoon as Adm Comd. Work of unloading vessels continues.

3. Pers landing from Westralia and Manoora were landed on Brown 1 beach near Baech Coy Hq. Difficulty in finding Unit area was experienced owing mainly to lack of knowledge on the part of Provost personnel as to routes etc. On arrival at the area it was found to be untenable and Provost could not say where DCP was located. Jeeps were parked off the road while a recon of beach area was made on foot to find DCP.

4. Discharging of DUKWS. Unloaded as soon as they were landed and began to unload LST's under direction of DCP as soon as they had returned from dumps.

5. Vehicles worked continuously for first 24 hrs, drivers and co drivers being organised into two 12 hr. shifts. These shifts have been carried on to make vehs. available night and day.

6. Maintenance. Several vehs. went to Unit W/shops during this tour of duty for repairs to propeller shafts damaged on bad roads, broken oil lines, blown gaskets and other faults. As all available DUKWS were used, routine maintenance was not fully organised until approx D + 48 hrs. This is now handled by a maintenance team of 1 Cpl and 5 D/mechs who are able to check over every DUKW at least once every three days.

7. Conclusions and suggestions. Because of the urgency of the initial task, all DUKWS were made available at first. This is a mistake no matter how urgent is the task, and three reserve DUKWS should always be grounded for maintenance. Quite a lot of trouble was caused by bad roads, especially at dumps. Before DUKWS begin to operate, a recon of the roads and ground in the dump areas should be made and tasks undertaken according to suitability of roads etc. Frequent recon should be made from time to time to keep up to date on road improvements, alteration of routes etc. Quite a lot of time was wasted by DUKWS going to dumps and finding that roads and entrances were blocked thus preventing unloading. This resulted also in serious congestion of traffic.

LUTONG AREA.

STRENGTH OF DETACHMENT. 17 June 45 1 Offr. 29 OR's 12 x 2½ ton DUKWS.

17 June 45.

Detachment loaded onto LST 667 from No. 3 slot Brown beach LABUAN IS. at 0845 17 June 45.

Vessel moved out from the beach at 1045 hrs and departed from the harbour at 1445 hrs for Red beach MAURA IS.

Vessel reached Red beach at 1630 hrs but did not beach. Whilst on board the LST I was informed that I had to proceed to Yellow beach at BROOKTON. This I did arriving at 1820 hrs and being met by the MLO 9 Aust Div.

Detachment bivouaced for the night on the edge of the beach.

18 June 45.

Vehicles were allocated totthe following units.

The trailer belonging to the air support was exceptionally big and it was necessary to utilise the spare vehicle as both trailers would not fit in the one vehicle.

During the day maintenance was carried out and red lead was applied whers needed.

The Detachment moved out for Red Beach at 1745 hrs arriving at 1840 hrs where it bivouaced. Heavy rain fell during the night.

19 June 45.

LST 667 beached on SAPOE Pt. MUARA Is. at 0830 hrs and vehicles were loaded.

Two (2) DUKWS were loaded on to LST 562 at 1130 hrs but contact with them was impossible.

Convoy of various types of craft moved out from BRUNSI area at 1630 hrs proceeding South.

Conference was called by the captain of the LST and also the OC troops. The captain explained the plan for the assault waves.

The two DUKWS on LST 562 were in wave three and the twelve on LST 667 in wave four.

Wave four was to cross the line of departure at Charlie hour + 4 and the speed of advance was to be four knots, reaching the beach at Charlie plus fifteen.

Both plans for the landing were explained and owing to the roughness of the sea the captain thinking that the alternative plan would have to be used.

20 June 45.

Reveille at 0345 hrs.

Large fires noticed on the coast wher passing SERIA.

The convoy arrived in the LUTONG area at 0630 hrs and the ships pulled into position for releasing the assault waves.

The DUKWS entered the water at 0811 hrs ~~amxtke~~ with a heavy swell running estimated to be between five and six foot. This made driving out very difficult owing to the steel ramp rising and falling with the swell.

Wave four lined up at approximately 0845 hrs and moved off in accordance with the operation order.

The surf which was between three and four feet was negotiated safely.

OPERATION REPORT (Continued).

Immediately upon landing on GRIMSON Beach "A" Frames were erected and all Jeeps and Trailers were unloaded. Drivers accomplished this in very quick time, approx. fifteen minutes. Vehicles carrying the 75 Mil. guns had to be held until the Red Line had been taken.

The two LSM's to be unloaded beached at 1300 hrs. and the unloading operations commenced at 1320 hrs.

Entering the LSM's was extremely difficult owing to the surf that was running and the drivers proved once again their capabilities.

In order to speed up the unloading DUKWS also were mooring alongside the LSM's.

21st June 45.

Unloading was suspended for approx. 1 hour when a lean plane dropped a bomb which did not explode on the beach area.

Unloading was completed by 1230 hrs and the final task was to transport Indian POW from the BBGAU area to IST 667.

Loading on board the IST was extremely difficult owing to the heavy swell. It was necessary to drive onto the top deck as the POW were quartered below. All vehicles were on board the IST by 1630 hrs.

The convoy moved out from LUTONG at 1715 hrs. and proceeded along the coast.

The fires noticed previously at SERIA were still burning.

The convoy arrived at LABUAN at 0945 hrs where the vehicles were unloaded from the IST and returned to camp.

TOPOGRAPHICAL REPORT.

MUARA IS. Red Beach. White sand, good landing beach. Between wharf and SAPOE POINT also good especially for IST as it shelves very deeply about ten feet out.
Island desolate. very sandy, no habitation. Well in area and the water appears to be OK.

BROOKTON. Yellow Beach. Situated 20 yards North of the Wharf, white sand with arc mesh track leading from the water. Roads in the beach area very sandy, low ration required, in some places water in area plentiful.

LUTONG. Crimson Beach. Situated South of the airstrip. White sand excellent landing beach for DUKWS only. Surf would be present continuously.

Whilst on the operation it was found that DUKWS can go into the IST with "A" Frame mounted and also with a Jeep in the back with the canopy up.

CONCLUSION. The detachment was congratulated upon their work by officers on the beach and without the DUKWS it would have been a very difficult job to unload the LSMs.
The skill of the drivers in manoeuvring the vehicles into the LSMs is worthy of high praise.
