40. AASC SUPPLY DEPOTS AND TRANSPORT LINES - SECURITY

It is essential that all supply depots and establishments be most rigidly guarded and that information regarding the nature of supplies stored and stocks held be kept "Secret".

Supply stores will be kept securely locked and will not be entered by any person not having duty to perform therein. Even supply personnel will be excluded from stores other than those in which they have duty. For instance, case goods personnel will not enter bread stores, and so on.

An inspecting officer will be provided with an authority to inspect, signed by an officer of the Supply and Transport Directorate and will sign the inspectors' book on the occasion of each visit or tour of duty. Any officer not having in his possession such an authority will obtain from the depot office a pass, signed by an AASC officer or, when the depot is in charge of a NCO, by the NCO in charge, after having established his identity and authority.

An inspector of the Finance Branch or of the Board of Business Administration will be in possession of an authority to inspect and an identification card, and will be required to sign the visiting inspectors' book.

No officer or inspector will be permitted to walk about in any depot without having reported to the HQ office and established his authority to have access.

It is essential that these rules be rigidly enforced to guard against the possibility of unauthorized collection of information sabotage and theft. The possibility of impersonation will not be overlooked.

In all cases when officers and others are permitted to enter supply stores, they will be accompanied by a member of the depot staff.

The same rules will apply to AASC vehicle lines, which will be protected or guarded.

It is the responsibility of the OC or senior NCO or private in charge of a supply depot, stores, vehicle lines, or other AASC establishment, as the case may be, to ensure compliance with the provisions of this order.

41. ARMY VEHICLES - PARKING OF

It has been brought to notice that army vehicles are being parked in public garages and that in some cases officers and other ranks are permitted to take army vehicles home overnight or park them in private garages. These practices will cease.

Drivers in charge of army vehicles away from their own units overnight will report to the nearest unit having mechanical vehicles on charge and request accommodation for their vehicles and themselves. Disciplinary action will be taken in respect of breach of this order.

Should it be necessary for an army vehicle to be parked in a public or private garage, the work ticket will be endorsed to that effect by a responsible officer.

42 TELEPHONE CALLS OVER KELVIN GROVE SWITCH

It has come to notice that in making calls through the KELVIN GROVE switch units in the Area are not giving the operators the telephone number and/or extension required and this is adding considerably to the work of the operators to the detriment of the efficient working of the switch.

In the future therefore the number and/or extension required will be given to the operator, and the operator will be at liberty to refuse to take a call without this information.

43. PRESELECTION OF OFFICERS

In order to ensure the exploitation of the best material available to provide Officers for the AMF, the establishment of Officers Pre-selection Boards has been approved to conduct psychological and other tests of personnel recommended or desirous of appointment to Commissioned Rank.

It is the fundamental principal of the scheme that every soldier who considers himself suitable for commissioned rank shall be interviewed by the Board.

Every soldier is therefore entitled to submit to the CO of his Unit application for interview. The application should state the arm or corps in which appointment is desired. It is pointed out however that all must be prepared to accept commissions in the arm corps or service for which the Board may consider them most suitable.

44. CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTORS AND SEVENTH DAY ADVENTISTS: ELECTION TO BEAR ARMS.

1. Any serving member of the AMF who -  
(i) in pursuance of the National Security (Conscientious Objectors) Regulations has been enrolled as a person to be employed only in non-combatant duties; or

(ii) is a Seventh Day Adventist who was enlisted before 17 July 42 is called upon forthwith to make his election in accordance with para 2 of this Order.

2. (a) Before a member makes his election in accordance with Sub-para. (b) of this paragraph it will be carefully explained to him by an officer;

(i) that his election, once made, is final and cannot be altered;

(ii) that, if he elects not to bear arms, he must clearly understand that, in the event of an occasion arising when he desires in self-defence to resist an enemy attack, he must be prepared to face such an attack unarmed and untrained, as no guarantee can be given that either arms or protection will then be available for him.

(b) Any member to whom para.1 of this order applies will have the right of electing either -

(i) to be trained in the use of arms for the purpose of self-defence

(ii) or not to bear arms.

(c) If the member elects to be trained in the use of arms for the purpose of self-defence, he will be issued with and will carry the arms and equipment normally issued to and carried by soldiers of his unit, and will be liable to perform all the ordinary training and duties of such soldiers except that he will not be called upon to perform any combatant service.

(d) If the member elects not to bear arms, he will not be issued with any arms and will not be required to perform any training or duties



involving the use of arms. In lieu of such training and duties, he may be required to perform other appropriate unit or camp duties.

3. An entry of the restriction regarding the employment of any member who has made his election, in accordance with para. 2 of this order, will be entered on page 17 of his AAB 83 thus: Conscientious objector" (or "Seventh Day Adventist") - "elects to bear arms" or "elects NOT to bear arms", as the case may be, and will be signed by an officer.

4. Detachment Commanders Toowoomba and Rockhampton and all Section Commanders will take action as per para. 3 and will complete a Nominal Roll of the names of those affected. This Nominal Roll will show against the names the entries which have been made in the books AAB 83.

Where no members of the detachments or sections desire to make the election a Nil Return will be submitted to this Headquarters.

45. ACCIDENTS - MILITARY AND CIVIL TRAFFIC LAWS.

Q L of C Area Routine Orders Q250 refers to this subject and is therefore brought before the notice of the Unit Transport Officer for necessary action.

46. DEMURRAGE CHARGES ON RAIL WAGGONS

1. Q L of C RO Q.255 provides that:-

## "YELAKI AND GREEN"

## STATEMENT REGARDING DISTRIBUTION

This statement is furnished in accordance with GRO G78/44 of  
10 Mar 1944.

2. The demand for "Khaki and Green" has greatly exceeded that for either of its predecessors. During the first three months of distribution orders were received at a rate in excess of the printer's production capacity, and it has taken time to bring deliveries up to date. The lag in deliveries is due solely to this cause.
3. On the official order form it was stated "The arrangements for production provide for 1000,000 copies to be available by 15 Dec. If orders exceed this number, the excess will be met at the rate of 12,000 per week until all have been executed." These arrangements have substantially been carried out. By Christmas 1,000,000 copies of the book had been printed and about 85,000 had been bound and posted. Since then the books have been produced and despatched at the rate of about 45,000 per month.
4. When it was found that the orders would exceed the estimate based on the 1941 and 1942 demand, arrangements to obtain additional supplies of paper, bookcloth, etc., were made and production has proceeded without interruption. Attempts to find additional printers who would take a share of the work were unsuccessful. Publication of another book which was to appear in April was postponed until July. All copies of the Army book were reserved to meet orders from members. In brief, everything that was possible was done to ensure that Army orders would be met as quickly as possible.
5. As orders were received from units they were acknowledged, the acknowledgments bearing a reference number by which the orders were subsequently identified in the records of this Section. As orders have been despatched another copy of this acknowledgment endorsed with the posting date has been sent to the unit concerned. In this way units have been placed in a position to know that their orders have been received and the date of posting. The following summary will be of interest:-

In the above table the figures given in the second and third columns are the numbers of the acknowledgments issued to units. Each acknowledgment covered a batch of orders ranging in number from 1 to 800 or more. If Pay Sergeants have retained the acknowledgments sent to them they should have no difficulty in ascertaining from the above table when

or not their unit's orders have been posted and, if so, the month in which they were despatched. If the books have not been despatched they will be able to ascertain when despatch will take place.

6. Enquiries regarding orders will willingly be answered. At present it is an advantage for enquiries to be made through the unit with which the member was serving when the order was placed so that the Pay Sergeant may advise the Section of the number of the list under cover of which the order was forwarded to this Section, and also the number of our acknowledgment. A complete set of duplicates is being sorted according to the Army numbers of purchasers and, when sorting has been completed, it will be practicable to answer inquiries by individual members, sent direct or through their units, provided their Army number at the date of placing the order is furnished.

7. In the case of reports of non-delivery it has been found necessary to decide to make the only upon receipt of written advice from the ADDRESSEE that the book has not been received. This decision was taken after it had been found that in nearly all the reports of non-delivery investigated the addressee acknowledged having received the book. This showed that members are in the practice of reporting non-delivery simply because they have not received from the addressee an acknowledgment of the receipt of the book.

8. The addressee may send advice of non-delivery to this Section direct or through the member. When such advice is received action is taken to confirm that the order reached the Section and to ascertain the date of posting. The Superintendent of Mails in then requested to make inquiries. If these do not result in the book being traced and delivered the Superintendent of Mails' advice to this effect enables the Section to make a claim under its insurance policy and, upon the acceptance of this claim, to forward another copy to replace the one which has gone astray in transit.

9. If it is found that an order has not reached the Section, the member is placed in a position to complete an authority to take the place of the missing order form. It is then practicable for the Section to make delivery and subsequently to obtain payment from the DFO.

#### AMENDMENT TO R Os.

47. SUPERANNUATION CONTRIBUTIONS - COMMONWEALTH EMPLOYEES SERVING IN THE FORCES.

For benefit of all concerned, GRO F210 is herewith brought before notice.

On and from 26 Jun 1943, the Commonwealth assumed liability for the payment of all superannuation contributions by members of the Commonwealth Public Service and Permanent Military Forces while serving in the forces on continuous full time duty during the present war.

This decision applies to any such member's normal fortnightly contributions to the Commonwealth / Superannuation Fund as determined by-

- (a) the age for retirement for which the member has elected to contribute by election prior to -
  - (i) 9 July, 1943; or
  - (ii) the date on which the contributor joined the forces, whichever is the later; and
- (b) the number of units for which the member was contributing on-
  - (i) 8 July, 1943; or
  - (ii) the day prior to the date on which the member joined the forces, whichever is the later, plus contributions for any additional units for which the member has, since such later date, become eligible by reason of an increase in the salary on which his superannuation contributions are based.

The Commonwealth will not accept liability for contributions in respect of any units for which a member was eligible on or prior to the later of the two dates mentioned in para 3 (b) but which he had not accepted at such date.

A member who on or since -

- (a) 9 July, 1943, in the case of a member who was serving on that date; or
  - (b) the date upon which the member commenced to serve, in the case of any other member,
- has elected -
- (c) to contribute for an earlier retiring age; or
  - (d) to contribute for units for which the Commonwealth will not accept liability

will now elect, in writing, either to allow his previous election to stand, or to withdraw the previous election on the ground that it was made on the mistaken assumption that the Commonwealth would pay the additional cost.

48 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

A number of traffic accidents reported lately indicate that drivers are not observing due care when passing out of or crossing other lines of traffic.

It is definitely the responsibility of the driver either leaving entering or crossing any line of traffic to ensure that he can do so with absolute safety.

Accidents due to drivers not taking sufficient care when changing direction, entering or leaving traffic lines, are becoming too frequent and all drivers under command are instructed upon their responsibility in this regard.

The fact that the driver of the other vehicle was guilty of contributing negligence will not be accepted as sufficient to warrant disciplinary action NOT being taken.

It is also noted that several instances have occurred recently of drivers being well away from their normal route when concerned in an accident and the excuse given is that they took a short cut and got lost.

All drivers will take none other than recognised routes.

49. PERSONNEL: SEAFARING EXPERIENCE

All personnel who have had seafaring experience, or who have a good practical knowledge of the use of cordage, chains, etc, the use of tackle, anchorage, kedges, etc, or a thorough knowledge of steering and handling small craft should advise this HQ of such experience.

It is necessary that particulars of such personnel, together with details of actual experience be forwarded to this HQ immediately.

50 RESTRICTION OF PAY WHEN MEMBER IN HOSPITAL.

The pay which may be drawn by a member while he is a patient in a military hospital or convalescent in a convalescent home or depot may be restricted to such amounts within his credit as may be fixed from time to time by the commanding officer of the military hospital or convalescent home or depot in which the member is a patient or convalescent.

51 ABSENCE WITHOUT LEAVE - SUSPENSION OF ALLOTMENTS AND DEPENDANTS ALLOWANCES

Amendments have been made to War Financial (Military Forces) Regulations providing for the shortening of the period upon the expiration of which a member's allotment and dependants allowance will be suspended in the event of his absence without leave. These amendments have effect on and from 1 June, 1944.

Where a member has been declared an illegal absentee, the District Finance Officer will, under the regulations as now amended, take the action outlined in paras 3 and 4 of this order.

Where no dependants allowance is payable in respect of the member's allotment, the District Finance Officer will suspend payment of the allotment as from the earliest possible date.

Where the member has made an allotment in respect of which dependants allowance is payable, the District Finance Officer will at once forward a notice to the member's allottee. This notice will inform the allottee that the allotment and dependants allowance will be suspended.

after payment of two more fortnightly instalments, including any instalment which may be payable on the date of the notice.

In addition to the forfeiture of all active and deferred pay (including the amount paid as allotment) for the whole period of the member's absence without leave, the total amount of the dependants allowance paid in respect of any day after the date of the notice mentioned in para 4 of this order will be debited to the member and will be recovered from his future pay.

Any allotment and related dependants allowance which has been suspended on account of the member's absence without leave will not be reinstated until the District Finance Officer has been advised of the member's apprehension or return to duty.

## 52. COLOUR PATCHES

The practice of wearing other than the correct L of C Area colour patch will cease.

All ranks will be issued with and will wear at all times the correct Colour Patch, supplies of which are available at the Unit QM Store.

Minature Colour Patches may only be worn on Service Dress above this Unit's Patch.

## 53. WARRANT OFFICERS - MANNER OF ADDRESSING

As it would appear that some uncertainty exists as to the correct manner of addressing Warrant Officers of the Australian Military Forces attention is drawn to the principles laid down in AMR & O 1165 (2), Viz:- "NCOs and men are to address WOs in the same manner as they do Officers but not salute them".

Similar principles also govern the method of address of WOs by Officers and other WOs.

In applying these principles, in the instances where an Officer would be addressed as "Sir" or as "Mr" of by his rank, a Warrant Officer will be addressed as "Sir" or by the title of his appointment, that is "Sgt-Major", etc with such abbreviation, if any, as in accordance with the custom of the service. A Warrant Officer will not be addressed as "Warrant Officer," "Wo" or "Mr".
