OTHER RANKS

- (a) Jacket and Trousers, SD.

Cap, SD, ORs or Beret as authorized.

Belt, waist, web (Gd1 may wear Belt Sam Browne and Gd2 may wear
Belt, waist, leather).

Boots ankle, brown with anklets, web (or gaiters SD) as authorized.

GENERAL:-

- (a) Patches, distinguishing colour will be worn in accordance with the provisions of GPO 60/46, i.e. members will wear the colour patch authorised for his unit, with the miniature of his previous AIF unit directly above. It has been noted that many personnel are not obeying this order. Unauthorised colour patches are still being worn and in some cases no colour patches are worn.
- (b) Ribands and Decorations will be worn only in accordance with the provisions of GPO 042/46, i.e. ribands will be worn by male members on jackets (all types) and may be worn on shirt.
- (c) Greatcoats. When worn by male members will at all times be buttoned up to the neck with the collar turned down.
- (d) Badges of rank will be worn on all outer garments, including officer pattern waterproof overcoats furnished with shoulder straps or spauldottes.

- (e) Service Chevrons when worn will be worn in accordance with the provisions of GRO A441/44 i.e. one for embarkation plus one for each completed 12 months of overseas service.
- (f) Wound stripes when worn will be worn in accordance with the provisions of GRO 088/44 i.e. yellow vertical stripes on left sleeve just above cuff.
- (g) Shoes will be worn by male ORs for medical reasons only.
- (h) Working Dress. Items of working dress will not be worn as outer garments whilst on leave or in the cases of members living on subsistence or out of camp whilst travelling to or from places of duty.
- (i) Correctness of dress. The practice by some male personnel of wearing unauthorized items of clothing, such as British pattern battle dress, Caps SD ORs whilst on leave or when not authorized, Caps SD officers by other than officers and ORs, etc, will be discontinued and the correct order of dress rigidly enforced and supervised at all times.
 Jersey pullover, for male members and cardigans for female members are not to be worn as an outer garment whilst on leave or, in the cases of soldiers living on subsistence or out of camp, whilst travelling to or from places of duty.
 The wearing of jackets, SD, officers by ORs will be in accordance with the provisions of GRO 0392/44.
 Items of clothing and necessaries purchased through civilian sources will not be worn unless they conform to Army specification, colour and finish.
 The practice of bleaching articles of web equipment, and web gaiters will be discontinued.

15. JACKETS & TROUSERS SD - ADDITIONAL ISSUE OF

The issue of additional jackets and trousers SD part worn or reconditioned garments to all Units of Eastern Command is withheld until further notice.

16. DRESS - PLAIN CLOTHES.

Plain clothes may be worn by members of the AMF on the mainland of Australia and Tasmania on the following occasions:-

- (i) when participating in sport;
- (ii) by male members off duty when outside military establishments, provided that plain clothes will not be worn at organized military functions;
- (iii) by female members off duty when outside military establishments, or at any social function, military or otherwise, either inside or outside a military establishment, or as prescribed in unit or camp orders.

Plain clothes for wear as authorized by this instruction may, at the member's risk, be kept in the military establishment where the member is quartered and may be worn off duty when proceeding to and from such establishment.

No additional clothing coupons will be available for the purchase of plain clothes.

Personal documents in accordance with GRO A41/45 (AAB83 and paybook) and leave pass where applicable must be carried whilst a member is in plain clothes.

It should be noted that travel concessions such as railway concession tickets, RL passes etc are available only to members travelling in uniform.

17. VEHICLES WITH FRONT AXLE DRIVE.

The front wheel drive on 4 x 4, 4 x 6 and 6 x 6 vehicles was designed for cross country operations and emergency conditions, and not for general or continuous use on good roads.

Front wheel drive will be used only in circumstances referred to in para 1 of this instruction and will not be used while operating on good roads in metropolitan areas.
