493. DISCIPLINE-COURTS MARTIAL SENTENCES (PRO 378)

1. A soldier of HQ 34 AUST INF BDE was convicted of Rape by a General Court Martial on 1 Oct 46 and was sentenced to 5 years penal servitude. A similar sentence was imposed by General Court Martial on a soldier of 14 AUST WKSP AND PK COY on 31 OCT. Both have been returned to Australia for discharge and to serve their sentences in civil prisons.

494. PERSONNEL ABSENT WITHOUT LEAVE (BASE RO A457)

1. 6 Aust Adv 2 Echelon is required to advise Records in Australia promptly, when any member of the AMF serving in Japan is reported AWL, declared an illegal absentee or when any illegal absentee is apprehended or surrenders himself. In order that this function may be performed by 6 Aust Adv 2 Echelon all units will submit casually returns immediately, they are aware of the absence without leave of any member of the AMF, or when any member of the AMF returns to the unit, is apprehended or surrenders himself to that unit.

2. In the order that prompt action may be taken, units will also notify illegal absences from the unit as required by GRO AB/45.

5. ROUTINE ORDER. Routine order NO 78 should read "Serial No 1, item 1 of Serial 75, and in the same routine order Nos 491 should read Nos 4 -". His will make the necessary alterations.

6. UNATTENDED VEHICLES

- i. There have been several charge reports recently dealing with drivers who have left vehicles unattended.
- ii. Drivers will NOT leave vehicles unattended under any circumstances, except on this Coy's authorised MT Parks.
- iii. KURE house is now placed OUT OF BOUNDS to this Coy's drivers whilst on duty, unless their duty requires them to report there.

7. VEHICLE TOOLS

- i. Pl Comds will ensure that drivers sign for their vehicle tools and that the tools are correctly listed on AEF78, the copy of which stays with the AEF78B and one copy is the Pl's file.
- ii. Drivers are reminded that they are financially responsible for all tools and equipment entrusted to their care and that all tools and equipment are subject to frequent check.

8. LOADS

- i. Too many cases are occurring of drivers NOT checking their loads correctly and many claims are reported of deficiencies or surpluses being recorded at the delivery point.
- ii. Drivers will check their loads correctly.

9. FIRST AID OUTFITS

- i. All First Aid Outfits should by now have been returned to the respective "0" stores, and it will be an offence for any member to be in possession of a first aid outfit or any part thereof.
- ii. This order is the result of several cases of poisoning from personnel using the sulphilamide tablets without correct advice.

10. AMBULANCES

- i. Drivers of a MAC will NOT permit their ambulances to be used for recreation trips such as carrying personnel to pictures and other entertainment and disciplinary action will be taken against drivers in future who are guilty of this offence.
- ii. All MAC drivers will ensure that their ambulances are closed on the rear either by doors or curtains whichever are provided.

11. VENEREAL DISEASE

- i. Personnel who do NOT report to PACS after sexual intercourse, will be charged with an offence.

VI. DISCIPLINE

- i. For the benefit of reinforcements and older members who may have forgotten, the orders mentioned hereunder are repeated for their information and necessary obedience.
- ii. Personnel will NOT enter Japanese houses, hotels, brothels, Geisha houses, banks, restaurants, cafes, wharfhouses, store houses, factories, and other places from time to time mentioned in orders.
- iii. Personnel will NOT purchase Japanese food.
- iv. Personnel will NOT remove Japanese stores and equipment of any description without approval of this HQ.
- v. Personnel will NOT procure any Japanese stores and equipment.
- vi. Personnel will NOT ride on Japanese trains without permission of this HQ and the R.T.O.
- vii. Personnel will NOT consume alcohol anywhere else but in their canteens or messes or other units canteens or messes and Hostels.
- viii. Personnel will NOT carry alcoholic drinks out of their canteens or messes.
- ix. Personnel will NOT have in their possession whilst on duty or on leave outside this camp area or P1 areas, any alcoholic drinks.
- x. Personnel will NOT consume alcoholic drinks whilst in charge of a vehicle or within two hours of taking charge of a vehicle or within two hours of being warned for duty.
- xi. Personnel will NOT sell or exchange their canteen goods to Japanese nationals.
- xii. Personnel will NOT leave camp without a properly authorised leave pass unless on duty.
- xiii. Personnel will carry their AIBS's, and pay books and wear their identity discs at all times. If their AIBS's or pay books are withdrawn by the Adm Staff, they will obtain a receipt for same and will carry on their person that receipt at all times.
- xiv. Personnel will be correctly dressed at all times either on duty or on leave.
- xv. Personnel will NOT interfere with electrical fittings in any manner whatsoever.
- xvi. Failure to observe the above orders will incur disciplinary action.

LEAVE

- i. Personnel are reminded that members who commit offences or contract venereal disease are the last ones to be considered for leave in JAPAN. This order will be enforced in the future.
- ii. P1 Comds will observe the provisions of this order in future.



22. PRIVATE COMMUNICATIONS CONCERNING CASUALTIES. (MBI 170 of 27 Dec 47)

1. Private cables, telegrams and communications by air mail reporting casualties to members of the AMFAre prohibited save and except where such communications are sent by a member relative to a casualty sustained by himself.

2. The prohibition imposed by para 1 hereof has been dictated by motives of consideration for the feelings of the relatives of members of the AMF to ensure that they will not receive inaccurate information from any unofficial source prior to receipt of authentic notification through official channels.

23. ADVANCES OR OVERDRAWS OF PAY (MBI 183 of 27 Dec 46)

1. A unit paying officer or pay representative will not make any payment that will cause the overdrawing of a member's pay book, except as set out as under:-

- (i) a member whose pay book is overdrawn may be paid within the limit of the restricted drawing rate which has been endorsed in the pay book by a representative of the District Finance Officer or Chief Paymaster;
- (ii) a paymaster may overpay a member to the extent of 75% of any estimated claim for travelling allowance on the written authority of the member's CO, and such overpayment will be adjusted by the member on payment of his claim for travelling allowance;
- (iii) a member proceeding on leave of more than 72 hours may be paid in advance against his credit earnings calculated to the date of expiration of such leave;
- (iv) a member may be paid in advance in special circumstances (for example, prior to embarkation or upon disembarkation) where such payment is authorised by instructions issued by AHC. In exceptional circumstances, an advance against the security of deferred pay may be made where the necessary approval has been obtained in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Finance Officer.

I. BARRACK DISCIPLINE

- i. All persons occupying the new billets will obey the following orders;
 - a. Only cupboards authorised by this H Q will be permitted.
 - *. Only one cupboard will be permitted to each member.
 - o. All cupboards will be kept tidy and free from rubbish.
 - o. Dirty clothes will NOT be put in cupboards but in dirty linen bags provided.
 - e. All kit will be laid out as directed by BRIT COMBASE.
 - f. All clothing such as uniforms and overcoats will be hung in the cupboards.
 - g. Duralinium boxes will be placed at the foot of each bed.
 - h. Duralinium boxes will be used solely for the purpose of storing the members own private effects, the cupboards will contain his military issues.
 - i. The barracks will be swept out each morning and again at 1:00 hrs, and they will be scrubbed out with water and disinfectant every 3 days.
 - j. Sweepers are the responsibility of the CO and only he operated by them.
 - k. Fuel for stoves to be used will be issued as required from the COMS and will NOT be stored in the barracks.
 - l. The sand tray operated by the space heater will NOT be used as an ash tray or as a receptacle for any other rubbish.
 - m. Each cupboard will bear the owners R. No. and name.
 - n. The name of the NCO in charge of the barracks will be clearly displayed in a neat manner outside the NCO's room.
 - o. The names of all other occupants of the barracks will be listed in order from right to left from the barrack entrance as occupied and this list will be kept up to date and kept in the NCO's room.
 - p. Pl Cards will not be used in the barracks. Pl cards from COMS and will be responsible for printing the barracks in a clean and tidy state. Other NCO's will be made responsible for their particular sections.
 - q. The NCO i/c of the barracks will report to the Pl Com daily that his barracks are ready for inspection.
 - r. Personnel will NOT drive nails, hooks or screws into the barrack walls.
 - s. Personnel will NOT cut or damage walls, doors or fittings and will NOT paste notices or pictures on the walls.
 - t. Personnel will NOT interfere with electric fittings.
 - u. Personnel will wipe their boots before entering the barracks.
 - v. Under NO circumstances will locked be permitted in the barracks and offenders in that regard will be punished and their beer ration cancelled.
 - w. Personnel will place cigarettes and matches in ash trays and NOT on floors.
 - x. The NCO in charge of the barracks will extinguish the lights at 1:30 hrs each night, and if he is absent on duty, he will nominate one of the section NCO's to perform that duty.
 - y. Personnel will conduct themselves within their barracks as they would in their own homes.
 - z. Miscellaneous will be permitted under verbal directions as to their location and manner of connections.
11. A copy of these orders will be displayed at each end of the barracks.

1. Orders will be issued by all Units that personnel who indulge in sexual intercourse and thereby expose themselves to infection of V.D., will attend a PAC immediately for treatment. Failure to do so will be treated as disobedience of orders and will be suitably punished.

28. LIQUOR ON TROOP SHIPS. (BASE RO A-491 of 17 JAN 47)

1. Intoxicating Liquor will NOT be taken aboard ships by personnel leaving JAPAN on leave or discharge.

29. ONE WAY TRAFFIC. (BASE RO A-493 of 17 JAN 47)

1. With immediate effect a ONE way traffic circuit will be established through the POINT CAMP Area, using the following route.

29. A - 493 (Contd)

Entrance from KURE-YOSHIURA ROAD junction 518436, thence as indicated by road signs to exit to KURE-YOSHIURA, road junction 514438.

30. JAPANESE BARBER SHOPS. (BASE RO A-496 of 17 JAN 47)

1. BCOF personnel are being observed attending Japanese Barber Shops in the KURE area, for shaves, haircuts, etc.
2. It has been found on investigation that the general situation of these shops cannot be raised to our required levels in cleanliness, nor in safety from disease.
3. Units will therefore provide adequate hair cutting facilities under regular supervision within their own Unit lines.

Japanese Barber Shops are "OUT OF BOUNDS" to all Base Troops.

31. CURRENCY REGULATIONS. (PRO 3 of 10 JAN 47 Serial 1.)

All personnel of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and civilians arriving in Japan are warned that it is an offence to have in their possession any currency other than Japanese.

In the case of personnel arriving by sea or by Air, adequate provision is made for the exchange of non-Japanese currency immediately upon arrival.

32. ORDERS TO GUARDS AND SENTRIES. (BASE RO G-488 of 17 JAN 47)

1. All orders to sentries will include the following paras :-

- (a) You will fire only when all the following conditions have been fulfilled.
 - (i) If the person or persons have failed to stop in answer to challenge clearly repeated twice.
 - (ii) If the person or persons are obviously NOT authorised to be in that vicinity.
 - (iii) If the person or persons are acting in a suspicious manner.
- (b) If innocent persons are likely to be killed or injured by the shooting, sentries will NOT fire unless the nature of the offence committed or apparently committed by the escaping person warrants such action being taken.
- (c) When the above conditions have been fulfilled and it is necessary to open fire, fire will be for effect and NOT wise of target.

33. CONFINEMENT TO UNIT AREAS AND ABSTENTION FROM ALCOHOL.

The following order is published in accordance with BRIT COM BASE memo 500.1A.

The undermentioned personnel will NOT leave the barrack Area, except on duty, and will NOT enter the Wet Canteen, nor be permitted to draw their Beer Ration for a period of 15 Days from the date shown against their names :-

34. LEAVE TO COUNTRIES OUTSIDE JAPAN OTHER THAN AUSTRALIA - AMF PERSONNEL. (OPM ADM INSTR No. 1.47.)

With effect from 20 DEC 46, the conditions governing the grant of leave to AMF personnel to countries outside Japan, other than Australia, are as follows :-

- (a) Leave of this nature is only permissible in those cases where the member concerned has signed on for a second term of duty in Japan, and is subject also to observance of the conditions in (b) (c) and (d) below.
- (b) Leave may be granted provided NO expense is incurred which will be a charge against the Australian Government.
- (c) The recreation leave which remains to the member's credit in his AAB83, after the debit of 28 Days has been made, being further debited with the amount of travelling time involved less the average travelling time taken in the movement of a member from his Unit in Japan to Australia and return, and
- (d) Where the leave remaining to the member's credit after the debit of 28 Days has been made is insufficient to cover the travelling time, as computed in sub para (c) above leave without pay may be granted to the extent necessary to comply with the conditions herein.

2. Unit Pay Representatives are to ensure that leave records are adjusted accordingly by correct debits to members concerned and the grant of leave without pay promulgated through Routine Orders Part 11 where applicable.

3. It is to be noted in connection with leave generally, that all leave taken outside Japan is to be debited to member's AAB83.

In the course of my visit I drew your attention to certain matters that needed remedy. However, I found much that warranted my commendation. On the eve of my departure from Japan I desire to extend to you and to the members of your staff my great appreciation of the manner in which I and my party were received and for the many considerations and courtesies that were extended to us. The Government and people of Australia will be informed by me that the members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces continue to uphold the traditions of the British Nations they represent and that we have every reason to be proud of them."
