318. BATTERIES, SECONDARY, PORTABLE, LEAD-ACID: CARE, CONSERVATION AND SENTENCING. (GRO O.264/44)

1. It is apparent that all ranks have not always been impressed with the seriousness of the present shortages of batteries, secondary, portable, for MT and wireless requirements. Every effort will be made to preserve and prolong the working life of this equipment.
2. Cleanliness, regular maintenance, correct storage and use, supplemented by technical advice from RAE and Signal technical sections, AASC wksp and LADs will ensure that units obtain the maximum service from batteries and that sound, well-preserved stores are returned for reconditioning.
3. Adequate facilities exist for all units to maintain their battery equipment in a high state of efficiency and it is essential that COs of units rigidly enforce unit battery maintenance. All officers directly concerned with the operation or handling of batteries will take immediate action to reduce the present excessive usage rate of these stores and to impress upon all personnel the necessity for exercising the greatest care in handling and transportation.
4. The use of batteries, secondary, portable, for any unauthorized purpose, such as the lighting of tents, huts and similar uses, will be discontinued forthwith, and such batteries will be returned to the nearest RSD immediately. COs of units will be held personally responsible for the implementation of this instruction.

319. TRAFFIC CONTROL: (NT Force Order Serial 9 para A.36)

Vehicles used by Provost Corps for the purpose of exercising traffic control on the STUART HIGHWAY and in DARWIN will be clearly marked with a sign front and rear -

"TRAFFIC CONTROL"

Handling of fresh vegetables from farms /-

320. HANDLING OF FRESH VEGETABLES FROM FARMS:

(INT Force Order Serial 9 para Q107)

The production of NT Farms is increasing rapidly and within a few weeks large quantities of fresh vegetables will be supplied daily to units from this source.

It is essential that strict supervision be given to the handling of these items and GO's and O's C will give personal attention to the following points:

- (a) TOMATOES: These should be uncased on receipt, and placed in racks under cover to complete the colouring process. The practice of placing tomatoes in the sun to colour them is very undesirable, and has the effect of shrivelling the fruit rather than colouring it. Whilst on the racks it is advisable to cover the fruit with hessian or bags. This excludes light, maintains a more even temperature, and hastens the colouring process.
- (b) CABBAGE: Cabbage is more valuable vegetable eaten raw, and should be shredded and used for salads.
- (c) CUCUMBERS: Cucumbers are ready for use on receipt and should NOT be held until they soften.
- (d) WASHING: All vegetables should be well washed before being used to remove traces of insecticidal sprays which are poisonous.

321. PENSION CLAIMS: (HQ 14 L of C Sub-Area Circular A.38)

- 1. Attention is drawn to GRO A718/1943.
- 2. It has been brought to notice that personnel leaving the Army are not being given reliable advice in regard to the lodgment of claims for pensions.
- 3. There are two types of pensions payable under the Repatriation Act, i.e., War pensions and Service pensions, both of which are administered by the Repatriation Commission.
- 4. War pensions are based on the degree of physical damage by injury or disease suffered by the economic circumstances of discharged personnel, except where a special rate of war pension is granted. Actually, a War pension is periodical monetary compensation for pain, discomfort, loss of social amenities and the like. Earnings are not taken into account in the pension assessment. The payment of a "special rate" war pension is the means of providing a living where, through war disablement, the individual cannot earn more than a negligible percentage of a living wage. Obviously in these latter cases the ability of the individual to earn is taken into account.
- 5. Service pensions (as distinct from War Disability pensions) may be paid to ex members of the Forces who are:
 - (a) 60 years of age (55 years for female members)
 - (b) permanently unemployable
 - (c) suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis, not war caused.Eligibility under (a) and (b) is limited to male members who served in a theatre of war, and to female members who embarked for service abroad or served in a theatre of war. Service pensions are social in character and a limit of income from all sources is imposed.

321. PENSION CLAIMS (cont)

6. The degree of any disablement is determined by a Final Medical Board, which determines also whether the disablement is attributable to, or has arisen as a result of war service.
7. An officer of the Department of Repatriation is in attendance at Final Medical Boards to advise personnel concerning Repatriation benefits, and to assist them in the preparation of their claims.
8. Care will be exercised by Commanders and Staff who are dealing with personnel being discharged to ensure that they are correctly informed.

308. COMMONWEALTH REFERENDUM 1944:

In connection with the forthcoming Referendum members of the AMF -

- (i) may attend meetings in uniform
- (ii) will not address meetings
- (iii) will not take part in processions or demonstrations
- (iv) will not undertake canvassing or the distribution of literature or cards.

Special leave will not be granted to members in connection with the Referendum campaign.

309. KIT LAYOUT:

The following kit layout will be observed in both huts and tents:-

- (1) Palliasses to be rolled in three.
- (2) Blankets to be folded in approved manner the third to be folded around others in envelope fashion.
- (3) Blankets to be neatly placed on palliasses.
- (4) Equipment to be placed on top of blankets.
- (5) All to be stacked at head of bed.
- (6) Boots to be placed in front of palliasses soles turned outwards.

310. BOTTLES AND SALVAGE:

Platoons are to have one salvage dump. All bottles etc are to be stacked in these areas before 1000 hrs daily.

311. SPEED LIMITS PASSING CAMP AREA:

Vehicles of this Coy will reduce their speed to 10 mph while passing any section of the camp. Notice is on roadway where this restriction is to commence.

312. TRAFFIC RULES - OVERTAKING: (MT Force Order Serial 9/44 para A187)

1. It is declared an offence for a vehicle to overtake another vehicle of a similar type where it entails driving beyond the maximum speed.
2. It is likewise an offence to overtake on a curve, when approaching the crest of a hill, or in a cloud of dust.
3. A vehicle which is overtaking will give way to an approaching vehicle.
4. The horn will be sounded before overtaking another vehicle.

TRAFFIC CONTROL - ENTERING STUART HIGHWAY -/-

Routine Order Part 1 Serial No 144 continued.

313. TRAFFIC CONTROL - ENTERING STUART HIGHWAY:

(NT Force Order Serial No 9/44 para A.88)

1. All vehicles about to enter STUART HIGHWAY from any side road by track or from any unit lines, will stop at least 5 feet before the front of the vehicle reaches the Highway.
2. Steps will be taken forthwith to erect STOP notices on all side roads to warn drivers as above. In the case of unit roads or tracks this will be unit responsibility. In the case of other than unit roads the signs will be erected under arrangements to be made by HQ NT Force.
3. Drivers will look both ways whilst halted, and before moving on will ensure that there is no vehicle approaching him from either direction along the STUART HIGHWAY within at least 50 yards of his vehicle.
4. All vehicles passing along the STUART HIGHWAY have the right of way over vehicles entering the Highway.
5. Coy R O No 100 para 177 is hereby cancelled.

314. TRAFFIC CONTROL - MARKING OF VEHICLES:

(NT Force Order Serial No 9/44 para A.89)

It is essential for purposes of traffic control that the registered numbers of vehicles and unit serial numbers be clearly distinguishable.

In some cases rear numbers are completely obscured by dust and cannot be distinguished, especially at night.

Drivers will therefore keep their rear numbers cleaned at regular intervals.

In every case registered numbers of vehicles must be painted in white paint, if possible on a black background.

315. TRAFFIC CONTROL - SPEEDING:

(NT Force Order Serial No 9/44 para A.91)

1. From 1942 to present date orders have been issued from time to time with regard to the prevalent offence of speeding, and drawing attention to the seriousness of this practice.

2. Many serious, and, in some cases, fatal accidents are still occurring as the result of reckless driving and breaches of orders and traffic rules.

3. It is directed that the offence of speeding be viewed gravely by all authorities who have occasion to administer the disciplinary code in NT.

The responsibility of Commanding Officers in this respect is stressed, and they will ensure, by means of unit orders, and addresses given personally by them to their troops, that the attention of all ranks is drawn to the necessity of exercising and maintaining the strictest care when driving or otherwise in charge of motor vehicles.

4. Every officer in NT Force will, moreover, be charged with the duty of watching for and taking steps to report any breaches of traffic rules, even if this may mean a temporary deviation from any duty on which the officer may be engaged.

5. By mutual agreement combined Allied Service traffic patrols are now in force and can pull up vehicles of any Service.

6. An officer of any Service is now authorised to take action whenever he sees a breach of traffic regulations committed by a driver of any Service by reporting the particulars of the vehicles concerned and the breach committed to the HQ of his own Service, which will transmit them to the HQ of the Service concerned.

In effect every officer in the Northern Territory is to become a potential traffic supervisor.

Speed limits in NT /-

Routine Order Part 1 Serial No 144 continued.

315. TRAFFIC CONTROL - SPEEDING (cont.)

7. For information the speed limits in NT are again promulgated as under:-

Staff Cars, Cars, 6-str utility; Jeeps and M/Cycles.....40 mph
Utilities and vehicles up to 30-cwt30 mph
All other vehicles (wheeled)25 mph
Carriers15 mph
Ambulances will not exceed a speed of 30 mph unless the driver is ordered by an MO to exceed that speed. This will be done only in a grave emergency; and the MO will suitably endorse the Work Ticket of the driver.

Tracked vehicles are forbidden to travel on a bitumen surfaced road.

8. Reduced speed limits have been placed on certain sections of NT roads, mainly on dangerous curves and past camp areas. Signs have been erected at such places, and disregard of these warning notices will constitute a traffic offence, to be dealt with by disciplinary action.

316. NIGHT LEAVE:

All personnel proceeding on leave will parade at Coy HQ for inspection at 1850 hrs nightly.

298. DRESS IN COY AREA: (Coy HQ Pt 1 No 131 para 237 republished)

The following will be the dress worn by all ranks within Coy area - boots, socks, hose-tops, puttees or anklets web, shorts. Shirts will be worn as required by OC Pls.

299. SHAVING AND HAIR CUTTING: (Republished in substance from GRC A118/44)

All personnel will keep the hair of their head tidy and short, and will shave their chins, underlip and cheeks of their face daily. A moustache may be worn but side whiskers will not be worn.

300. TRANSPORT FOR UNIT RECREATION:

Platoon Commanders will submit requisition to Coy HQ 24 hours before time of proposed use of vehicle. Particulars required - number of personnel to be carried, destination, anticipated mileage and duration.

301. ELECTRIC LIGHT:

All lights will be switched off when not in use.

302. STANDING ORDERS FOR DRIVERS OF MECHANICAL VEHICLES:

(14 L of C Sub-Area RO Serial No A133 of 15 Jul 44)

1. Attention is drawn to para 30 of the above publication, which sets out the forms to be carried on the vehicle at all times.
2. Each Driver must also carry his Identity Discs, and AAB 83 (Records of Service Book) at all times.

303. ROUGH HANDLING OF FOOD SUPPLIES WHILST UNDER AMF CONTROL INVOLVING LOSSES AND CONDEMNATIONS: (GRC Q.244/44)

1. The rough or careless handling of food supplies on wharves and at railheads and transhipment centres is resulting in a considerable and unwarranted loss of food stuffs. Canned goods, which should have normally arrived at destinations in sound condition, have been condemned owing to breakages, split seams on cans and other spoilage. Condemnation of perishables has also been the result of failure to unload or move promptly.
2. To reduce losses to a minimum, all officers in charge of AMF personnel employed in shipping, railings and transporting of food-stuffs generally will take necessary measures to enforce prompt and efficient loading and unloading of goods and to ensure the proper handling thereof.

ROYAL MILITARY COLLEGE OF AUSTRALIA /-

Forms of application and particulars of eligibility, examinations etc may be obtained through this HQ.

To be eligible for admission to the College as a cadet, a candidate must:-

- (a) be medically fit;
- (b) be unmarried;
- (c) be a British subject permanently resident in Australia;
- (d) be over 18 years of age and under 20 years of age on 24th February, 1945.
- (e) have the following minimum educational qualifications:

a Pass or higher certificate at a public examination for the "Leaving" (or "Senior") or the Intermediate (or "Junior") in:-

English - Mathematics - one other language
and any one of the following subjects:-

Physics or chemistry
Geography
Book-keeping
Economics etc. in accordance with RMC
Regulations.

Candidates who have qualified for the Leaving (or Senior) certificate will receive preference over those who have qualified for the Intermediate (or Junior) certificate.

A confidential report from the Commanding Officer will be submitted with the application of a candidate who is serving in the AICF.

305. TIDINESS OF PL AREAS:

Pls are reminded that cleanliness of personnel huts and tents is essential, particularly areas adjacent to living quarters. It will therefore be the responsibility of personnel occupying huts, tents etc to see that areas surrounding same are cleaned and tidied up daily.

Pl Comds to give this matter personal attention and action to be taken against offenders.

306. TREATMENT OF ALL DRINKING WATER:

Recent tests made of the river water have shown that immediate steps are required to purify water drawn from the river for drinking purposes. The following steps will be taken immediately by PIs using river water for drinking purpose and all FI personnel will be warned against the danger of drinking river water, which has not first been boiled or treated in the correct manner.

Each Pl so concerned will immediately set aside one or more steel 44 gall drums according to its demand, have same mounted on stand in suitable position in area and marked DRINKING WATER in 3" letters. Pl Comds will be responsible to see that this water is treated daily by Pl or Coy HQ Hygiene personnel, and that all personnel are instructed as to the source of drawing their drinking water.

Pls to advise this HQ when this matter is completed.

293. INCOME TAX - LIABILITIES OF MEMBERS OF THE FORCES AND COLLECTION OF TAX BY INSTALMENTS: (Extracts from GRO F.233/44)

Members required to lodge tax returns -

A member on full time military duty, the total of whose military and private income exceeds £250 during the year ending 30th June, 1944, must lodge an income tax return with the Deputy Commissioner for Taxation in the State in which the member enlisted. Such return need not be lodged by a member serving outside Australia unless his private income earned in Australia exceeds £250.

Preparation of returns -

Income tax return forms, together with printed instructions, may be obtained from pay representatives. The forms should be completed to show full details of private income, military income and particulars of dependants and other items for which rebates are allowable.

Deductions to meet member's liability on private income -

Where a member has private income in addition to his military income, he may increase the rate of his deduction to provide for taxation on such private income. Such additional deduction will be entered in the member's pay book and will operate from the same date as the deduction in respect of his military income. The deduction in respect of the member's private income will not be varied during the group year.

294. SALES TAX EXEMPTIONS - PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS (GRO F234/44)

1. The Sales Tax Exemptions Act provides that certain items of uniform of approved pattern may be purchased by members from civilian sources without payment of sales tax. This provision includes the following:-

Jacket, S.D., officers
Safari jacket
Trousers S.D., officers
Greatcoat
Cap, S.D., officers

2. The exemption will not be available unless -

(a) the articles in question are purchased exclusively for military purposes; and

(b) a certificate is furnished by the purchaser to the vendor in accordance with the pro forma set out in the Schedule to this order.

3. GRO F.126/1943 is cancelled.

2. Similarly no amount in excess of £5 will be deposited to the account of any member of NT Force in any Bank in the Northern Territory without the approval described in para 1.
3. It will devolve upon the Commanding Officer to satisfy himself that the remittance or credit does not arise from any unauthorised or illegal source.
4. NT Force Order 26/43 and NT Force Adm Order No 8 para 50 are hereby cancelled.

341. DRESS - WEARING OF SHIRTS: (NT Force Order 11 para A.128)

1. Attention is directed to NT Force Adm Instr No 106 of 27 Dec 43 which provides (inter alia) that drivers of vehicles will wear shirts when driving outside unit lines; that passengers in vehicles proceeding outside unit lines will likewise wear shirts and that personnel generally when visiting or otherwise moving outside unit lines will wear shirts except when they are members of a working party actually engaged in work of a physical nature.
2. The provisions of this Instruction will be enforced and disciplinary action taken against offenders.

342. CAMERAS AND CONTROL OF PHOTOGRAPHY: (ORO G.18/1944)

Use of Cameras:-

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, all ranks may possess and use cameras.
2. An officer in each unit will be appointed C IC Photography and he will maintain a register showing the number, make and description of every camera held in the unit, together with the name of its possessor.
3. All ranks in each unit will ensure that cameras in their possession are registered with the C IC Photography of the unit.
4. The GOC of a division or higher formation will determine whether personnel in the whole or any part of the area under his command will be permitted, for unofficial purposes, to carry or to use cameras or to process films or prints, or to possess the materials used for such processing.

Use of Cameras (cont.)

5. The GOC of a division or higher formation may also determine the number of cameras to be held and used in each unit for official unit photography. Personnel retaining cameras for such purpose will signify their agreement to the following conditions:-

- (a) The cameras so retained will be used only for official purposes, as directed by the O IC Photography of the unit.
- (b) The cameras will remain in possession of the members concerned and will be at such member's risk.

6. In any area where, for security reasons, the GOC of a division or higher formation does not permit the possession and use of cameras, the O IC Photography in each unit will collect and forward the cameras to:-

- (a) Such persons as the possessors of the cameras direct, and at the expense of the possessors. Packages containing cameras will be sent by registered post and the registration receipt will be handed to the possessors in each case; or
- (b) HQ of the nearest I of C area; or
- (c) O IC of the nearest Base Depot.

Unofficial Photographs:-

8. (a) Films of photographs taken by all ranks for unofficial purposes will, subject to para 4 hereof and except where otherwise authorized by LHQ, be forwarded to an approved photographer for processing. HQs I of C area will arrange with approved photographers that the negatives and prints of photographs contravening this order are not returned to the sender, but are forwarded to the HQ I of C area. Such negatives and prints will where necessary, be referred to the sender's formation or unit for necessary action.

Subjects which will not be photographed:-

9. No member of the AMP will, except in the performance of his military duties, make any photograph which -

- (a) if intercepted by the enemy, might be of value to him;
- (b) might adversely affect the morale of the civilian population;
- (c) might tend to bring our own forces, or those of our allies, into disrepute;
- (d) would be in breach of any security orders, instructions or requirements of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth or of any Allied nation.

Disciplinary action:-

10. Contravention of any part of this order will be dealt with by disciplinary action. In addition the offender may be ordered to dispose of his camera in the same manner as is provided in para 6 of this order.

346. CONSERVATION OF RUBBER - SYNTHETIC TYRES: (GRO 0.302/1944)

1. This order will be read in conjunction with GRO D/167/1944.
2. The critical rubber situation and the necessity for obtaining the maximum service from tyres has been stressed from time to time. The further deterioration of the situation, necessitating the introduction of tyres of synthetic construction, renders it imperative that greater care than ever be exercised in the use and maintenance of all tyres, whether of synthetic or natural rubber construction.
3. Synthetic tyres are far more susceptible to failure through abuse than tyres constructed from natural rubber. All concerned will, therefore -

- (a) exercise the utmost care to avoid -
overloading,
underinflation,
hard braking and fierce acceleration,
high speeds,
bumps and other causes of severe impact;

347. COMMONWEALTH WAR LOANS: (GRO F.303/1944)

1. Approval has been given for members of the AMF to subscribe to Commonwealth Loans by making an allotment of portion of their pay to the Commonwealth Bank. Amounts received by the bank under the allotment will be credited to a special account in the member's name and interest will be allowed thereon at the rate borne by the bonds selected for purchase by the member. As often as funds in the account accumulate to the extent of £10, the bank will purchase a £10 Commonwealth Treasury Bond on behalf of the member.
2. Where a member desires to subscribe in accordance with the provisions of this order, he will sign an allotment, in the form WF12, of the daily amount (in even shillings) he wishes to contribute for the purchase of Treasury Bonds, the name of the allottee being shown as "Commonwealth Bank of AustraliaBranch" (with the insertion of the name of the capital city of the member's state of enlistment). The member will, at the same time, sign a printed notification to the bank, a copy of which is set out in the appendix to this order. Forms of notification may be obtained from unit pay representatives.
3. Bonds will be held by the Commonwealth Bank at the Capital city of the member's state of enlistment for safe custody on behalf of the member. In the case of members enlisted in the Northern Territory or in New Guinea, bonds will be held by the Commonwealth Bank at Adelaide and Brisbane, respectively.
4. Where a member is discharged or cancels his allotment, the special account will be closed and any balance remaining therein will be credited to the member's bank account or paid to him, whichever he desires.

365. MEDALS - ISSUE OF THE RIBBON OF THE 1939/43 STAR:

Personnel with overseas service who are NOT entitled to the AFRICA STAR may be entitled to the 1939/43 Star. Personnel in the above category may apply to this HQ and fill in a claim for the award.

366. TRAFFIC CONTROL - YELLOW LINES ON STUART HIGHWAY: (NTF Order A157)

1. Yellow lines now define the centre of the pavement on lengths of road which carry heavy traffic.

2. Broken yellow lines are painted on straight lengths of road and single continuous lines are painted on easy curves. Such lines assist drivers to maintain their proper position on the pavement. Drivers must not drive on these lines as the paint is thus soon worn off.

3. Double yellow lines are painted at sharp curves and crests where visibility of oncoming traffic is restricted. No vehicle will be driven on the wrong side of the road where double lines exist. This means that overtaking is strictly forbidden on sections covered by double lines. No vehicle or portion of a vehicle will be allowed to overhang the double yellow lines.

1. Coy Routine Order No 150, para 349, is re-published:-

"1. The Headquarters Command ASC 14 Sub-Area are situated in DARWIN at the corner of Daly and Cavanagh Streets.

2. Unless the occupant has business at HQ or traffic requirements demand it, no ASC vehicle will stop on this corner whilst proceeding in either direction.

Failure by a member to report promptly particulars of a change of next of kin or of a change of address of next of kin, in order that the appropriate Records Office may be advised, causes considerable administrative work to the army and may delay or prevent notification of a casualty being given to the proper person, thereby causing distress to the member's relatives.

/-

Each member will, therefore, be instructed that, on the occasion of any event (such as his marriage or the death of his next of kin) which renders a change of the record of his next of kin desirable or necessary, he will promptly notify his unit of the change he desires to make. Similar prompt notification should be given of any change of address of his next of kin.

Each member will be warned that a change of his allottee or an entry in his AAF 83 of a change in the particulars of his next of kin will not be sufficient to notify Records Office of a change in respect of his next of kin.

Each member will be advised that, on his marriage, any will or codicil previously made by him, save in exceptional circumstances, becomes of no effect and, under Australian Military Regulations, he is bound, upon marriage, to make a new will.

On marriage, a member will make another will immediately, either on an AAF A130 or by a separate document, and will submit the AAF A130 in an envelope (AAF A131), duly completed, to his unit HQ for transmission to the appropriate Records Office.

A member may obtain the assistance of an officer of the AALC in the preparation of a will.

370. SECOND VICTORY LOAN: (GRO F334/1944)

1. The Second Victory Loan of £120,000,000 cash will open for subscription on 26 Sep 44 and close not later than 31 Oct 44.
2. Arrangements have been made for paymasters to accept applications for Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock or Treasury Bonds from members of the forces serving in Australia or New Guinea who desire to invest their savings in the loan.
3. Loan applications may be made for an amount of £10 or a multiple of £10.
4. Treasury Bonds are payable to bearer and are issued at par for £10, £50, £100, £500 and £1,000.
5. Inscribed stock may be purchased at par for amounts of £100 or multiples of £10 above £100.
6. Interest is payable at 2½% per annum if invested for five years and at 3½% per annum if invested for 16 years, and will be credited half-yearly to a member's savings bank account or current account, if desired.
7. Interest will be subject to Commonwealth taxation but not to any income tax under the law of a State. During the period of uniform taxation, a rebate of 2/- in the £ on interest will be allowed to cover freedom from State taxation.
8. Any bank nominated by a member will, if requested, hold the bonds in safe custody.
9. Application forms will be available from paymasters and unit pay representatives and are required to be completed in duplicate. An applicant's signature will be witnessed by an officer.
10. Sufficient credit must be available in a member's paybook to cover the amount he or she desires to invest in the loan. The amount subscribed will be debited in the paybook.
11. Cash may be accepted in payment of a loan subscription, in which case the amount tendered will be entered in the paybook to establish the necessary credit and a pay sgt's or cash office receipt issued and pasted in the paybook.
12. Deposits on account of loan subscriptions will not be accepted. Where members desire to subscribe by instalments, the procedure set out in GRO F303/1944 will be observed.
13. The Commonwealth Bank will forward to a member an interim receipt for the amount subscribed.
14. Both Treasury Bonds and Inscribed Stock are readily realisable, and may be sold at any time. Any bank will arrange this for a member, if desired.

355. FIELD SECURITY WING - AUTHORITY AND IDENTITY PASS:

(NT Force Order Serial 12 para G.140)

1. Field Security personnel, whilst engaged in security duties, and Field Security (enemy equipment) personnel carry special passes issued by the Director of Military Intelligence for and on behalf of the Commander-in-Chief, Australian Military Forces.
2. These Field Security Wing authority and identity passes authorise the holders to be in any place at any time in the execution of their duty, and enjoin all persons subject to military law to give the holders every assistance in their power. Each Field Security Pass bears the description, photograph and signature of holder.
3. Units and formations under command will advise all personnel of the purport of this pass, the authority it confers and the recognition it should be accorded by members of the AMF.

356. PROHIBITED AREA - SNAKE CREEK:(NT Force Order 12 para A.147)

2. The area enclosed by the following co-ordinates excluding Sports Arena used by HQ 1 Aust BIPOD and located at 113167 is out of bounds to all ranks from 096183 SOUTH along the EAST bank of SNAKE CREEK to 098151, then EAST along the NORTH bank of SNAKE CREEK to 106155, then NE to 118183; then WEST to 096183.

357. EXCAVATION OF SAND - DARWIN BEACHES:(NT Force Order 12 para Q148)

1. The excavation and removal of sand from FANNY BAY BEACHS including MINDIL BEACH and VESTEY'S BEACH is PROHIBITED.

358. BLACKOUT MASKS - ARMY MOTOR VEHICLES (GRO 0.695/43):

2. ~~Units~~ will take immediate steps to implement paras 2,3,4 and 5, GRO O.695/43.

359. DRIED PRUNES - SUGAR EXUDATE (NT Force Order 12 para Q151):

1. The Dried Prunes packed in drums now supplied to the Services, have a low moisture content and are liable, in tropical areas, to show a white powder-like coating on the outer surface of the skin.
2. This white coating is a sugar exudate and is known in the trade as "sugaring". It is a normal condition and quite harmless.
3. The coating is removed by immersing the prunes in hot water.

1360. TREATMENT OF DISCHARGED MEMBERS SUFFERING FROM MALARIA:

(GRO A.117/44)

1. It is possible that malaria may manifest itself for the first time after a member has been discharged.
2. By arrangement with the Repatriation Commission, in such cases, provided the member establishes his identity, e.g. by production of a discharge certificate, medical treatment will be made available forthwith at the expense of the Repatriation Department, pending determination of whether the malaria is attributable to the member's war service.
3. To obtain such treatment, the ex-member -
 - (a) if he resides in the metropolitan area of a capital city should contact the local office of the Repatriation Department or apply to the Repatriation General Hospital; or
 - (b) if he resides outside the metropolitan area of a capital city, should apply to the nearest local Repatriation Medical Officer.

349. CARRYING OF PASSENGERS: (CASC memo STA 13/44 of 28 Aug 44)

1. The Headquarters Command AASC 14 Sub-Area^{are} situated in DARWIN at the corner of Daly and Cavanagh Streets.
2. Unless the occupant has business at HQ or traffic requirements demand it, no ASC vehicle will stop on this corner whilst proceeding in either direction.
3. This instruction particularly applies to the picking up or setting down of "hitch-hiking" passengers.

350. PRE-SELECTION OF OFFICERS: (Extract from GRO A178/1944)

It is a fundamental principle of the pre-selection scheme that every male soldier who considers himself suitable for appointment to commissioned rank in any of the relevant arms or corps shall be entitled to submit an application to the CO or OC of his unit for interview by a local board and shall be entitled to be so interviewed.

351. HYGIENE AND CLEANLINESS IN PICNIC AREAS: (NT Force memo 8097 of 19 Aug 44)

1. Areas used by picnic parties are frequently left in a dirty and unhygienic condition. Recent inspections have revealed considerable quantities of partly consumed tinned foods, broken bottles, newspapers and other rubbish left scattered about in the vicinity of swimming pools, etc. There is also evidence of stooing in the surrounding bush.
2. Carelessness in the disposal of rubbish is rapidly causing attractive picnic areas to be despoiled and is also creating potential fly-breeding areas.
3. All tins, bottles, foodstuffs, newspapers and other rubbish will, in future, be burnt or buried or taken away and properly disposed of before a picnic areas is vacated by any party.
4. Action is being taken to provide latrines in the more frequented areas.
5. Disregard of this instruction will be followed by disciplinary action and, if necessary, by affected areas being placed out of bounds.

352. RUBBISH DUMP:

The rubbish dump situated $\frac{1}{2}$ mile beyond Wkaps P1 is now CLOSED. NO further refuse of any description will be dumped at this spot, but it will be deposited at rubbish dump situated at 74 mile post.

353. ACCUMULATED RECREATIONAL LEAVE:

Members proceeding on recreational leave are granted free road and rail travel to their home town. Under GRO A598/1943, para 3, "home town" means:-

- for a single member - the town in Australia where his parents reside;
- for a married member - the town in Australia in which the member's spouse resides;

for a member who has neither parents nor spouse alive, or who is separated from that member's spouse for other than service reasons - at his choice -

- (i) the place in Australia where his child, if any, lives; or
- (ii) the recognised address in Australia of his next of kin as shown in the member's paybook or record of service book; or
- (iii) the place in Australia where he resided immediately prior to enlistment, appointment or commencement of continuous full-time duty, as the case may be; or
- (iv) the nearest capital city to his place of service.

If the member has no home town as defined above in Australia, the nearest capital city will be deemed to be his home town.
