A.73 FRATERNIZING AND TRADING WITH NATIVES (5 ABSA R/O A124 refers)

1. Native Villages

- (a) The responsibility for administration of village natives rests with District Services; the District Officer, the Assistant District Officer, and Patrol Officers being the responsible officers. It is through these Officers that all contact of village natives by troops should be made whenever possible.
- (b) Village Officials
Every village has a chief (Lulnai) and his assistant (Tultul) who are the native officials. If no District Service Officer is available to troops, then native contacts should be made through either of these officials. The Tultul will always be able to speak pidgin English.
- (c) As natives prefer to be left alone, visits by troops to villages, although often of pecuniary advantage to the natives, are not welcome.
- (d) Native villages are out of bounds to all ranks unless permission to visit them has been granted by ANGAU or except where necessary for a specific duty where there are no ANGAU representatives.
- (e) Providing such permission has been granted arrangements may be made for officers, NCOs and/or parties of A.M.F. personnel to visit native villages at times convenient to the inhabitants.
- (f) Personnel below NCO rank will not make visits unless accompanied by an officer or NCO who will be responsible for their conduct.
- (g) ANGAU will not issue passes to ORs unless a leave pass covering the period of visit is presented for inspection.
- (h) Native gardens are out of bounds to all personnel other than ANGAU.
- (i) For health reasons troops will not be accommodated within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of any native village or camp, unless special approval is given.

2. Relationship of Troops with Natives

- (a) The natives of the Territory of New Guinea can be of great assistance to troops in operational areas, provided their confidence and co-operation is obtained.
- (b) They should be considered as our Allies, and friendly relations must be maintained between troops and the natives but not to the extent of fraternising or "spoiling the natives" on or off duty.
- (c) Natives will not be transported in MT unless such transport is officially arranged by representatives of ANGAU or

A.75 WEARING OF SHIRTS IN RECREATIONAL HUT

1. Shirts will be worn by personnel in Recreation Hut at all times.
2. Permission is given for members to remove shirt whilst playing pingpong but shirts must be put on immediately game is finished.
3. Cpl Dickson, picquet on Recreation hut will pay particular attention to this instruction and any breaches will be reported immediately.

A.76 WASHING OF ISSUE CLOTHING (G.R.O. 103/45 is repeated)

1. Due to the short supply of all raw materials involved, it is necessary that the maximum life be obtained from all items of clothing on issue to AMF personnel.
2. Incorrect methods of washing, exposure to strong sunlight, excessive sweating and using too much of certain soap powders, may seriously affect the dyes and weaken the fibre of clothing material. Failure to remove completely all soap and perspiration by thoroughly rinsing after washing, is one of the reasons for the breakdown of fabrics.
3. Neglect to pay due attention to regular and efficient washing of garments has been responsible for many cases of dermatitis. Observance of the following instructions will assist in decreasing the incidence of all skin complaints.
4. Washing flannels and woollens.-
 - (a) Worsted shirts, socks, woollen drawers, etc, should be washed in lukewarm water and never in boiling or hot water, as this shrinks the material. A tablespoonful of ammonia added to every two gallons of water will remove grease and perspiration stains;
 - (b) Good quality yellow soap only should be used, and, after washing, the garments should be well rinsed in clean, tepid water and stretched by hand before drying.
5. Washing of cottons.-
 - (a) If cotton garments are boiled, the washing compound or soap will be added to the water prior to putting in the garments to be washed;
 - (b) If washing compound, which are usually sold in packets under well-known brands and frequently known as soap powders, are used, not more than one tablespoonful of of the compound will be added to each gallon of water to be boiled;
 - (c) If ordinary soap is used, 1-oz (approx a 1-in cube) should be added to each gallon of water to be boiled;
 - (d) It is most important that, after washing, the garments are thoroughly rinsed to remove all trace of soap.
6. It is realized that washing facilities and an adequate supply of water are not always available. Nevertheless, the hints and instructions contained in this order will be carried out whenever possible, especially in regard to rinsing thoroughly after washing.

A.77 GIFT PARCELS FOR UNITED KINGDOM ADDRESSES - DUTY FREE CONCESSION
(GRO of 6 Apr 4. Notice is repeated)

1. The conditions of the concession announced in the Notice appearing in Unit R/O A296/44 under which members of the A.F and of the British Army serving in Australia and in other places within the SWPA are permitted to send to their relatives and friends in the United Kingdom a maximum of four gift parcels per year, duty free, have been amended. The Notice is therefore, cancelled.

2. The following are the conditions applicable as from 6th Apr 45-
- (a) The usual postage rates are payable.
 - (b) Parcels must not weigh more than 5 lbs. each and must not include -
 - (i) any drinkable spirits;
 - (ii) more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. weight of tobacco, including cigars and cigarettes (50 cigars and 200 cigarettes) or any tobacco goods marked "H.M. Ships only".
 - (iii) more than $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of scent;
 - (iv) more than 2 lbs of any one foodstuff.
 - (c) The maximum value of the contents of parcels which can be sent by one person in any one year is £12, and this value may be made up as follows:-
 - (i) one parcel of £12 value; or
 - (ii) two or more parcels up to a maximum of six parcels aggregating £12 value.
 - (d) Special Customs declaration (AFs W5192) must be affixed to all parcels in order to secure the duty free concession. These declarations, where not already in possession of units, are obtainable through normal stationery channels.
 - (e) Issues to personnel will be under unit arrangements, on the basis of a maximum of six AFs W5192 per year to any one sender. A comparatively few forms should, therefore, suffice for the needs of any unit.
 - (f) Each AAF W5192 issued will have entered upon it the sender's number and name and be signed by the issuing officer in the space provided.
 - (g) Each Customs declaration represents a permissible value of £2 within the parcel to which it is attached.
 - (h) Where the value of the contents in any one parcel exceeds £2, a further declaration for each additional £2 (or fraction thereof), up to the maximum of £12 must be attached, e.g., a parcel containing goods to the declared value of £6 would require three labels attached.
 - (i) Gifts under this concession arrangement may also be forwarded by letter post. In such cases normal letter postage rates will be payable and, if the sender so desires, the article may be tendered for transmission by registered post. To be eligible for the concession, articles forwarded by letter post must conform to the same conditions as those set out above for parcels, with the exception that the maximum weight for letters (4 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs) will apply.
3. It is stressed that full duty will be levied in the United Kingdom (for collection from the addressees in respect of the contents of parcels and packets which infringe the restrictions contained in para 2(b) above. In addition to these duty charges the contents of any parcel or packet not bearing a Customs declaration, received in the United Kingdom, are subject to purchase tax amounting in many cases to 100 per cent of the value of such contents. This tax is chargeable on most manufactured articles, but tobacco and foodstuffs are excluded.

4.62 SCALE OF ISSUE - TOBACCO AND CIGARETTES (F.A.A. R/O Q58 is reptd.)

1. Due to the acute shortage of tobacco supplies in AUSTRALIA, it has become necessary to **reduce** the ration of tobacco and cigarettes to troops in First Aust Army area.
2. Commencing 1 Apr 45, the scale of issue from Canteens Issuing Points will be :-

2 Ozs tobacco and 20 cigarettes per man per week.
3. In addition to the above ration it is anticipated that a free issue will be made by Australian Comforts Fund of 2 oz of tobacco, or equivalent in cigarettes, per man per month.

A.63 GAITERS AND SKIN DISEASES (Extract from 5 Aust Base Sub Area memo A234 of 2 Apr 45)

1. Personnel may have the opinion that the wearing of gaiters has a considerable influence in the causation of skin diseases.
2. Latest reports from India, from R.M.F. the opinions of medical authorities, and a close examination of statistics which all strongly suggest that gaiters do NOT increase the incidence of skin diseases, are briefly as follows:-
 - (i) During the year ending Mar 44 the incidence of skin diseases has been lower in New Guinea than in Northern Territory. Slacks and gaiters were worn in New Guinea; shorts without gaiters in Northern Territory.
 - (ii) Gaiters protect the ankles against cuts and scratches, in which tropical sores originate.
 - (iii) Gaiters protect against mosquito bites and therefore against mosquito borne diseases, malaria and dengue. Although anophelines are night biters, *Aedes scutellaris* the dengue vector, is a fierce day biter.
 - (iv) Mosquito bites cause irritation of the skin and consequent scratching and abrasions which are frequently the causative factor of skin diseases.
3. It is directed therefore that gaiters will be worn by personnel except when protected by a mosquito net.
4. Care should be taken that gaiters when worn are so adjusted as not to be tight fitting.
5. The term gaiters used in this instruction includes Army issues such as gaiters SD, anklets web, puttees short, gaiters canvas - American pattern."
6. Disciplinary action will be taken if any breaches of this instruction are observed

Q.64 ECONOMY IN STATIONERY ITEMS (5 A.B.S.A. R/O Q108 is repeated)

1. Considerably difficulty is being experienced in the procurement of adequate supplies of certain stationery items and in particular all types of pencils and the larger sizes of envelopes.
2. It is imperative, therefore that the strictest economy be effected in the use of stationery items generally, and that present stocks of pencils and large envelopes be conserved to the utmost.

A.71 INSTRUCTORS FOR INDUSTRIAL TRAINING DIVISION DEPARTMENT OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE (GRO Notice is repeated)

1. A notice was published with GROs of 8th December, 1944, advising members of the AMF that, in connection with Commonwealth Reconstruction Training Scheme, the Department of Labour and National Service would require many additional trade instructors in technical schools and colleges and similar training organizations, particularly in the building trade.
2. It is now advised that instructors in art and applied art, science and applied science, mathematics, commerce, needlecraft and home management courses of various types will also be needed.
3. Applicants are required to be fully qualified in the branch of technical work for which application is made and should preferably have had some experience as instructors. Selected applicants without satisfactory teaching experience may be required to undergo a short intensive course of training during which the appropriate rates for instructors will be paid.
4. Successful applicants will be appointed as temporary instructors by the appropriate State Public Service authority.
5. Application forms and conditions of training and employment may be obtained from the Deputy Director of Industrial Training in the State in which appointment is desired.

 New South Wales - Sydney Technical College, Ultimo, Sydney.

 Western Australia - Perth Technical College, Perth.
 Tasmania - Education Department, Hobart.
