ENGINEERING CADETSHIPS:

1. The provision of engineering cadetships (both Civil Engineering & Electrical and Mechanical Engineering) for a limited number of cadets, who may be drawn either from serving personnel or from civilian sources, is under consideration.
2. Although the scheme has not yet been finally settled, or approved, applications will be invited forthwith, for cadetships on the following basis:-
 - (a) Cadets will be selected only from candidates between the ages of 17 and 20 years, who are medically Class A1, who are or become members of the AIF, and who have reached Leaving Certificate standard in English, Mathematics and Science or have equivalent qualifications. Parental consent to join the AIF will be required in respect of any cadet who is not already a member of the AIF.
 - (b) Cadets selected from Civilian Sources will be enlisted in the AIF and all cadets will, during their cadetships, remain serving soldiers in the Rank of private, or sapper, with pay and allowances accordingly. Text books will be provided by cadets at their own expense.
 - (c) Engineering cadetships will cover a course of Military training, courses at approved educational establishments & a final course at an OCTU, over a period of approx 3 years. Successful cadets will receive commissions subject to vacancies existing. Pending appointment to commissioned Rank, such cadets will be allotted to RA3 or AEME units in the ranks.
 - (d) Cadetships as such will terminate on the cessation of the war, but it is hoped to make arrangements for the completion of the courses which have been commenced, as part of the Repatriation scheme of vocational training.
 - (e) Cadets who prove unsatisfactory or become medically unfit or who are unsuccessful may have their cadetships terminated and be returned to normal Army Service.

3. (i) Applications will be made by serving personnel to their CO's, who will forward all applications direct to LHQ (E-in-C) to reach LHQ not later than 5th July, 1943. (This is essential to allow sufficient time for selection in time for assembly of selected cadets for the first course expected to commence on 1st September, 1943)
- (ii) CO's will, with each application, furnish a report on the candidate as to his character, ability and suitability.

A DCM ~~xxx~~ convened by Brigadier S.F. LEGGE, DA, C/MG, First Aust Army was held at Medical Board Room V.D.C., on the 9th day of July 43, for the Trial of TX 1907 Dr KOPPLEMAN L.C.E. of 2/4 Aust Coy ASC Wk/Shops.

The accused was charged with:- (First charge)

- (1) Neglecting to obey Standing Orders for Mechanical Vehicles. AA Sec 11.
- (2) Alternative to (1) Conduct - to the prejudice of good order & Military Discipline in that he, improperly used Army Motor Vehicle 8321 without authority.
- (3) Conduct to the prejudice of good order & Military Discipline, in that he, negligently drove AV 8321, thereby causing damage to a civilian car belonging to Mrs WINTER to the extent of £5/10/0.
- (4) Conduct to the prejudice of good order & Military Discipline, in that he drove MV 8321 while his efficiency as a driver was impaired through previous indulgence in alcoholic liquor (All under AA 40).

The accused pleaded NOT guilty to all charges, and was found NOT guilty of the first and fourth charges, and GUILTY of the second and third charges.

The accused was charged with: On the Second charge sheet:-

- (1) Using threatening language to a Superior Officer, in that he said to Capt H.M.HEATHORN "I would like to meet up with you sometime when I had an automatic, and you had a forty five", or words to that effect. (AA 8 (2))
 - (2) Using insubordinate language to a Superior Officer, (Alternative to (1)) (AA 8 (2)).
 - (3) Using insubordinate language to a Superior Officer, in that he said to Capt H.M.HEATHORN "You are like the rest of them - yellow. Why dont you run home and suck your Mother's left tit" or words to that effect. (AA 8 (2)).
 - (4) Neglecting to obey Standing Orders for Mechanical Vehicles, in that he, took from the Lines of 2/4 Aust Coy ASC Wk/Shops an Army Vehicle without the authority of a properly issued Work Ticket, contrary to SO for Drs of Mechanical Vehs para 9 (Sec 11 AA).
 - (5) (Alternative to (4)) Conduct to the prejudice of good order & Military Discipline, in that he improperly used an Army Vehicle without authority (AA 40).
 - (6) Being in Lawful custody, escaping, in that he, when in arrest, escaped. (AA Sec 22).
 - (7) AWL - From 0730 till 2245 hrs on the 26th June 43 (AA Sec 15 (1)).
- The accused pleaded NOT guilty to all charges, & was found NOT guilty of the First and Fourth charges, & GUILTY of the Second, Third, Fifth, ~~xxx~~ Sixth & Seventh charges. The Court made a special finding

in respect of the Seventh charge, that the period of absence was from 0730 till 2200 hrs on the 26th June 43.

The Court sentenced the accused to suffer FIELD PUNISHMENT for ninety days, and to forfeit all ordinary pay for a period of ninety days, such sentence to date from the 15th July 43.


The accused was in close arrest awaiting trial for twenty days.

The finding and sentence was duly confirmed on the 18th day of July 1943 by DA & QMG First Aust Army.

The result of the Trial was promulgated to the accused at Provost Coy First Aust Army on the 22nd day of July 1943.



1. AIRGRAPH SERVICE:

This service is an arrangement under which letters written by senders in Australia upon special forms photographed in miniature in this country and the negatives thus obtained forwarded by air to the overseas country of address, where enlarged prints are taken, enveloped, and delivered by post to the addressees.

The service now functioning from Australia is available only for communications:-

Forms upon which airgraph letters may be written by senders are available from Army postal orderlies serving with Units, from whom further details of the service can be secured by personnel.

Normal Unit censorship arrangements will apply to airgraph letters lodged by personnel. The franking officer's signature will appear in the lower left hand corner of the form (above the direction "This space should not be used"). Censorable matter will be obliterated and not excised. The unit censor stamp will be affixed in the space between the address panel and the single printed line directly thereunder; it will be placed as far to the left as practicable.

Detailed instructions covering preparation of the letters by senders are set out on the backs of forms, which will, however, in every case following censorship be passed through unit channels by postal orderlies for onward transmission.

If one form be insufficient for the whole of a letter, two or more separate forms may be used, but in such a case each form will be treated as a separate letter and a separate fee must be paid for each. Writing must be plain & preferably in black ink, to secure satisfactory photographic reproduction. Use of pencil is not recommended but, if used, it will be a soft black lead pencil; indelible pencil will NOT be used. Names and addresses of addressees of airgraph letters will be written by hand in prominent block lettering (as large as practicable) and will be kept wholly within the panel provided on the form. The full address of the sender and the date of writing will be written at the top of the "Letter" portion of the form & at the foot of the letter the sender's full name will be written in block lettering followed by his signature. The airgraph letter as delivered to the addressee overseas will be less than $\frac{1}{2}$ the size of the original lodged by sender. The need for block lettering as above described and clear writing generally will therefore be readily understood.

1. LOSS OF OR DAMAGE TO GOVERNMENT PROPERTY BY FIRE:

The number of fires occurring, particularly intended camps, has resulted in serious losses of equipment and is impeding our war effort. Many of these fires could have been prevented.

Particular attention will be paid to the following:-

- (a) In buildings, etc., in which smoking is prohibited, notices to that effect will be displayed prominently and the prohibition will be rigidly enforced.
- (b) In no circumstances will authority be given for smoking in garages, forage barns or dumps, stables, magazines, in the vicinity of petrol or oil stores or in any other buildings in which inflammable materials are stored.
- (c) Grass will be kept short in barracks areas, hutments and camps.
- (d) Special arrangements will always be made for the storage of petrol, oil and grease. Tins of sand will be kept available in such places, in addition to tins for oily waste etc.
- (e) Naked lights in tents will be kept carefully shielded; candles will be placed in approved holders.
- (f) Great care will be exercised when the tanks of vehicles are being replenished. Engines will be stopped and any petrol spilled will be immediately wiped up or liberally sprinkled with sand.
- (g) Naked lights or hurricane type lamps will on no account be taken into or used in the ~~vicinity~~ vicinity of an inflammable liquid or material store or in power houses, nor will the use of such lamps be permitted when filling petrol tanks of vehicles at night or where there are loose inflammable liquids.
- (h) Existing and future heating facilities will comply with Standing Orders for the Army Fire Services, Sections IV and XI. Particular attention will be paid to the proximity of all heating facilities to such materials such as sisal-kraft, fibreen etc.
- (i) The co-operation of all ranks will be obtained to prevent the careless throwing away of cigarette ends, pipe ashes or glowing matches from moving vehicles or in the vicinity of tents or in any place where there is a danger of fire.
- (j) Fires will not be lit for any purpose whatsoever in proximity of tents or huts except with the authority of a commissioned officer. That officer will ensure that such fires are subsequently extinguished. The possibility of change of wind and wind borne sparks will not be overlooked.
