47. DISCIPLINE, Leave, overstaying of -

Failure to strictly observe these instructions will result in severe disciplinary action being taken against offenders and unless a marked improvement is shown in the immediate future, it will be necessary to review the leave position in the unit when drastic curtailments may be made.

48. ELECTRIC LIGHT GLOBES

Group Certificates - District Finance Officers of the Army will supply to Taxation Department the necessary group certificate to enable the total deductions for the group year to be credited against tax liability and members will be advised by the Taxation Department of the net balance (if any) to be paid.

3) Procedure where member receives assessment during group year -

(a) Should a member, for any reason, receive assessment before the end of the group year, such members may -

(i) return assessment to Taxation Department with request that it be held over till end of group year; or

(ii) if deductions are already sufficient to cover liability, return assessment to Taxation Department advising this fact and requesting that total of such deductions be credited.

(b) Irrespective of the State of issue of the assessment, communications in the above cases must be sent to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation in the State of the member's enlistment.

4) Adjustments - Where by reason of the fact that deductions for tax exceed the tax liability of a member, the Taxation Department will make such adjustment as is necessary. Should Taxation Department make a refund to a member by cheque, same may be paid by the member to the Paymaster for credit of his account.

5) Exemption Certificates - Where a member received, prior to the end of a group year, an Exemption Certificate under which he considers he is entitled to some adjustment regarding deductions made from his pay, the Pay Sergeant will forward such Exemption Certificate under covering memorandum, to the District Finance Office of the District of enlistment of the member and request authority to amend the rates of pay in the paybook. District Finance Officer will advise the Pay Sergeant of the date from which the drawing rate of the member is to be amended.

1. It is the duty of all soldiers if captured by the enemy to effect their escape at the earliest possible moment.

2. It is equally important that the soldier having completed his escape should not disclose the method by which he or any companions he may have had, evaded the enemy and achieved freedom.

3. The disclosure of such information

- a) prejudices the chances of other escapees
- b) prevents other members of allied forces from using the same or similar methods of escape.
- c) Endangers the lives of those who may have assisted the escapees at any stage of their escape.

4. Therefore escaped prisoners of War will not, without the permission of GSI of a Corps of higher formation disclose any details of their experiences in connection with their escape.

- a) Either verbally or in writing to any person or persons including friends or relatives.
 - b) Either verbally or in writing to the Press or broadcasting stations.
5. Full details, however, will be given by escaped prisoners of War at the earliest opportunity to the nearest Allied HQ from whence it will be transmitted to GSI at LHQ or Advanced LHQ direct.
6. Disclosure of information regarding escapes, by any soldier whether concerned in the escape or not, is expressly forbidden except as provided in Para 5 above.
