A 26 No action will be taken to amend pay books/consequent upon promotions, remissions of fines or remission of forfeitures until receipt of the relevant Routine Orders Part II Order from Records Office.

### 11. LEAVE WITHOUT PAY GRO A367/43.

A32 (1) In order to remove any misunderstanding by members concerning the effect of a grant of leave without pay, irrespective of the authority under which such leave is granted, attention is directed to the Provisions of the Financial (Military Forces) Regulations which provide, in effect, all pay (including allotments) and pay allowances cease in respect of any period for which a member is granted leave without pay.

(2) When leave without pay is granted, the following will not be payable during the period of such leave.

(a) Pay (including deferred pay) (b) Field allowance. (c) Command allowance (d) Special allowance. (e) Exchange allowance. (f) Dependant's allowance. (g) Travelling allowance. (h) Subsistence allowance. (i) Any allowance payable under Regulation 9 of the above mentioned regulations.

(3) Leave without pay will not be imposed upon a member compulsorily and, consequently, will always be covered by written application from the member, specifying that leave without pay is desired

### 12. PUBLIC STATEMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE FORCES. GRO A 56/43.

(1) The attention of all members is directed to the provision of AMR & Os 309 and 310 and the GRO 192/43.

(2) Members are forbidden to communicate with the Press or to give interviews for broadcasting or other media for publicity on Military Matters, whether by correspondence, personal interviews with Press Representative or by any other means except in accordance with Para 3 hereof.

(3) Members who have been on active service may give interviews on first hand experience in battle to uniformed accredited War Correspondents, provided that every proposed statement of the nature referred to in this paragraph will be submitted before publication for the

for the approval of an Officer of the Directorate of Public Relations.  
The publication of names of members above the rank of Lieutenant is  
prohibited unless specially authorized.

(4) No restriction is placed in members in regard to articles ~~xxxxxxxx~~ stories or poems for publication in the Press, periodicals or other publications provided that these do not deal with Military matters that no indication of Military Rank or Unit of the contributor is given.

13. PAY QCR. 183/1/799.

A36 The attention of all ranks is directed to the following instructions concerning pay.

(a) Pay is available once per pay period i.e. once per fortnight only. (b) Pay for individual soldiers cannot be drawn at District Accounts Office, QLD. (c) Intermediate pays will be permitted only under the following conditions. (1) On production of a Leave Pass for 48 Hrs or more. (2) As an advance against Travelling Allowance when travelling on duty where expense will be incurred, provided that authority is given in writing by applicants commanding Officer for such an advance. (3) Where absence from the Pay Parade on normal Pay Day was not due to any neglect on the part of the soldier.

(d) Only one drawing will be permitted for Leave purposes, or for an advance against travelling expenses. (e) Pay will not be provided for not less than 48 Hrs leave. (f) Pay must be drawn at the Unit which soldier is attached or Camp which accommodated e.g. a soldier caught in LTD GDD or a Staging Camp will draw pay from such Depot or Camp only. (g) In the event of a soldier on leave finding himself in the necessitous circumstances, he should report to Qld L of C Area, Leave and Transit Depot, Brisbane, or, if in the country centre, to Camp Staff Officer or Area Officer. Pay will be made available to the extent of the soldier's credit in his paybook, at the nearest Cash Office on production of the Leave Pass and an authority to draw Pay, signed by one of the above named Officers. It must be borne in mind that Pay will only be made subject to two conditions set out in this Order. (h) Subsistence claims for Leave or Duty, and travelling and meal allowance claims must be furnished through Units to Pay masters, and not presented by individuals to the DFO.

#### 4. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS.

Reports received indicate that accidents involving Army Vehicles are still occurring too frequently. There is an urgent need for the exercise for greater care by all drivers. Units and Services will take immediate and continuous steps to eliminate accidents.

#### 5. PRIVATE TELEPHONE CALLS.

Attention is called to the excessive use of Army Telephones for private purposes. The telephones installed in Army Camps installations etc are for official calls only and are NOT to be used for private calls. Recent check revealed that a large number of private calls are being made from these Official telephones. The use of a official telephones for private calls will cease forthwith. Action is being taken to monitor calls.

The receipt of incoming private calls during working hours is to be kept to an absolute minimum.

#### 6. MAXIMUM SPEED OF MILITARY VEHICLES.

GRO 3340/44 is the complete guide in regard to speeds to be observed. With regard to Para 5 of that Order it is to be noted that a local maximum speed of 25 MPH is laid down for all vehicles operating within a 7 1/2 MILES RADIUS of BUNBERRIG GPO particularly should the provision relating to the authorisation by an Officer of a speed in excess of 30 MPH in the case of Cars, Cycles and Jeeps be noted. This provision was amended by GROs of the 2 Mar 45 and provides that (a) Only where the State Traffic Laws permit may the speed be increased in AUSTRALIA 30 MPH in built up areas and 40 MPH in open country. (b) The G2 is to be endorsed by an Officer to show the speed he has authorised. (c) The Officer will be prepared to justify his action on the basis of proof lying upon him and any prosecution for exceeding the limit of 30 MPH on any Public Highway may be taken against him.

In no circumstances will any vehicles be driven at a speed greater than its driver considers to be safe. Where an offence of speeding is alleged by members of Traffic Control Squads the G2 will be so endorsed by the Provost Coy. Disciplinary action will at once follow against the driver followed by similar action by any Officer or responsible NCO in the vehicle who knowingly allowed the speed to be exceeded.

No Army vehicle will be driven at any time at a speed greater than the maximum speed for that type of vehicle.

Ambulances (Except in emergency)	30 "





### 441. TRAIN TRAVELLING INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

No member of the Forces, when in uniform, will carry, or caused to be carried, onto any train on which he is travelling or about to travel, or have in his possession or control or consume whilst travelling in any train, any intoxicating liquor, unless it is consumed by him as part of a meal supplied in a Dining Car in the train in which he is travelling.

### 442. DEPOSITS TO PAYBOOKS AND CASH REMITTANCES.

1. The attention of all members is drawn to the necessity of obtaining official receipts for all moneys paid to all members of the AAFPC.

#### 11. LEAVE WITHOUT PAY GRO A367/43.

A32 (1) In order to remove any misunderstanding by members concerning the effect of a grant of leave without pay, irrespective of the authority under which such leave is granted, attention is directed to the Provisions of War Financial (Military Forces) Regulations which provide, in effect, all pay (including allotments) and pay allowances cease in respect of any period for which a member is granted leave without pay.

(2) When leave without pay is granted, the following will not be payable during the period of such leave.

(a) Pay (including deferred pay) (b) Field allowance. (c) Command allowance (d) Special allowance. (e) Exchange allowance. (f) Dependant's allowance. (g) Travelling allowance. (h) Subsistence allowance. (i) Any allowance payable under Regulation 9 of the above mentioned regulations.

(3) Leave without pay will not be imposed upon a member compulsorily and, consequently, will always be covered by written application from the member, specifying that leave without pay is desired

#### 12. PUBLIC STATEMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE FORCES. GRO A 58/43.

(1) The attention of all members is directed to the provision of AMR & Os 309 and 310 and the GRO 192/43.

(2) Members are forbidden to communicate with the Press or to give interviews for broadcasting or other media for publicity on Military Matters, whether by correspondence, personal interviews with Press Representative or by any other means except in accordance with Para 3 hereof.

(3) Members who have been on active service may give interviews on first hand experience in battle to uniformed Accredited War Correspondents, provided that every proposed statement of the nature referred to in this paragraph will be submitted before publication for the

for the approval of an Officer of the Directorate of Public Relations. The publication of names of members above the rank of Lieutenant is prohibited unless specially authorized.

(4) No restriction is placed in members in regard to articles, ~~MEMORANDUM~~ stories or poems for publication in the Press, periodicals or other publications provided that these do not deal with Military matters that no imputation of Military Rank or Unit of the contributor is given.

13. PAY ORDER. 183/1/799.

A36 The attention of all ranks is directed to the following instructions concerning pay.

(a) Pay is available once per pay period i.e. once per fortnight only. (b) Pay for individual soldiers cannot be drawn at District Accounts Office, QLD. (c) Intermediate pays will be permitted only under the following conditions. (1) On production of a Leave Pass for 48 Hrs or more. (2) As an advance against Travelling Allowance when travelling on duty where expense will be incurred, provided that authority is given in writing by applicants commanding Officer for such an advance. (3) Where absence from the Pay Pade on normal Pay Day was not due to any neglect on the part of the soldier.

(d) Only one drawing will be permitted for Leave purposes, or for an advance against travelling expenses. (e) Pay will not be provided for not less than 48 Hrs leave. (f) Pay must be drawn at the Unit which soldier is attached or Camp which accommodated e.g. a soldier caught in LTD GDD or a Staging Camp will draw pay from such Depot or Camp only. (g) In the event of a soldier on leave finding himself in the necessitous circumstances, he should report to Qld L of C Area, Leave and Transit Depot, Brisbane, or, if in the country centre, to Camp Staff Officer or Area Officer. Pay will be made available to the extent of the soldier's credit in his paybook, at the nearest Cash Office on production of the Leave Pass and an authority to draw Pay, signed by one of the above named Officers. It must be borne in mind that Pay will only be made subject to two conditions set out in this Order. (h) Subsistence claims for Leave or Duty, and travelling and meal allowance claims must be furnished through Units to Pay masters, and not presented by individuals to the DFO.


