



NEW TYPE AMBULANCE FOR USE IN COUNTRY AREAS

Herewith specifications of suggested type of body for Ambulance Vehicles for operation in country districts.

It will be noticed that the vehicle conforms to Army Indian Type with the exception of the body. Indian types with open back have been found unsuitable in country areas, and D.D.M.S. Stresses that Panel Type bodies must be used in these dusty districts.

Panel Type Ambulances have proved unsatisfactory owing to the body and cabin being joined, and too rigid for country roads.

Vehicle No. 5951 Chevrolet 19 Model Panel Type Ambulance has been in operation at Camp Hospital Loveday for a period of four (4) months and proved unsatisfactory. Vehicle has been returned to A.E.M.E. Workshops three times in this period, and Unit Dvr. Mechs. have carried out repairs on numerous occasions.

Repairs consisted of general body overhauls on every occasion and it is obvious that this type of body will not stand the strain of corrugated country roads. This particular vehicle has returned to Unit H.Q. and has now been grounded by Inspecting Officer A.E.M.E. Further service in this area by Panel Ambulances would render them unserviceable in a very short time. Other Panel Ambulances serving in country areas for short periods have returned in a similar condition.


Attached herewith AAF G4 for your information.

Indian Type cab and chassis fulfill the requirements for these areas and with new type body as suggested would be very suitable.






