RAPID GRMAN WITHDRINAL IN ITALY. Prossing on quickly, Allied forces are now beyond the Volturno River where German troops were expected to make a stand. It is now considered unlikely that "serious" resistance will be encountable anywhere between here and Rome. With Sardinia, Allies now control 1/3rd. of the toe SAN SEVERO and another town and are pressing forward 25 miles north of FOGGIA. Axis sources claim large concentrations of troops at TARANTO and BRINDISI, An early invasion of the Balkans is feared and not without reason. The task may be undertaken by 7th Army whose whereabouts at the moment is a well - kept secret. Subsequent reports confirm the vandalism which the Nazis

indulged in Naples. Only one street was left undamaged and only one of the famous Neapolitan hotels had not been rezed to the ground. An attempt had been made to burn this one. Even medical stores were destroyed and the people were starving. No wonder they shouted "Long line the English and the Americans." British line in Italy has now been straightened and 5th, and 8 th, Armies are making a race of it for Rome, BLITZING GERMANY. The grim task of bembing the Germans out of the war continues.
