

SOON FOR DE GAULLE 90 VERMENT SAYS ROOSEVEL T

Reports this morning of the American attack on Charbourg are conflicting. While one sail that the main body of the attacking column was not yet in sight of the city and that the main fermon line still stood, another spoke of the imminence of the fall of the city, the cracking of enemy defences and a two mile penetration. Both communiques are agreed, however, on the strength of German resistance, one going so far as to title it "Fanatio," An earlier communique, issued yesterdey, said that the Americans had reached the const on both sides of the navel buse, but this has not been mentioned again.

A tongue in the cheek report from the London "Evening Standard" that Allied artillory is pounding German defences but leaving the city itself alone for "mamanitarian considerations", can be discounted. If the allies are sparing the city it is thorugh a desire to leave the port and its installations as intact as possible.
