EXTRACT FROM RULES MADE BY LORD CHAMBERLAIN.

- 1.-The name of the actual and responsible Manager or the Theatre must be printed on every play bill.
- 2.—The public can leave the Theatre at the end of the performance by all exit and entrance doors, which must open outwards.
- 3.—Where there is a fireproof screen to the proscenium opening, it must be lowered at least once during every performance to ensure its being in proper working order.
