

WARTIME RESTRICTIONS

Control of Photography Order

The following is a summary of the Regulations governing photography in wartime.

1. Subject to the provisions of the National Security (General) Regulations and the National Security (Aliens Control) Regulations there is no ban on the carrying of cameras in public places.
2. No person is permitted, except under the authority of a written permit granted by the proper authority, to make any photograph, sketch, plan or other representation of any objects of the following description:—
 - Any fortification, battery, searchlight, listening post or other work of defence;
 - Any aerodrome or seaplane station;
 - Any assembly of any of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth, or of His Majesty's other forces;
 - Any barracks, encampment or building occupied or in course of preparation for occupation by any of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth;
 - Any arsenal, factory, magazine or store for munitions of war, arms, equipment or supplies for any of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth, whether completed or in course of construction;
 - Any wireless, telegraph, telephone, signal or cable station;
 - Any wharf, dock, caisson, dockyard, harbour, ship-building works, slipways or loading pier;
 - Any vessel of war either complete or under construction, or any merchant vessel or vehicle engaged in the transport of supplies or personnel;
 - Any aircraft or the wreckage of any aircraft;
 - Any building structure, vessel or other object damaged by enemy action or as a result of steps taken to repel action;
 - Any hospital, or station at which casualties, whether civil or otherwise are treated, any ambulance or convoy of injured persons, or any injured person;
 - Any electricity, gas or water works, or any gasometer or reservoir, or any oil store;
 - Any assembly of persons for the purpose of transport or evacuation, or any temporary camp or other accommodation or transport vehicles used for the purpose of evacuation;
 - Any riotous or disorderly assembly, or premises or other objects damaged in the course of such an assembly;
 - Any roads or railways or bridges exclusively connected with works of defence; or
 - Any area declared to be a protected area.
