At the beginning of this war, all over East Asia, you won many victories. The reason was clear. You had crushing air superiority. Allied planes were vastly outnumbered every time they took the sky. Similarly Germany was able to overrun Europe in the early days of the war. The reason here was the same. Axis planes outnumbered Allied planes.

Now the situation is entirely different. You yourselves know very well that Allied planes now command the sky above you. You have seen this with your own eyes. A Domei correspondent, returned to Japan from the South Pacific front, also saw it. He told the people of Japan that however good the Japanese air crews were, they could not win victories when outnumbered by 20 or 30 to 1. He said that since May this year, the Allies have been commonly using 150 to 200 planes in a single attack.

From this comes the result that you, like the Germans, are sustaining defeats, and the Allies are winning the victories. Despite tremendous efforts at defence, involving heavy losses in aircraft, ships and men, Munda has followed Guadalcanal, Papua and Attu into the hands of the Allies. You yourselves are cut off. You know that ships bringing supplies and reinforcements cannot reach you. Even far behind the front lines you are not safe to enjoy the loot you have temporarily won. For example, the oil refineries and stores at Balikpapan, the largest oil port in Borneo, 2,500 miles from Australian bases, were recently successfully bombed twice by Allied planes. The Allies are now in the position that you were in when you won your early victories.

Your military leaders have tried to make you despise the freedom and democracy of the West as selfish and inefficient. Certainly free peoples are the slowest to prepare for war. Often, therefore, they lose the first rounds of a fight. But when they have recovered from the first attacks of the aggressors, the strength and whole-hearted self-sacrifice only given to free men fighting in a just cause, enables them to surpass the efforts of their most warlike enemies.

You know that this is so. There is proof in the sky above your heads.
