WRATH SPURS THEM ON

We are going to tell you a story which is probably new to you. If you were asked who were your enemies on the seas you would certainly reply, the American and British Navies.

Probably few of you have heard of the little Navies of the smaller Allies. Voluntary exiles from countries temporarily enslaved by Axis aggression, the Allied sailors of the little Navies fight on for the liberation of their peoples and the welfare of mankind. They have done yeoman service in the Allied cause, though their numbers are few compared with the British and U.S. Navies which between them now have greater forces in the Pacific and Indian Oceans alone than the entire naval strength of Japan. There are now at least 37 British and U.S. battleships at sea. Here are the numbers of men and of ships in the small Allied navies:

They include cruisers, destroyers, submarines, corvettes, light coastal craft and minesweepers.

Nobody forces these few men with their few little ships to range themselves alongside the navies of Britain and America. Of their own will they bring their contribution to the fighting strength of the Allied naval forces for freedom's sake. In view of the fact that by September, 1942 Great Britain had replaced by new ships all its losses incurred up till then in all theatres of war, as well as created entirely new battle squadrons, and that in the same period the United States had replaced all its losses since Pearl Harbour and increased the tonnage of its Navy by 60%, it is clear that the significance of the small Navies has nothing to do with their size.

They are the symbols of millions of oppressed people whose steadfast determination to regain liberty and decency has never wavered. This spirit your military leaders cannot afford to neglect. It is the spirit of freedom and humanity, the spirit that makes peace-loving men take up arms of their own free will, to fight until their just cause triumphs. It is the spirit of unrelenting loathing and contempt for the Axis war lords. Territories the Axis was once able to win, admiration and respect never. Millions and millions of oppressed people despise the military dictators who lead the Axis countries into savage glorification of brutality and aggression, trying to turn back the march of human progress a thousand years. Millions and millions will actively or passively oppose these evil militarists and all their works until they are utterly destroyed.

As the representatives of these submerged millions, the men of the little Navies are of much greater significance to your military leaders than their numbers warrant.

They want the same peaceful, decent life that all ordinary men of good intentions want. But they are free men, strengthened by their own convictions, not misled and deluded by any military clique. Their cause will inevitably prevail.
