SHANGHAI. CHINESE VICTORY IN YANGTSE VALLEY. The Japanese community of Shanghai is cast into a gloom as it finds that the central China operations are fizzling out as usual, without achieving an advance towards Chungking or Changsha, or doing anything towards eliminating American air bases in Hunan and Fukien. The casualties reported, 3,189 killed and wounded, are exceptionally high compared with previous operations, being well over 10% of the troops engaged. This shows that U.S. aid is now beginning to tell. Besides a vague apprehension that the China War situation is worsening, there is talk among the Japanese in Shanghai about the suspected collusion of Nanking forces, sent up north to co-operate with the Japanese in these operations, with the Chungking forces. It is said that their defection material contributed towards the sudden suspension of operations and the withdrawal of Japanese forces to their starting point. Colour is given to this suspicion by the revolt on May 30 of 30,000 members of the Shangtung Peace and Order Forces. The fact that the flag of Nanking and Chungking is the same one, and the attitude of the Nanking forces in operations, are the source of grave, lingering misgivings among Japanese civilians and troops, especially in view of the recent U.S. offensive in the Aleutians, the debacle of the Axis in Africa, the loss of the three Italian islands, the Nazi Army's stagnation in Russia, and the Allied air offensive over Europe.

YAMAMOTO'S STATE FUNERAL ON ANNIVERSARY OF MIDWAY BATTLE

Admiral Yamamoto's State funeral was held on the anniversary of the battle of Midway Island, planned by him. It is recalled that at Midway Japan, as a result of attacks by American carrier-borne and land-based planes, lost 4 aircraft carriers sunk, 3 battleships badly damaged, 2 heavy cruisers sunk, 3 heavy cruisers damaged, light cruiser destroyed, 3 destroyers, others damaged. 275
Japanese planes were shot down or lost at sea. The Japanese task force was broken. It had to abandon the attack on Midway, and the spell of initial Japanese victories came to an end.

TOKYO. ATTU AND THE GENERAL STAFF. The American capture of Attuin the Aleutians deprives Japan of one of her offensive defence bases.
It is feared that this will cause sharp altercation between The
General Staff and the Naval General Staff as to the wisdom of a
disposition too small to withstand attack, and too distant to be
maintained and reinforced through submarine - infested seas.
Confusion and chagrin among their opponents is part of the strategic
gain of the hitherto under-rated U.S. defence forces, which suddenly
landed a superior force to make short work of Attu.

NAZIS TRIED FOR ESPIONAGE. CASE BEFORE COURT AT LAST. It has been officially announced that the trial of the German newspaper correspondent Richard Sorge, and others, accused of espionage activities, began in Tokyo on May 31st. The case has been dragging on under police investigation for over a year.

MITSUBISHI EXPANSION. To cope with increasing activities everywhere the Mitsubishi Goshi Kaisha (holding Trust Co. for Mitsubishi interests) has approved a huge expansion programme. The capital of the following concerns has been doubled: Mitsubishi Steel Manufacturing Qo., Mitsubishi Chemical Industries Co., Japanese Building Iron Co., Japanese Aluminium Works, Chosen Heavy Industries. Three new companies have been established, the Mitsubishi Machine Tools Co., Kwanto Magnesium Co., and a dockyard company as subsidiary to the Mitsubishi Warehouse Co. The capital of the Mitsubishi Oil Co., has also been increased. It looks as if times are booming for the financial cliques.

ECONOMIC WORLD. Fact and fiction of G.E.A. War. Things seem to be going well for the zaibatsu as evidenced by Mitsubishi's capital expansion reported in the economic news. We fear, however, that these expansions will merely benefit the industrial tycoons of the Iwasaki clan who obtain large monetary subsidies and loans from Government and

public by promising all this expanded industrial activity. It is obvious from the course of the war that Japan lacks the shipping and labour necessary to transform these paper dreams into reality.

Slogan. "The profits of the zaibatsu are all that remain of the dreams of warriors".

LISBON REPORTS.

Italian Demoralisation. Impotent in face of Allied air supremacy, the Italian Navy and Air Force had to resign itself to watch the islands of Pantellaria, Lampedusa, and Linosa surrender and 18,000 Italians become prisoners-of-war. There is no comparison between the presnet plight of Italy and the situation two years ago.

Decline in strength of Axis U-Boat Warfare. Nazi Germany and Japan's hope of destroying Allied shipping is being frustrated. The Allies have perfected long range sea sound detectors, enabling them to send planes to attack U-boats. The U-boats are trying to counter with anti-aircraft guns, but their sinkings of Allied shipping for May and the first half of June show much reduced figures. On the other hand the number of U-boats sunk has been greatly increased.

Bombing of Germany. Germany is being bombed with great vigour. Several hundred planes are sent on a single attack, dropping over 2,000 tons of bombs in the course of one hour. Due to these attacks U-boat building and production of munitions have fallen off materially, while the negative attitude of the Nazi army in Russia has become pronounced.

News from Tokyo. The Cabinet has summoned the 82nd Special Session of the Diet to give approval to Y650,000,000 additional budget expenditure, in addition to Y5,600,000,000 extra budgetary expenditure. Following on as it does the Attu debacle, the Axis defeats in the Mediterranean and the Atlantic, not to speak of the lull in Russia, the convening of this special session is being criticised by various military and governmental groups. They feel that it betrays weakness on the side of Japan to the Chinese and other peoples of East Asia.

TALK OF THE TOWN. The frank statement on the Attu debacle partly restored the people's confidence which had been badly shaken by the Government's disingenuous attempts to explain away the Guadalcanal and New Guinea defeats. The effect of this announcement, however, was to some extent spoiled by Commander Takase's offhand speech. Coming from the spokesman of the Navy which had set up in some corner and allowed the Attu garrison to die like dogs, it made a bad impression.

CARTOON Under the heading "One by One They are Blown to Pieces", the cartoon shows Churchill holding Mussolini's Italy down and gripping Italy's toe. The names Churchill and Mussolini are given in Japanese.
