WEEKLY WAR NEWS.

AMERICAN POLICY UNCHANGED.

President Truman, who has become President of the U.S.A. following the sudden death of President Roosevelt, has stated there will be no change in America's policy towards the prosecution of the war and that there will be no change in the nation's foreign policy.

WAR ON JAPAN INCREASED.

Stepping up the war on the Japanese mainland, on April 14th and 15th, a record number of about 400 Super-Fortresses carried out heavy raids on the Itabashi arsenal, chemical and explosive plants in Tokyo. Many thousands of tons of incendiaries were dropped.

Allied aircraft continue to strike at Formosa and other islands near the Japanese homeland. British carrier planes struck severely at airfields and installations at Shozan and Shinchiku without opposition.

The Japanese have lost more than 1000 planes in attacks in their unsuccessful attempts to sink or damage Allied warships off Okinawa.

OKINAWA FIGHTING SLACKENS.

U.S. marines advancing north up the east and west coasts of Okinawa are meeting negligible resistance. They are all set for the great assault on Naha. They are near Momobaru, n the west side, and Arakawa, on the east. Most of Motobu Peninsula is now in U.S. hands, although small enemy pockets are still resisting.

Americans have captured two small islands in one of the swiftest and least costly operations of the Philippines campaign. They were

Rapu and Batan Islands, in Albay Gulf.

GERMAN COLLAPSE NEAR.

News reaching the Allies indicates that the complete collapse of Germany is very near. Although German resistance is stiffening to American and British drives on Berlin, Leipzig and Hamburg, the Allies have penetrated so deeply into central Germany, they are less than 80 km. from Berlin, 64 km. from Dresden, and are about to join hands with the Russians, who are 60 km. away from Berlin.

RUSSIAN GAINS IN AUSTRIA.

Battering their way through Austria, the Russians are now approaching Linz, a key centre in Upper Austria, 48 km. from the Bavarian frontier. Other forces advancing north of Vienna have captured a number of towns, 64 km. north-east of the Austrian capital.
