our dugouts & we used to  
sit up on the packs & watch  
the war ships bombarding the  
Olive Grove & cchi Baba.  
The mks frequently used to  
take a shot when we were  
crowded & we would take  
a jump straight down the  
cliff & roll down to dodge  
it. Occasionally one would  
jump into it but only a  
few were ever hit here.  
The path was cut for pack  
mules & carrying water &  
ammunition. A battery of  
guns is hidden on this  
point & from here we watched  
the sinking of the Triumph. The  
view of the Peninsula was  
magnificent.
