Dear Gran,

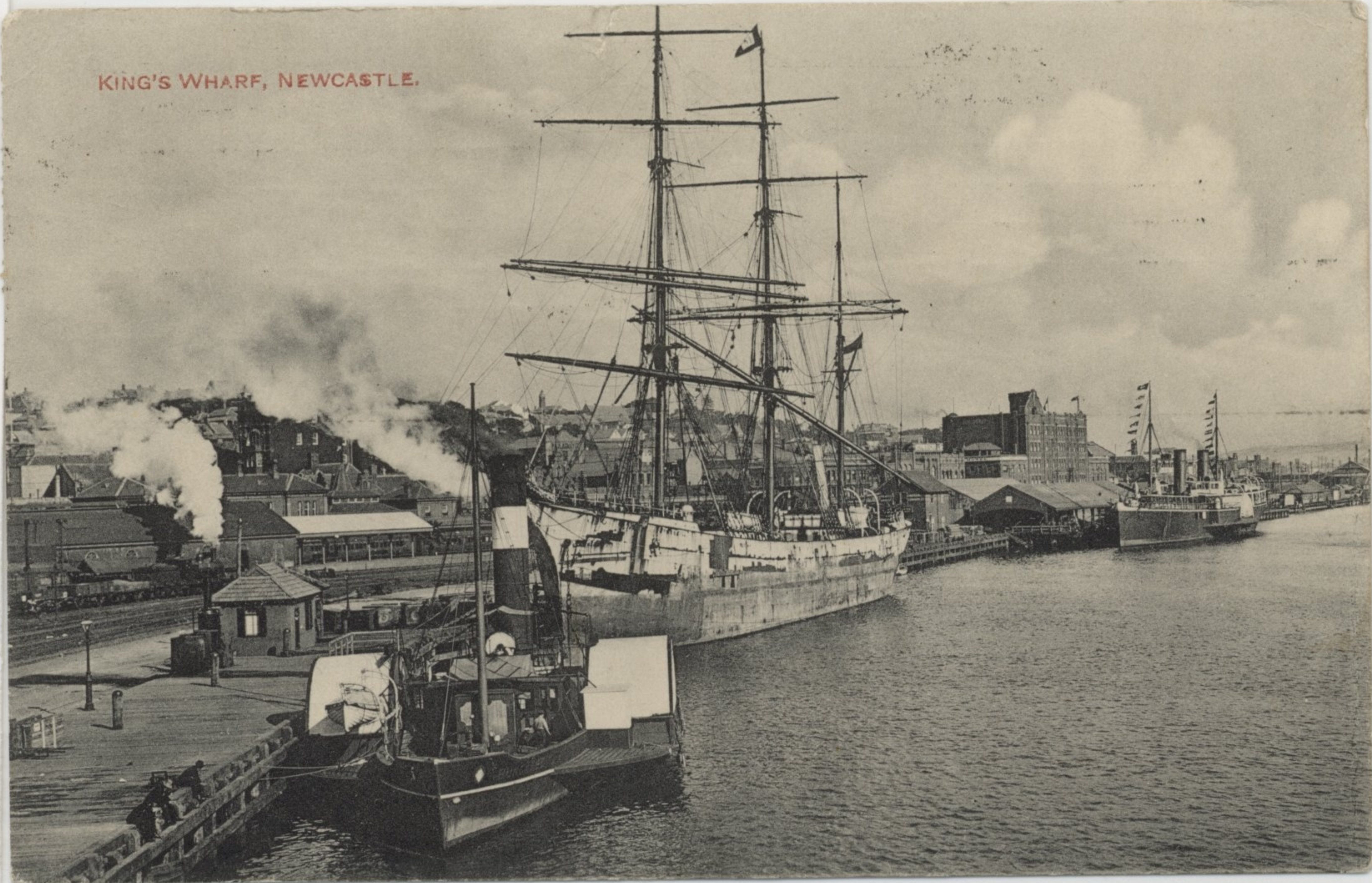

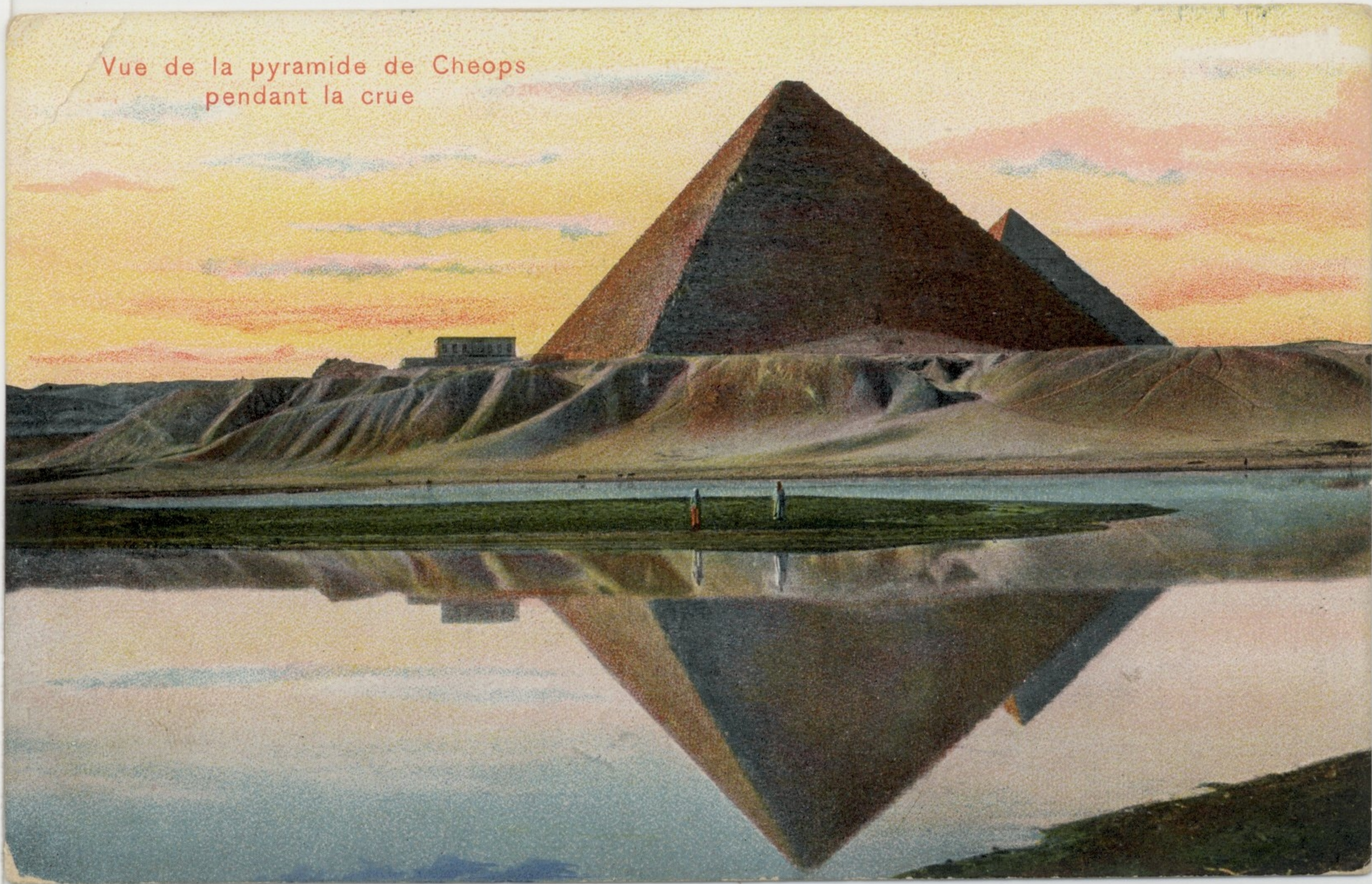

We are I think on the move to-morrow morning to Alexandria. We will be very busy from now on. Have been very well right up till now. Hardly even rains in Cairo. We are back on the old stew & bread & jam again but the Egyptian Government allows each soldier 6 a day to be spent on food stuffs at the dry canteen. Prices are high here now since the soldiers came the natives have asked three times as much for things. The men who came first got things very cheap for a time. English money is no good here but the merchants generally change it & give less value. Much love from *Bob*.

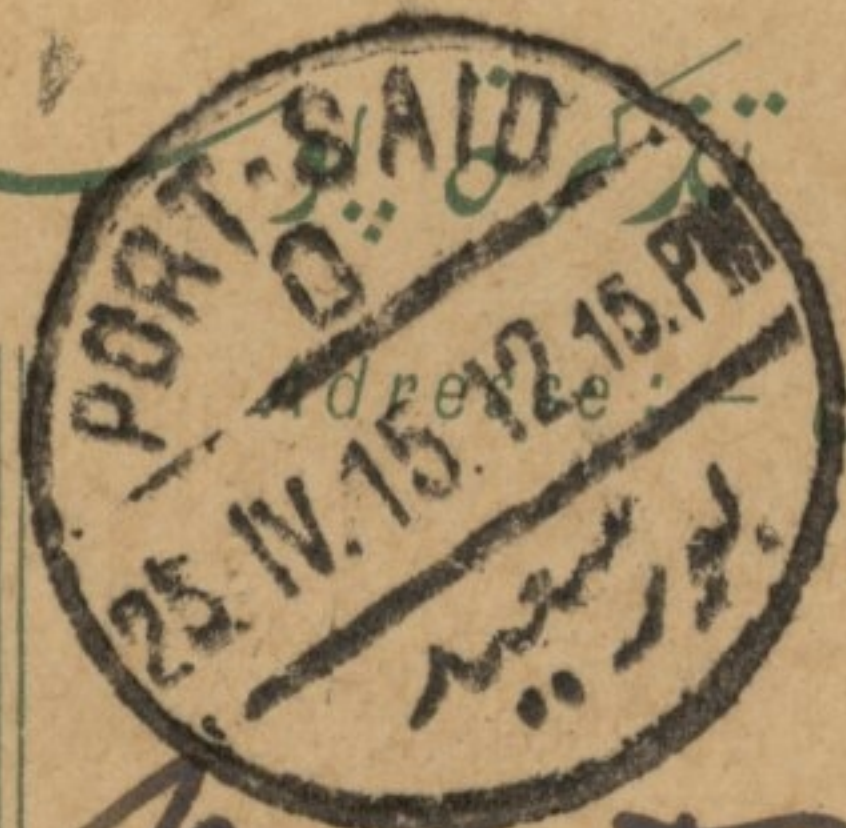

from "Toots"



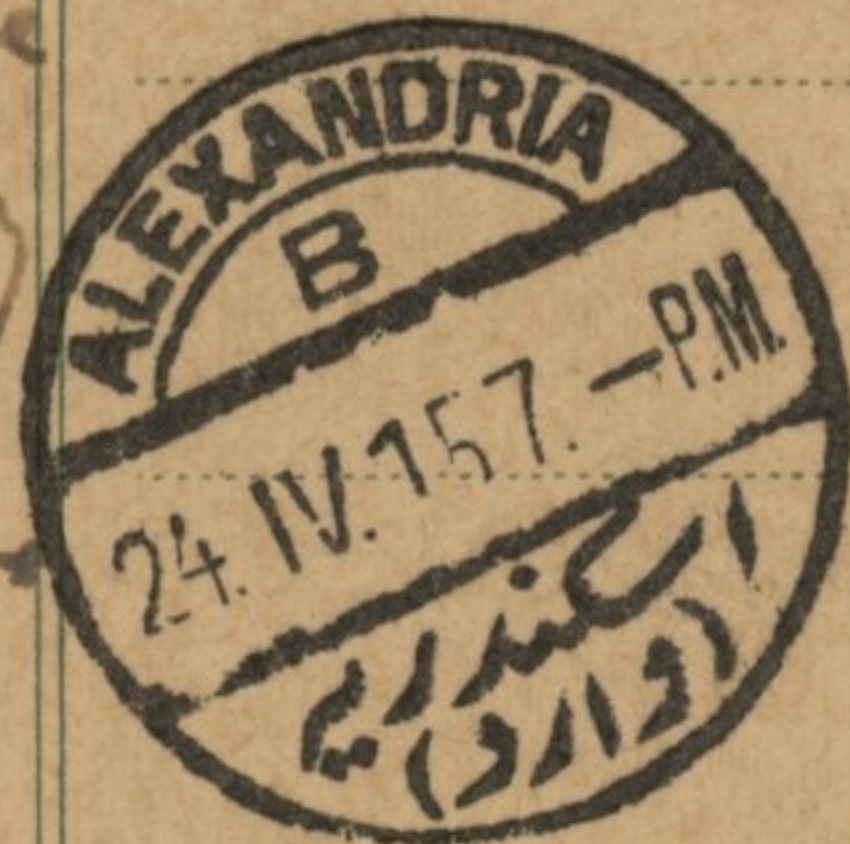
