THE FIRST GUN ASHORE.

Fye Witness's Testimony.

"As a returned member of the 4th, Battery A.F.A. which left these Shores just over 12 Months ago and being present at Gabe Tepe on that Memorable and never to be forgotten Sunday, 25th, April, I have no doubt that the honor belongs to the 4th, Battery, under Major O.F. Phillips.

It was the A. sub-section gun, under the most popular and efficient Serjeant
Norman Ellsworth. It was Man handled and pulled up the Cliffs by 100 Men, more or less."
