Hints on battlefields

Shock Patient must be kept warm, lie him flat on his back

Injury to Head Keep his head cold & warm about the feet.

Sunstroke Put patient in the shade & give him plenty of fresh air

Frost bite Rub gently with ice or snow to frost bitten part & keep in cool place

Gentle fiction. do not bring
to warmth for fear of
mortification. Hot water
& heat must be avoided

Eye injury do not let
patient rub eye anything
under lid take it over
lid & take out with something
blunt.

Lime in Eye do not
remove any lime that is
adhering to the eye.

Ear trouble never

probe an ear, use
olive or castor oil to remove
insects water will sometimes
do.

Wounds in stomach do
not remove if not in
danger do not let him
eat or drink

Wound in lungs lie him
on injured side.

Star box, Lacey, Clark
Splinter, Wagga &
Bill Fellers left at
Alexander to bring
mules across.

Diary of the war.
Left Heliospolis on Sunday 15/8/15
at midnight for Alexander

18/8/15 Arrived at Alexander
at daybreak & went on board
the S.S. Saturnina & left for
Lemnos Island in the evening

19/8/15 Things very calm have to
have our life belts on all the
time.

20/8/15 Things calm again another
boat sighted Forty men picked
for submarine guard & I had
to go on guard nothing sighted all
day Saw volcano in action in
the night also had some rain
was sleeping at the time & got soaking

wet. Stayed on all night for the 19th

So we could have a good sleep,

21/8/15 In sight of land, Islands
belonging to Greece. Arrived at Lemnos

Left at sunset on a small Greek
Steamer for the Kards 24 Knot beat

22/8/15 Arrived at Gabe Tepe before
daybreak going off on the punt Gpl ship

was shot in the hand got ashore

O.K. without any shots fired at us

Camped all day at Gabe Tepe went

had a look at our trenches just

missed two shots left camp at

Sunset for reserve trenches at

Chocolate Hill under fire all the

way Silver Jackson wounded.

Big bombardment by warships

22/8/15 Arrived at Chocolate Hill at
daybreak & orders were sent along

to fix bayonets & charge absolute

murder did not know where the

enemy were. our Major killed. Took

4 lines of trenches but no reinforcements

to hold them so had to retreat to the

first stopped in the trenches all day

night stretcher bearers doing

grand work Doc Brown wounded

in the feet.

23/8/15 Still in the trenches Turks

very quiet nothing to eat since

Saturday evening all done up

led out of the firing line at midday

had something to eat & then were

sent to dig a new communication

trench. Had some sleep that night
bullets + schrapnel all around us -
one hit.

24/8/15 Still digging the trench things
very quiet Had a roll call Aeroplanes
flying about.

25/8/15 Fatigue parties sent about
two miles to the well for water
having a rest in the hills issued
with bacon, rice, prunes, flour
bread so had a good feed + sleep
five nights without any sleep the
rest of the boys join us.

26/8/15 Things quiet on water
fatigue all day for the trenches
sent Mart a card for his
birthday also sent one home
to Millie.

27/8/15 Batteries bombard change
by N.Z. + Aust at dusk 300 yds of
trenches taken 9th + 10th L. Horse
reinforce great fight with hand
about 6 of us hold Turks for
grenades. 2 hours till reinforced

28/8/15 Things lively all day
silent change at night capture
trench on top of hill plenty of
prisoners

29/8/15 Things quiet all day on
water fatigue again on myself
just miss getting hit with schrapnel
for last + had wounded Turks counter
attack at night beaten back
with heavy losses.

30/8/15 Turks bombard

no with Lechapnel good few
hit D Bay 19th reinforce Firing line
quiet

30/8/15 Things very quiet again
short service to soldiers by B of E
Chaplain

31/8/15 Improving trenches with
bomb proof shelters firing line
quiet

1/9/15 still improving trenches
attack by turks at night without
success

2/9/15 Big attack by Turks on
our left at night but they
were driven back with heavy
losses Warships helped.

3/9/15 Water fatigue all day
shifted at night to the right
flank to Quinn's Post.

4/9/15 Resting all day went &
had swim on the beach our
first wash for a fortnight

5/9/15 Still resting in the gully
things very quiet here

6th Brigade arrive 21st Batt Top.

6/9/15 Resting in gully big
advance on extreme left

7/8/15 Resting in gully still
on outpost duty all night very
dangerous job.

8/9/15 Moved into reserve
trenches at Popes Post things
quiet all day and night

9/9/15 Still in reserve of
Kilger & Wagga join us Received
mail 374 from home & 7 from
Willie (4, 5 & 6 from Willie missing)

10/9/15 Water Fatigue Italians
land at Salt Lakes Things
quiet at firing line

11/9/15 Outpost duty 13th L. Horse
(devils own) arrive 12th L. Horse
cut up into reinforcements

12/9/15 Church in Rest Gully
Law Frank Egan there

13/9/15 Warships bombard
Achi Baba all day & night
Fresh meat issued

14/9/15 Warships still
bombarding day & night Met

Bill Thomas & Page

15/9/15 Water fatigue Ships
still bombarding Our Base
engineers arrive. Wrote to ^{John} Webb

16/9/15 Warships finish 90
hours bombardment Aust.
mail received paper & no
letters

17/9/15 Down at beach Our
doctor hit with schrapnel from
Beachy Bill. Turks attack stand by

18/9/15 Making tiers for our
winter quarters in gully behind
firing line

19/9/15 Church in gully by
Father Murphy Harry &
& went

20/9/15. Invited down to
dinner by Indian Officers. best
feed I have had so far.

British warship passed over
lines after dark. Warmed

21/9/15 Things quiet all along
the front

22/9/15 Tapping at Hinton's
Post. Warships busy

23/9/15 Beachy Bill puts
shells on beach does damage
to mules

24/9/15 Demonstration Charge
had to stand to all night,
but nothing came of it

25/9/15 Tapping at Hinton's
again, getting plenty of fresh

meat & bread

26/9/15 Church at 6-30 AM
I went to confession & Communion
& went to the Rosary at
night

27/9/15 Turkish demonstration
at night things otherwise
quiet

28/9/15 Some of our wounded
boys return glad to get
back

29/9/15 3rd Rein of 19th Batt &
3rd Rein of 20th Batt arrive
& are transferred to our
Batt (funny to watch
them ducking from the
shots)

30/9/15 Ol Heeger went
away to the Hospital
with dysentery

1/10/15 Warships bombard
Achi Baba again for a
couple of hours.

2/10/15 Mail arrived got
answers to our letters from
the beramic

3/10/15 Went to Bon & Bon
at 6-30 in a. s. b. Gully

4/10/15 artillery duel not
much damage done

5/10/15 Got a few lines from
Charlie in answer to my
first letter.

6/10/15 Demonstration at
Lone Pine had to stand to
all night but nothing
came of it

7/10/15 Drafted permanently
into the Pioneers (good job)

8/10/15 Terrible storm came up
just at dusk. The wind blew
all our waterproofs down got
soaking wet.

9/10/15 Jim Preston going back
to Australia. medically
unfit (still takes fits)

10/10/15 Storm the other night
played havoc with the beach
blew down our wharves & blew
all our lights ashore. ^{Church} bon.

11/10/15 On half ration of water through water boat being blown ashore by the storm. Pay day, drew £1

12/10/15 Bought chocolates & cake with our pay our guns quiet

13/10/15 Aust. mail got letter from home also Avaluen & Millie nights getting very cold but days hot

14/10/15 Things slip shape again on the beach after the storm

15/10/15 Big demonstration at night had to stand to arms all night

16/10/15 Turks bomb Monash Sully with old Howitzer caught 8 or 9 of our chaps

17/10/15 Church went to bomb blown very much like rain

18/10/15 Rained all night Aust. mail in, got letters from home, Millie, Grandma Big Lyns Wood & Lead Dabs

19/10/15 Artillery very active Lap closer to Turks at Russell's Top.

20/10/15 Very cold & windy Tanks flew over trenches with Machine Gun on board

Our guns soon made it
change its course

21/10/15 Raining all day, very
unpleasant. Turks firing bombs
from old Howitzer again

22/10/15 Our chaps exchange
Bung beef for cigarettes off the
Turks at Walker's Ridge.

23/10/15 Harry Wallace came down
to see me, having a good time
Our batteries put defective shells
into 6th Bde but no one hit
long signal washouts

24/10/15 Church in Monash
Gully went to bow & bow again
been raining all night very
muddy & cold

25/10/15 Turks bomb Monash
gully with walking stick
bombs but little damage
done

26/10/15 Turks bombing again
they put two bombs in our
gully but one did not go off
& the other did no damage
only threw the dirt all over
the place (the boys enjoy the
fun & signal washouts)

27/10/15 Very windy & dusty, on
half ration of water because
of rough sea

28/10/15 Still windy & dusty, no
bread or meat could not
land them on account of
rough weather

29/10/15 Artillery on both sides very active. Bert Dumeau came around to see me

30/10/15 Digging place for reserve canvas water tanks. Greece joins the Allies

31/10/15 Church in Monash Gully went to bon & bon things quiet

1/11/15 Very windy all day storm at night could not land stores on beach

2/11/15 Aust. mail lost overboard but got a couple of letters. Sweep on Cup

3/11/15 Artillery active on both sides but Turks

do no damage. Stan Cox arrives back from Egypt got P. C. from splinter from Hospital in England

4/11/15 Turkish charge on Lone Pine but repulsed with about 100 casualties

5/11/15 Stan Cox & I visit Hill 60. Crawled out & got a few discs off the dead men, all L. Horse men

6/11/15 18th Batt take over Steels Post from the 21st Batt. Pretty good post, on duty all night

7/11/15 Still on duty in trenches could not go to church

Get parcel from home also letters

8/11/15 Look over bombing station from the 21st Batt Stan box & Bgrs O'Leary also bombers

9/11/15 Sent Christmas mail home. Things pretty quiet. Saw monitors scouting for submarine which was sighted

10/11/15 Rained last night got a bit wet. Talking to Carl Coleman. Warships bombard Turkish reinforcements five rounds rapid every few minutes

11/11/15 Howitzer shell German officers trench Engineers blew up mine at Quinn's Had to stand to arms

12/11/15 Things quiet everywhere Brigade reinforcements arrive from Egypt

13/11/15 Father Murphy wounded by beachy line Father O'Carthy R. C. Chaplain now

14/11/15 Lord Kitchener over here visits the different ridges talks to the men. I did not see him.

15/11/15 Storm at night made trenches in a terrible state. Turk gets frightened starts firing heavily our boys cool & did not fire at all hardly

16/11/15 Turks put walking

Stick bomb over & me
incapacitate with hand grenades
& the Turks stop

17/11/15 Another storm sea
very rough could not land
stores

18/11/15 Received parcel for
Bill Lventyman (who is away
sick) & get a tin of baking
powder in it. Mac & I make
a stove out of an oil drum
to do some cooking

19/11/15 Mac & I make some jam
Tarts & scones & they were
delicious we also made
some dumplings which were
also very nice.

20/11/15 We drove the Turks out
of their first trench to their
second line with bombs.

21/11/15 Turks get fresh supply
of shells & they shelled us all day
but did little damage only knocked
a few sand bags down

22/11/15 Saw Turk out in the hills
chopping wood. Sgt Dyer Roy had
three shots at him but missed

23/11/15 Very cold over here now
warships wreck a Turkish
flour mill & saw mill

23/11/15 Bit of an artillery duel
but no damage done only a
few sand bags knocked off our
parapets

24/11/15 Started keeping silent so
the Turks would think that we
had gone away so shots to be fired
& no periscopes to be used

25/11/15 Still silent, Turks made
no move last night seems
funny not to hear a shot
fired from Rifles Artillery or ships

26/11/15 Things still the same
Turk shot at our Coater last
night blew his brains clean
out Got his rifle & cap

27/11/15 Last night of keeping
silent Officers thought that
Turks were attacking & we
sent up one Rocket & the
Turks went back again

28/11/15 Things again as usual
Artillery on both sides active
Turks do a bit of damage to
our trenches

29/11/15 Turks bombard our
trenches with 6 in Howitzers do
a bit of damage. One shell went
in amongst about 6 of our officers
but luckily it did not explode

30/11/15 Things very cold & sea
rough cannot land any stores
Luckier not too good & very
little of it. —

1/12/15 Started snowing last
night & kept on all day today
very cold a new experience for
some of the boys

2/12/15 Stopped snowing last night about 6 inches of snow on the ground bitterly cold

3/12/15 Turks bombard our trenches with 75. Knocked parapets about a bit & unearthed a dead body just near our bomb store & the smell was awful

4/12/15 Very much like rain Very heavy bombardment by warships on Achi Baba. lasted consistently for about an hour

5/12/15 Turks blow up two mines but do little damage to us, they did more damage to their own trenches

6/12/15 Things pretty quiet, lovely day. Saw 75's in the evening. Aust. mine in first for three weeks

7/12/15 Waiting with banks for Turks to break through to our tunnel. Very poor miners

8/12/15 Tunnel not broken through yet still waiting, few of the wounded back from England bring good news re Germany & asking for peace. Boys will be glad when it is all over.

9/12/15 Plane flying over our trenches dropping bombs, but they missed our trenches & fell in the gully so they did no damage

10/12/15 Warships lined up
just off Anzac & they commenced
a terrible bombardment, they
were firing down Cape Helles
way. Four funnel Russian
cruiser was the flagship

11/12/15 Things very quiet all
along the firing line. Just
a few shots by the artillery
on both sides.

12/12/15 Father Clune takes over
the 5th Bde, went to bon & bon
today to him, not as nice
as Father Murphy. He only left
Aust. in October

13/12/15 Turks bombard our
trenches heavily, did a

lot of damage. I was carrying
a wounded man down the
trench & a binch Howitzer
exploded just near us & the
concussion knocked both of
us up against the side of
the trench. Preparing to
evacuate.

14/12/15 Turks bombard our
trenches like hell, a lot of
damage to trenches but
only a couple of casualties

15/12/15. Parbed up ready to
move off at any minute
Kept silent from 7 A.M. till 4 AM
but Johnny did not venture
to come over.

16/12/15 A Little lecture by the
C.O. about evacuating. Turks
got a bit nervous this morning
when we started firing after
being silent for a few hours

17/12/15 The first party to evacuate
are leaving to-night. Our
aeroplanes very busy, four
up all day did not see
any tankes about

18/12/15 Our chaps got away
alright last night very
dark night just the night
forgetting away

19/12/15 Everyone leaving the
Peninsula to-night, everything
ready. Tankes flying about

this evening but our guns
soon sent it back again
Could see the big fleet of boats
waiting over at Imbros waiting
to take us off tonight

20/12/15 Got orders to be ready
to move off at dark. Went
down on board a lighter &
transferred to A.M.S. Mars
& left soon afterwards for
Lemnos Island. They treated
us like kings on board, had
coffee & fresh bread waiting
for us as soon as we got
aboard & had their canteens
open for us. The sailors could
not do enough for us

20/12/15 - Arrived at Lemnos
at 2 A.M. but did not go
ashore till 6-30 A.M. After
the coffee ran out the sailors
made some cocoa for us
We left the base & went on
board a tug & landed & marched
about three miles to our
camp Arrived at dinner
time nearly dead, we had
our full pack up, glad
when night came so we
could have a sleep

21/12/15 Had a good sleep last
night. Went & had a look
around the camp, also
had a look around the

Greek village. Very different
place to Egypt

22/12/15 Went & had a look
at a football match 1st S. Club.
✓ L. Horse. Met Ed Burke went
& had tea with him

23/12/15 Did a bit of drill
got word that we ~~was~~ are
moving to Egypt tomorrow
All the 18th Batt comforts arrived
but no mail

24/12/15 We are not leaving today
but are ready to go at any
minute. Got issued with
kumys puddings etc. Rained
this morning. Had no
drill

Xmas DAY

25/12/15 Went to midnight Mass
last night went to bon bon
this morning. Lovely day.

Got issued with Xmas billycan
Saw real native funeral, Dave
Page & I walked out to Iherua
had a hot bath got lost
coming home. Had a real good
Xmas under the circumstances

26/12/15 Boxing Day. Things very
quiet. Stopped in camp all
day. Heard a rumour that
Greice had been in action
Went to 7 o'clock Mass.

27/12/15 Nothing much doing, on
parade all day. Saw one
of the largest boats afloat

28/12/15 Went for a route march
Dave Page & I went over to the
Y.M.C.A. at night & had a look
at the concert. Would rather be
in the Trenches than here

29/12/15 Half holiday to-day.
Stopped at home & had a read
& a sleep, got two letters, more
mail to come

30/12/15 Drilling all day. Advance
Guard went, getting ready
for inspection by the G.O.C.
So news when we are getting
away.

31/12/15 Very foggy this morning
Good few boats came into

port. Life very monotonous here
 & to make things worse we
 cannot write any letters for
 the present

1/1/16 New Year Day. Rained all
 day. Kept awake & saw the old
 year out. Plenty of camp fires
 & concerts. A good few of our
 boys got drunk. Our Major
 came along this morning &
 wished us all a Happy New
 Year.

2/1/16 Rained all day again
 Stopped in & slept all day

3/1/16 20th left for Egypt at
 7 A.M. this morning also 5th A.M.C.
 Were inspected by Gen. Admes

this morning. Kit inspection
 in afternoon

4/1/16 Left camp this
 morning went on board
 the Troopship L.S. Simla
 Not a bad boat. Put down
 the Harbour this evening
 & anchored near the mines

5/1/16 Too rough to proceed
 to sea. Had a life belt
 parade in the morning

6/1/16 Put to sea at 3 A.M.
 this morning. Mine layer
 escort us for a few hours
 then picked up Destroyer
 sharp lookout kept for
 submarines. Lovely Day

WEDNESDAY

7/1/16 Escort left us during the night. Ran into severe storm about midday. Nearly everyone on board sea sick.

8/1/16 Very frightened of submarines last night, went a good way out of the usual course. Arrived at Alexander about 1 AM but did not go ashore. Company for duty, Cpl of the Guard.

9/1/16 Went ashore & enquiring for an unknown destination. Arrived at Tel-el-Kebir at midnight. Met Martin & Bill Belieu.
