#### Wireless Messages.

London, Oct. 29: A message from Salonica states: "There is news to hand which, however contested, permits us to state with precision that very serious internal difficulties have arisen in Bulgaria and that Bulgarian troops have broken out at various points."

The "Matin" (Paris) states that when Mr. Asquith speaks on Tuesday he will "put a different complexion on the Balkan situation, and will announce that at the proper time help will come to the Serbians from several points at once."

London, Oct. 29: Lord Loreburn asked in the House of Lords whether the naval and military advisers of the Government were satisfied with the despatch of troops to Salonica. Lord Lansdowne replied that he was afraid it was highly improbable that the Serbians would long be able to withstand the German attack, especially with the Bulgarians at their back. He dwelt on the difficulty of making public statements on military matters. Referring to the impression in some peoples' minds that civilian members of the Cabinet are in the habit of divising great strategic plans and imposing them on their military advisers, Lord Lansdowne vehemently denied that such a thing happened, seeing that Lord Kitchener is invariably a party to the Governments decisions.

London, Oct. 28: Sir Edward Grey announced in the House of Commons that the offer of Cyprus to Greece was conditional on the Greeks giving immediate aid to the Serbians. The offer has now lapsed. [Cyprus was until Oct., 1914, when it was annexed to the British Empire, still nominally part of the Ottoman Empire, though occupied by Great Britain under the treaty of 1878. The island has an area of 3,600 square miles and a population of 275,000, of whom 20 per cent. are Moslems and the remainder mostly Greeks.]

London, Oct. 29: British submarines have sunk in the Baltic four German steamers, and in the Sea of Marmora a munition laden Turkish transport. These are in addition to the cruiser "Prinz Adalbert" which the Germans acknowledge was sunk off Liban. [The "Prinz Adalbert" (1901-2) was an armoured cruiser of 8,856 tons, with a speed of 21 knots, and an armament of four 8'2 in. and ten 5'9 in. guns.]

Bucharest, Oct. 30: The Russian Fleet again bombarded Varna and Burgas, the Bulgarian ports in the Black Sea, causing important damage. Russian aviators dropped bombs in the harbours. The enemy's submarines unsuc cessfully attacked the Fleet.

Wireless messages received during the week show that at several points on the Eastern front the Germans are making desperate efforts to break down the Russian resistance. In the Riga district a series of attacks South of the Drina have been repulsed. On the Dvinsk front furious fighting is incessant. The Germans attempted to advance from Illukst but had to withdraw again across the river. In the Stry district, North west of Rafalovka, the Russians captured a village with prisoners and machine guns. In an attack North of Violki, on the Styr, the Germans were outflanked and lost over 2,000 prisoners. The enemy was enveloped in a village and suffered enormous losses. Three German attacks North of Nevolisinatz were beaten off and heaps of the enemy's dead were left on the ground.

The following comment on the moral of the Russian and German troops is made in a recent official report from Petrograd:—"The spirit of our troops, which has been demonstrated in the most striking fashion in innumerable rearguard actions, has received a fresh impulse from the successes gained by us over the Germans recently in desperate hand-to-hand encounters, and in our successful assumption of the offensive against the Germans.


"The depression which has been observed in the ranks of the Germans has not been without its influence on the moral of our men. This depression manifests itself in more and more frequent instances of the abandonment by the Germans on the battlefield of slightly wounded soldiers, of wagons on the line of their retreat, of the throwing away of arms and projectiles, and of disorder and nervousness in their firing."

Paris. Oct. 31 (Official Report): Heavy fighting reported in the course of the day at several points on the front in Artois. In the Bois-en-Hache the French have made marked progress, bombing their way inch by inch. North-east of Neuville St-Waast the Germans have succeeded in re-occupying by a surprise attack some portions of the trenches they recently lost and in which the French had established their advanced line. Their progress was at once stopped by the fire of the French trenches in immed iate support. East of the "Labyrinth" the Germans exploded a mine near one of the French barricades. Those of the enemy who attempted to occupy the crater were thrown back into their trenches by the French fusilade. In Champagne, the Germans shelled with great violence the French positions on the Tahure knoll and the ground South-east of it. The French replied with fire from the counter-batteries and with rafales on the German trenches and field works.


Pretoria, Oct. 27: It is understood that General Botha, Prime Minister of the Union of South Africa, has decided to continue in office with his present colleagues.


