

			During the period under review preparations for the final handing in of the lor cars, and cycles on charge to the unit has occupied much time. As a result of endeavours made my all ranks the unit has handed in every vehicle on charge in mobile condition. Satisfaction has been expressed by the units receiving same as to the condition of the equipment on charge.	a						
			It can fairly claimed that motor transport on a large scale has been used for the first time during the war. Each nation has worked on a different system. In motor the inauguration of a servive of somemaguitude during actual operations. Australia will doubtless have to consider a prolimem of equipment, system, etc, in near future. In doing so I am firmly of the opinion that ageneral view of the methods adopted by the French Armies in the Field should be studied. A combin of the systems used by the British and French governments in the field during the war will I think produce an economical and reliable service. During the next yor two many improvements (made as a result of the combined experience of all not during the war) are likely to be made, in all kinds of mechanical transport, especially the heavy type. The Australian Government would be wise I think to proceed slowly if intending to branch out to a large extent, in the purchase of equipment for this branch of the service.	the ations
