

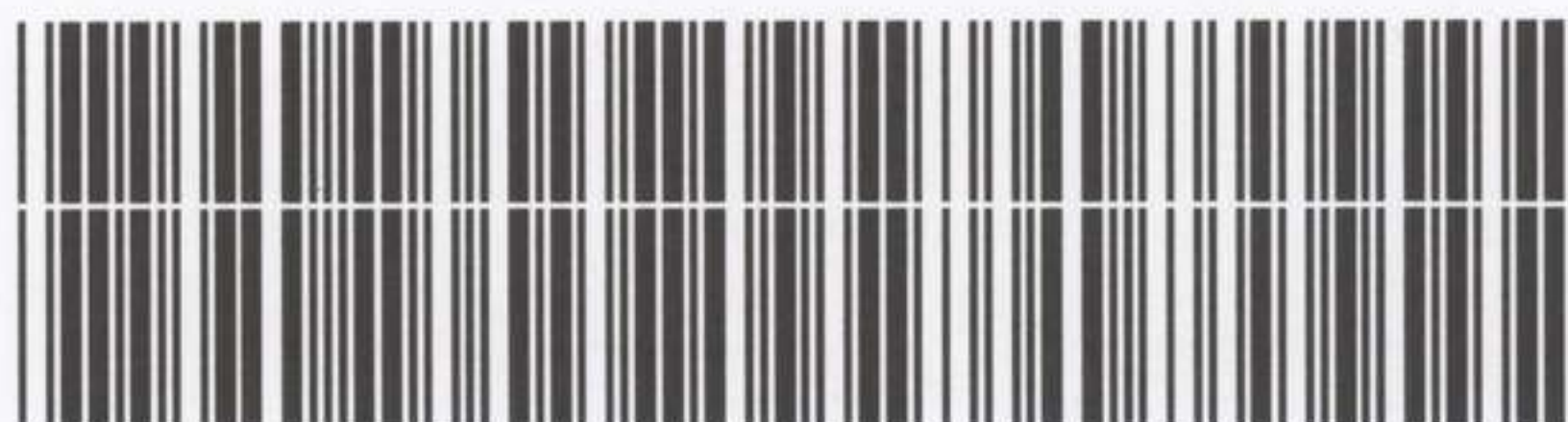

C A M O N	3.7.18.		<p>During the Month I inspected all the Units under my Administration ; in addition to Divisional Units--567th ARMY TROOPS COY, 254th TUNNELLING COY, 743rd AREA EMPLOYMENT COY, were supervised by me.</p> <p><u>GENERAL</u> 7th, and 8th Field Artillery Brigades, together with 3rd Divisional Ammunition Column, moved into the Line on 2.6.18. after resting in PONT REMY area. Animals generally were in very satisfactory condition.</p> <p>During the Period under revision Veterinary duties were carried out as follows:-</p> <p>Major L.E.McKENZIE D.S.O.-<u>D.A.D.V.S.</u> Divisional Headquarters Divisional Signal Coy. 567th Army Troops Coy. 254th Tunnelling Coy. 743rd Area Employment Coy.</p> <p>Major C. 			<p><u>ANIMAL WASTAGE</u></p> <p>Horses 20 Horses 20</p> <p>(a) Battle Casualties Mules 6 - of these Mules 6 were shell Wounds. Bomb Wounds -Horses, Mules.-Nil.</p> <p>(c) Sickness- 77 Horses and 16 Mules were Evacuated.</p> <p>Principal Diseases:-</p> <p>Specific Ophthalmia was responsible for 9 Horses. Mules -Nil. Treatment, mostly favoured by Veterinary Officers of this Formation, is LUGOLS SOLUTION injection.</p> <p>Debility. 12 Horses and 1 Mule were Evacuated. These animals generally were aged and needed prolonged rest.</p> <p>Cellulitis. 6 Horses -No Mules-were Evacuated.</p> <p><u>INSPECTIONS.</u></p> <p>Reports on all inspections have been very satisfactory, due to the state of Health and efficiency of animals in all Units. 9th and 10th Infantry Brigade Groups I inspected in company with G.O.C. Division, who was highly pleased with all Units.</p> <p><u>VETERINARY EQUIPMENT</u></p> <p>is complete, or on indent.</p> <p><u>SHOEING</u></p> <p>Throughout the Formation, is up to date and Satisfactory. Shoes etc. are always available at Ordnance.</p> <p><u>CASUALTIES IN A.A.V.C. PERSONNEL</u></p> <p>No 3468 Trooper STONE R. Evacuated to Hospital on 17.6.18. Cellulitis of Tongue. Struck off strength.</p>
