

assistance rendered by Lieut.Mullett, A S.C. (M.T.) in the exacuation of wounded from the A.D.S. During the period Sept.25th to 28th the evacuation of walking wounded from the Menin Road A.D.S. was carried out almost entirely by Motor Lorry, only one train being available during that time. Lieut.Mullett was always at hand, at whatever time of the day or night and invariably produced more lorries whenever a call was made for them. To his indefatigable attention a large part of the success of the evacuation may be attributed.
