



Hoograaf G 26 b44	Oct 1		Casualties from Air-craft raids increased very markedly. Corps Wounded past through Corps Central Bureau for 24 hours ending noon 29th 30th Sept. show an increase of 600 odd. 1st Aust. Div. took over from 4th and part of 5th Aust. Div.; 5th Aust. Div. handed over main portion of their area to 10th Corps. Owing to the adjustment of areas the problem of evacuation has become a great deal more complicated, as both Divisions converge to one point about Anzac house. Lt-Col Moseley of 6th Aust. Fld Ambulance, has arranged at conference of A.Ds.M.S. held to day. is to take charge of the evacuation of seriously wounded to the Adv. Dressing Stn of both Divisions. Each Division will be responsible for the clearance of its own walking wounded. Major St Vincent Welsh of the 4th Aust. Fld Ambulance was seriously wounded.	
	Oct. 2		Issued Medical Instruction No. 38 38 covering arrangements for operations on the 4th of Oct. Attended conference at Office of D.M.S. 2nd Army, where it was arranged that broad guage trains would be available from Ypres for evacuation to Casualty Clearing Stn. It was also arranged that clerks from 1 Division on our right be sent to the Corps Central Bureau, as it was necessary to relieve clerks every 8 hours, the Bureau working 24 hours per day during offensives. Casualties passed through Central Bureau for 24 hours ending noon 2nd, amounts to approximately 900, of which a large number were due to enemy air-craft. 2nd Aust. Div. took over from 4th Aust. Div. and 3rd Aust. Div. 2nd Anzac, today.	
	Oct. 3		The huts which I had arranged should be put up at the Rly Station as an entraining centre are complete. Bombs were dropped by enemy air-craft near the site yesterday. As this is practically the safest place in Ypres, it shows how futile it is to search for a safer place than the A.D.S. on Menin Road. Arranged for Bearer Divisions of the 12th & 13th Aust. Fld Ambulances to go to the Main Dressing Stn at H.27 C 2.8 and to be held there in reserve as the Bearers of the 1st & 2nd Aust. Divisions are very much under strength.	
	Oct 4		The attack opened at 6 a.m. At 9 a.m. wounded had begun to come in fairly large numbers and the service of lorries, that is 2 every 5 minutes, had proved insufficient. I at once ordered up an additional 5 lorries which cleared up the accumulation. At 10 a.m. stretcher cases had just come in. Broad guage ambulance train was at the Ypres Station, but some delay was caused by its not being run in at the right Siding. It was however despatched at 10.45 a.m. with over 300 cases, including 24 stretcher cases.

	Oct. 4 (cont)		<p>A.D.M.S. 1st Aust. Div. informed me that he was short of Bearers. The bearers of the 12th Aust. Fld Ambulance, in reserve at the Main Dressing Stn, were ordered up in returning Ambulance wagons. By mid-day both Divisions had called for 2 extra Bearer Divisions; they had all three Bearer Divisions of their own employed, and this extra demand was occasioned by the impossibility to use horse Ambulance wagons on the planked road, owing to its slippery condition, and the resulting increased carry for the Bearers. This planked road had been made just wide enough for one vehicle, with certain passing points, but forming a complete circuit. Artillery limbers making short journeys, however, disregarded the route and rendered the road useless for several hours. The Bearer carry with this road out of use was 8000 yards, but when the road could be used up to Westhoek, this was reduced by 3000 yards. I ordered up 100 of 5th Aust Div. Infantry who had been placed as an emergency at my disposal, to go up at 6 a.m. on the 5th to Colonel Moseley. The 1st Aust. Div. had arranged for a party of infantry, (200), but as their evacuation was going well, they had let the latter go, but immediately afterwards, found that they were really required. German prisoners were largely utilized as stretcher-bearers. Before 2 p.m. 500 stretcher cases had passed through and about 1500 walking wounded; of these latter 600 were sent by broad gauge Ambulance train from Ypres together with about 38 stretcher cases, and another 260 went by Light Railway. Of these 260 some 200 including a number of stretcher cases were sent from Belleward straight to the Casualty Clearing Stn. This saved Ambulance cars considerably and it was the only occasion during the offensive that the Light Rlys have been of any real service to evacuation. The Central Bureau was maintained in good working order under Major D.S. Mackenzie, having completed records between 6 a.m. on the 4th and 6 a.m. 5th of 1346 1st Anzac Corps and 1001 of Other Formations. In addition to these casualties, some 600 of this Corps passed through Godewearvelde Group Casualty Clearing Stns and about 160 through Nine Elms Group Casualty Clearing Stns.</p>	
	Oct. 5th		<p>General Macpherson of G.H.Q. came in this morning and discussed evacuation, afterwards visiting with me the Adv. Dressing Stn, Menin Road and Stations in Ypres.</p>	
	Oct. 6th		<p>D.M.S. asked me to go up and talk over the use of Ypres-Roulers Rly. I thought this would be excellent if it could be managed. D.M.S. mentioned that some 400 cases diagnosed "N.Y.D.N." had been sent to Remy Group C.C.Ss by this Corps. I issued instructions that this term should be used as sparingly as possible, as it occasioned a great deal of work and investigation at Special Hospitals. Arranged with D.D.M.S. 2nd Anzac for use of Ypres-Zonnebeke road for our evacuations.</p>

	OCT 7th		Went into matter of trenchfoot precautions, Saw "Q" relative to issue of solidified alchbol and Hot food containers. Found that the former was an issue and that arrangements were being made for issue of the latter.	
	8th		<p>5th Australian Division went into Support. Meeting of A.Ds.M.S. at 10-30 Trench Pod precautions were discussed. Matter of casualties in A.A.M.C. Personnel was also discussed. It was generally thought that casualties increased when Bearers were sent in without their own Bearer Officers. The system of Casualty Clearing Stations asking for an extra Officer to a tent sub-division was condemned as that extra Officer broke up the formation of Bearer Divisions, and it was very often found that Bearer Divisions were sent in without an Officer at all. It was decided that the 4th Australian Division should evacuate its own sector entirely, by Ypres-Zonnebeke Road. Saw "Q" about whale oil issue and Gum boots. A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division said his men had none. "Q" stated that 1400 pairs were being issued to Divisions and a special issue of 600 extra to each Division in line, as Trench Stores.</p> <p>D.M.S. Second Army came in at 2-30. I spoke to him about getting trucks to be attached to Ambulance trains, also Medical Officers at Casualty Clearing Stations. He promised to go in to the latter.</p> <p>I spoke to General White, about Divisions in line supplying all extra bearers needed, so that Divisions in Reserve would not be called upon. In this he agreed, and I accordingly instructed A.Ds.M.S. The 2nd Australian Divisional Rest Station was shelled this morning. 8 men were killed, including 2 A.A.M.C. other ranks and an Artillery Officer, a patient. A number of trenchfoot cases began to appear, particularly in the 18th Bn. To make arrangements for a systematic changing of socks, rubbing of feet &c, is an impossibility.</p>	
	9th		<p>Went up to Advanced Dressing Station at Ypres Station. A certain number of cases had begun to come in from Battle which opened at 5-40am. Only the Corps Left Division was affected in this attack. The Broadguage train was in at 10am but was delayed until noon, when it was despatched with only 34 stretcher, and 160 walking cases.</p> <p>Colonel Moseley spoke very highly of Major Hutchinson, of 6th Australian Field Ambulance, and I mentioned this to General Smythe, G.O.C. 2nd Australian Division.</p> <p>By 4 pm 115 stretcher and 350 walking wounded had passed through. The broad gauge Ambulance train was unsatisfactory, as once despatched, it did not return. I telegraphed R.O.D. to have it sent back as quickly as possible.</p>

	OCT 10th		<p>The wastage of 5th Australian Division for week ending 6th October was very great. They had left the trenches before the 1st October and whilst in the line the weather had been warm and bright, and yet they had had nearly four times the number of sick than the 4th Australian Div. alongside them, and without any epidemic to account for it. As I had already spoken to the A.D.M.S. and G.O.C. of this Division, I now brought the matter to the notice of the Army Corps Commander on paper, having about 10 days ago spoken about it on paper verbally. It is probably due to soft heartedness on part of Medical Officers and indifferent discipline. I spoke to Army Corps Commander about large incidence of casualties amongst stretcher bearers and Medical Officers of stretcher Bearer companies, and said I considered it to be somewhat due to lack of shelter which in this more rapid succession of offensives, they are unable to build for themselves, as from the time they went in, all men were carrying stretchers. The Army Corps Commander asked me to speak to the D.A. & Q.M.G. which I did.</p>	
	11th		<p>Fourth Australian Division took over from 2nd Australian Division at 10 am. Went up to Ypres in search of a suitable site for Advanced Dressing Station. Visited Belgian Barracks and Asylum, both were unsuitable, and finally it was decided that huts, just inside the wall would be best. Chief Engineer was accordingly asked to arrange. Arranged with D.M.S. Army for the Broad Gauge Ambulance train for to-morrows offensive.</p>	
	12th		<p>4th Australian Division opened attack at 5-20. They were to advance a few hundred yards only, the main attack being on our left. The 4th Australian Division used the Ypres-Zonnebeke Road getting their Housed Ambulance Wagons very much further forward than had hitherto been possible. The carry still, is lengthy, being about 3500 yards. Though still holding the stretcher case station on the Menin Road, they sent their cases direct to the Ypres Station, few of their wounded finding their way to the Menin Road A.D.S. Whilst at the Ypres Station, Colonel Barber saw me with regard to requirements at Ypres. He agreed that the site used now as a Walking wounded station afforded the necessary essentials. Saw the C.E. and C.R.E. coming back and arranged matters. Colonel Sutton came in before departure, as he handed over to Colonel Shepherd to-day.</p>

	Oct. 13th		During 24 hours ending 6 am this morning over 500 wounded of 4th Australian Division were evacuated. Of these nearly 250 went through IInd Anzac Dressing Stations. The wounded were soaked through, having been exposed all night to terrific rain before they attacked. Arranged with Army for supply of a large nissen hut for erection at Ypres Station. Colonel Makin took over command of 8th Australian Field Ambulance.	
	14th		Visited Ypres station. Shelters for cases were being put up.	
	16th		A large number of Gassed cases were received, 116 from noon 15th to noon 16th. I inspected with Colonel Barber site for Collecting station in which he proposed to rest all cases of exhaustion for 12 hours before returning them to Unit. Capt. Watson, dental Officer 6th Aust. Field Ambulance was evacuated with appendicitis. The number of Gassed cases was increased to 200 by 6 pm. Saw the O.C. 14th Aust. Field Ambce (Corps Gas Centre) who was rather pushed for personnel. Arranged to send him another tent sub-division.	
	17th		Visited with General Birdwood, the Rest Stations of 1st and 2nd Australian Division. The Corps Commander expressed himself as very pleased with what he had seen. Colonel Hearne, A.D.M.S. 5th Australian Division was reported as Killed, whilst visiting an R.A.P. A very great loss; he was a most gallant and fearless Officer. The D.D.M.S. Xth Corps came over to ask if he might have a portion of our Main Dressing Station at H.27.c.2.8. There was no objection to this.	
	18th		Called for D.D.M.S. Xth Corps and went on to D.M.S. Second Army. Discussed train service, agreed to allow Xth Corps to have portion of M.D.S. in exchange for Brandhoek. Attended funeral of Colonel Hearne, also Major Bullen, who had been killed by a fragment of shell entering a pill box, which he was using as a dressing post.	
	19th		Went up as far as Railway Dump, beyond horse ambulance post on Zonnebeke Road. Found everything working smoothly. Capt. E.L. Morgan was wounded. Received orders for relief of 4th Australian Division by 1st Australian Division.

	Oct. 20th		D.A.D.M.S. and C.O. 13th Australian Field Ambulance went over proposed site for Dressing Station but reported unfavourably. Saw R.O.D. Borre and made more definite arrangements as regards Ambulance trains on days of Operations. Capt. Russell, Corps Dental Officer reported back from 5th Australian Divisional Artillery, and was instructed to complete any work with Headquarters pending movement to Army Brigades Australian Field Artillery which are resting in La Motte Area.	
	21st		Ypres was heavily shelled. Although no shells fell in the Advanced Dressing Station there, Colonel Barber considered it advisable to move. Gave authority for 13th Australian Field Amb. to get tents from Corps Main Dressing Station at H.27.c.2.8. to establish Advanced Dressing Station at Belgian Battery Corner. Two Motor Ambulance Convoy cars were completely gutted. A.D.S. was re-established at Ypres Station when shelling had subsided.	
	22nd		Visited with A.D.M.S. 4th Australian Division sites for an A.D.S. in the event of further heavy shelling of Ypres. The D.H.Q. at Ramparts is by far the best, but this is not available. No other site offering any advantage over the Ypres Station could be found.	
	23rd		Conference of A.Ds.M.S. The present system of evacuation was discussed and it was generally agreed that owing to the Corps position at the moment, individual Divisional evacuation would now be the best scheme to follow.	
	24th		Conference at D.M.S. Office. Five trains per day on time table was arranged for Operations. In afternoon visited A.D.S. Ypres. Impressed on G.O.C. 1st Aust.Div necessity for sand-bagging huts: He agreed to have men brought up from Reinforcement Camp for this work.	
	25th		D.M.S. A.I.F., Surgeon General Howse arrived to-day. General Birdwood visited 2nd Aust.Div. Rest Station at Waratah Camp.	
	26th		Attack opened at 5-40am. Went up to Menin Road A.D.S. at 9-30 No more wounded coming in than on a normal day. Found the same at Ypres.

	Oct. 27th		General Howse discussed with me wastage in Australian troops which might be expected during the coming winter. He based his forecast on the fact that men having once having had Trench foot would more readily go down again under adverse conditions, also, the Australians being used to warm climate, would feel the second winter far worse than the first. He put our wastage down as 4 per day per thousand. Last winter's figure was 3.2 per day, which does not include killed or missing.	
	28th		5th Australian Division handed over to 2nd Australian Division the Corps Right Sector at Lo am. Colonel Downey from 11th Australian Field Ambulance reported for duty at A.D.M.S. 5th Aust. Division vice Colonel Hearne.	
	29th		Visited A.D.S. Ypres. Saw Colonel Huxtable who informed me that he had been unable to find any better place than the Station and that, well protected with sandbags it should be comparatively safe. Bombs were dropped in numbers in Ypres during night, but with fewer fewer casualties, as men were better dug in.	
	30th		Visited with General Howse the Corps Central Bureau. He considered the system good and promised a staff of "B" class men for it. Afterwards visited 1st D.R.S. General Howse said he required Lt. Colonel Butler, C.O. 3rd Australian Field Ambulance to write the Medical History of the War. 168 Gassed (mustard) were admitted for 24 hours ending noon to-day. Consulting Physician of the Army called in. He mentioned that Gassed cases were being sent down without having had their cloths taken off and that as a result a number of thigh and scrotum burns were being received. I pointed out that Pyjamas were not being returned by Casualty Clearing Stations and we were short.	
	31st.		General Siebert, U.S.A. came in this morning and discussed at length the precautions taken against trenchfoot.

MEDICAL INSTRUCTIONS No. 38

1. The following additional Medical arrangements will be made for "S" day Operations.
2. The A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division will have at his disposal a convoy formed of eight large ambulance cars and three Fords from each of the two Divisions in front line. These will be available under his orders for the evacuation of all stretcher cases of both divisions in the line.
A reserve of sixteen large ambulance cars, formed by eight from the 4th and eight from 5th Australian Divisions will be held at the Corps Main Dressing Station, 28-H.27.c.2.8. These cars will report at C.M.D.S. at 4 pm 3-10-17, and will be at the disposal of A.D.M.S. 2nd Aust. Division.
3. The first sub para of paragraph 7. Medical Instructions No. 37 is cancelled,
4. Each Division in line will use its own horsed transport for evacuation of its own stretcher cases, whenever circumstances render evacuation by Motor ambulances impracticable.
5. The A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division will arrange to place one tent sub-division at YPRES RAILWAY STATION on afternoon of 3rd October. It will act as an Entraining Centre for such stretcher cases and walking wounded as may be sent here to be despatched to Casualty Clearing Station by Ambulance trains; and will be under the orders of the O.C. the Field Ambulance conducting the evacuation of stretcher cases.
ii. All necessary equipment for cases requiring redressing before being entrained and all medical comforts will be provided by the A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division.
iii. Any extra personnel required for Entraining Centre will be provided by utilizing the services of 28 P.B. men from the Corps Main Dressing Station, and A.D.M.S. 1st Australian Division will provide an extra tent-sub-division if required.
6. When the Time Table of trains permits, stretcher cases not requiring attention at the Advanced Dressing Station, I.9.c.6.6 or whose condition does not demand evacuation by motor ambulance direct to Casualty Clearing Station will be sent on to this Entraining Centre, without being taken out at the A.D.S. The transport Officer at the Advanced Dressing Station will keep himself in touch with the times of trains, and regulate his despatch of wounded by ambulance car direct to C.C.S. or to train, accordingly.

MEDICAL INSTRUCTIONS No. 39

1. In accordance with I ANZAC Order No. 187, the following Medical re-arrangements will take place.
2. The evacuation of Stretcher cases from the Left Sector of the Corps front will be carried on by the Ypres-Zonnebeke Road, as per Medical Instructions No. 37 para 7. to the Entraining Centre at the Main Railway Station YPRES, which, with the emergency post at the Ramparts, will be formed into an Advanced Dressing Station for Stretcher cases by the 2nd Aust Division.
 ii. The Officers in charge of the Entraining Centre and Walking Wounded Station in YPRES will mutually arrange for the evacuation of their wounded with the Officer in charge of the Ambulance train. Stretcher cases should be entrained first.
3. Each Division will be responsible for the evacuation as far as possible of its own Stretcher cases and will use its own Horse and Motor Ambulance wagons and make such dispositions of its transport as may best meet circumstances as they arise.
- 34 No Ambulance personnel is to be used, under any circumstances, in advance of Regimental Aid Posts.
- 45 Bearer Divisions should not be employed without at least one of their own Bearer Officers, and all if possible. This particularly applies to Bearer Divisions should they be lent from other Divisions.

MEDICAL INSTRUCTIONS No. 40.

1. In accordance with I ANZAC ORDERS Nos.188 and 189, and the relief of the 1st and 2nd Australian Divisions by the 5th and 4th Australian Divisions respectively, the following Medical re-arrangements will take place.
2.
 - i. The A.D.M.S. 5th Australian Division will take over from the A.D.M.S. 1st Australian Division the Medical arrangements for the evacuation of the Corps Right Sector. He will also take over the Walking Wounded Station at I.9.c.6.6., the Corps Main Dressing Station H.27.c.2.8. and Chateau Hendriques.
 - ii. The relief will be completed by 10 am October 10th 1917 details being mutually arranged by A.Ds.M.S. concerned.
 - iii. The Medical Units of the 1st Australian Division thus relieved will be at the disposal of the A.D.M.S. 1st Aust.Div. for whom the site at 28-G.21.b.2.5. will be available.
3.
 - i. The A.D.M.S. 4th Australian Division will take over from the A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division the medical arrangements for the evacuation of the Corps Left Sector. He will also take over the Advanced Dressing Station for Stretcher cases I.9.c.6.6., the Auxiliary Stations for Stretcher cases and Walking cases in Ypres, the Entraining Centre YPRES, and Belgian Battery Corner site.
 - ii. The relief will be completed by 10 am 11-10-17, details being mutually arranged by A.Ds.M.S. concerned.
 - iii. The Medical Units of the 2nd Australian Division thus relieved, less two Bearer Divisions, will be at the disposal of A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division.
4. The A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division will arrange to hold two Bearer Divisions at the disposal of D.D.M.S. at the Corps Main Dressing Station H.27.c.2.8.
5. The A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Division will detail a tent sub-division of a Field Ambulance to relieve the tent sub-div. of the 4th Australian Division at No. 10 C.C.S. REMY GROUP.
 - ii. Relief to be completed by noon 10-10-17.
6. Horsed Ambulance wagons with teams complete of the 4th and 5th Australian Divisions now being used by the 1st and 2nd Australian Divisions will be returned to the Corps Main Dressing Station by 6 pm 9-10-17.

MEDICAL ARRANGEMENTS - OPERATIONS No.6.

1. a. Each Division in line will be responsible for the clearance of its own front, until evacuation is taken under Corps arrangements either by Ambulance train, Motor Ambulance Convoy or Lorries.
- b. The clearance of the Left Sector of the Corps Front will be by the Ypres-Zonnebeke Road, to the Advanced Dressing Stn. YPRES, and that of the Right Sector, by the Ypres-Menin Road to Advanced Dressing Station at I.9.c.6.6. on Menin Road. The Right Division will supply the personnel for both the Walking and Stretcher case Stations on the Menin Road, and the Left Division, the personnel for the same at Ypres.
- c. From the Advanced Dressing Stations of both Sectors the evacuation will be by (a) Ambulance train, to the GODEWEARS-VELDE GROUP of Casualty Clearing Stations, (b), (c) Motor Ambulances and lorries to the REMY GROUP of Casualty Clearing Stations, via the Ypres-Poperinghe Road.
2. Divisions in line, will utilize their Motor Ambulance wagons as far forward as the road will permit, at which point, a switch standing will be made for cars to turn at. Returning empty trucks on train line will go back as far as Westhoek, from railhead and should be used whenever available. If any facility is offered by the light railway from Westhoek, this should be taken advantage of by the Corps Right Sector.

Divisions in reserve will each hold, on day of operations six ambulance cars under instructions to move off at an hours notice, to reinforce the forward divisional convoys, should the emergency arise.

3. TRANSPORTATION.

i. Ambulance train. - The ambulance train consisting of the regulation ambulance carriages and three passenger coaches will run twice daily during days of operations, and if required be continued as a regular service hereafter. It will arrive at Ypres Station at 11 am and should be despatched whether full or otherwise, by noon at latest; and then return at 4 pm and should again be despatched by 5 pm. Stretcher cases who will not suffer from detention, will be retained in the Advanced Dressing Station for an hour before the train arrives, and be loaded direct from the Hospital Hut to the train. Walking cases up to 100 may be similarly retained. The load of the train is 60 Stretcher and 200 Sitting cases.

A Medical Officer will be placed in charge of the train by the A.D.M.S. 1st Australian Division. This Officer will be responsible that the time table is adhered to as far as possible, and that all blankets and stretchers, and equipment, sent down with patients, are returned from Casualty Clearing Stations. He will see that a sufficient quantity of Medical Comforts and necessaries are on board.

There is a permanent staff of four R.A.M.C. Men on the train.

ii. Motor Ambulance Convoy. The Officer Commanding 20th Motor Ambulance Convoy will arrange evacuation of all stretcher cases from the Advanced Dressing Stations at I.9.c.6.6. and I.7.d.2.2., to the Remy Group of Casualty Clearing Stns. by the Ypres-Poperinghe Road.

iii. Lorries. 20 lorries will be assembled by 7 pm at the Lorry Park Ypres, and 10 in reserve at Belgian Battery Corner, on the day preceding operations. These lorries will be under the Officer lent by the S.M.T.O., who will allot them so as to meet requirements of the A.D.S. I.9.c.6.6. for the evacuation of sitting cases to the train, or direct to the Remy Group Casualty Clearing Stations. Similarly he will meet the requirements of the A.D.S. Ypres, whenever the train is not available.

The Officers in charge of the respective A.D.Ss. will make all arrangements direct with the Officer in charge of the Lorry Park.

4. RECORDS

The Corps Central Bureau will remain in operation until further orders, under Major D. Mackenzie, A.A.M.C.

Field Medical Cards will be given to all patients who pass through Advanced Dressing Stations, unless dangerous congestion may be entailed by the delay.

5. PERSONNEL

Field Ambulance personnel will not be used in front of the Regimental Aid Posts. Divisions in line will be responsible for the provision of such extra bearers as may be necessary in addition to the Field Ambulance Bearer Divisions. A.Ds.M.S. should make all arrangements for securing promptly such personnel should the emergency arise.

Accommodation has been assigned for 100 Ambulance Bearers of the Left Division and for 100 of the Right Division in the Ramparts YPRES. Two huts at the Ramparts will be at the disposal of the Right Division.

6. STRETCHERS & BLANKETS.

A dump is kept at the Corps Main Dressing Station H.27.c.2.8. Application for requirements should be made to the D.D.M.S. Only under exceptional emergency will the O.C. issue without this authority.

7. STRAGGLERS.

Any men who come down to the Advanced Dressing Stations without being able to produce some authority from either the Medical Officer or other Officer of his Unit should, unless obviously sick or wounded, be handed over to the A.P.M. who has made arrangements to have such men taken over at the Advanced Dressing Stations.

8. GASSED CASES. Gassed cases will be sent as heretofore to the Corps Main Dressing Station.
9. The Walking Wounded portion of the Corps Main Dressing Station H.28.c.2.8., with tents, has been placed at the disposal of D.D.M.S. Xth Corps from 22-10-17.

MEDICAL ARRANGEMENTS - OPERATIONS No.6.

1. a. Each Division in line will be responsible for the clearance of its own front, until evacuation is taken under Corps arrangements either by Ambulance train, Motor Ambulance Convoy or Lorries.
b. The clearance of the Left Sector of the Corps Front will be by the Ypres-Zonnebeke Road, to the Advanced Dressing Stn. YPRES, and that of the Right Sector, by the Ypres-Menin Road to Advanced Dressing Station at I.9.c.6.6. on Menin Road. The Right Division will supply the personnel for both the Walking and Stretcher case Stations on the Menin Road, and the Left Division, the personnel for the same at Ypres.
c. From the Advanced Dressing Stations of both Sectors the evacuation will be by (a) Ambulance train, to the GODEWEARS-VELDE GROUP of Casualty Clearing Stations, (b), (c) Motor Ambulances and lorries to the REMY GROUP of Casualty Clearing Stations, via the Ypres-Poperinghe Road.
2. Divisions in line, will utilize their Motor Ambulance wagons as far forward as the road will permit, at which point, a switch standing will be made for cars to turn at. Returning empty trucks on train line will go back as far as Westhoek, from railhead and should be used whenever available. If any facility is offered by the light railway from Westhoek, this should be taken advantage of by the Corps Right Sector.

Divisions in reserve will each hold, on day of operations six ambulance cars under instructions to move off at an hours notice, to reinforce the forward divisional convoys, should the emergency arise.

c. From the Advanced Dressing Stations of both Sectors the evacuation will be by (a) Ambulance train, to the GODEWEARS-VELDE GROUP of Casualty Clearing Stations, (b), (c) Motor Ambulances and lorries to the REMY GROUP of Casualty Clearing Stations, via the Ypres-Poperinghe Road.
2. Divisions in line, will utilize their Motor Ambulance wagons as far forward as the road will permit, at which point, a switch standing will be made for cars to turn at. Returning empty trucks on train line will go back as far as Westhoek, from railhead and should be used whenever available. If any facility is offered by the light railway from Westhoek, this should be taken advantage of by the Corps Right Sector.

Divisions in reserve will each hold, on day of operations six ambulance cars under instructions to move off at an hours notice, to reinforce the forward divisional convoys, should the emergency arise.

3. TRANSPORTATION.

i. Ambulance train. - The ambulance train consisting of the regulation ambulance carriages and three passenger coaches will run twice daily during days of operations, and if required be continued as a regular service hereafter. It will arrive at Ypres Station at 11 am and should be despatched whether full or otherwise, by noon at latest; and then return at 4 pm and should again be despatched by 5 pm. Stretcher cases who will not suffer from detention, will be retained in the Advanced Dressing Station for an hour before the train arrives, and be loaded direct from the Hospital Hut to the train. Walking cases up to 100 may be similarly retained. The load of the train is 60 Stretcher and 200 Sitting cases.

A Medical Officer will be placed in charge of the train by the A.D.M.S. 1st Australian Division. This Officer will be responsible that the time table is adhered to as far as possible, and that all blankets and stretchers, and equipment, sent down with patients, are returned from Casualty Clearing Stations. He will see that a sufficient quantity of Medical Comforts and necessaries are on board.

There is a permanent staff of four R.A.M.C. Men on the train.

ii. Motor Ambulance Convoy. The Officer Commanding 20th Motor Ambulance Convoy will arrange evacuation of all stretcher cases from the Advanced Dressing Stations at I.9.c.6.6. and I.7.d.2.2., to the Remy Group of Casualty Clearing Stns. by the Ypres-Poperinghe Road.

iii. Lorries. 20 lorries will be assembled by 7 pm at the Lorry Park Ypres, and 10 in reserve at Belgian Battery Corner, on the day preceding operations. These lorries will be under the Officer lent by the S.M.T.O., who will allot them so as to meet requirements of the A.D.S. I.9.c.6.6. for the evacuation of sitting cases to the train, or direct to the Remy Group Casualty Clearing Stations. Similarly he will meet the requirements of the A.D.S. Ypres, whenever the train is not available.

The Officers ~~in charge of the respective A.D.Ss.~~ will make all arrangements direct with the Officer in charge of the Lorry Park.

4. RECORDS

The Corps Central Bureau will remain in operation until further orders, under Major D. Mackenzie, A.A.M.C.

Field Medical Cards will be given to all patients who pass through Advanced Dressing Stations, unless dangerous congestion may be entailed by the delay.

5. PERSONNEL

Field Ambulance personnel will not be used in front of the Regimental Aid Posts. Divisions in line will be responsible for the provision of such extra bearers as may be necessary in addition to the Field Ambulance Bearer Divisions. A.Ds.M.S. should make all arrangements for securing promptly such personnel should the emergency arise.

Accommodation has been assigned for 100 Ambulance Bearers of the Left Division and for 100 of the Right Division in the Ramparts YPRES. Two huts at the Ramparts will be at the disposal of the Right Division.

6. STRETCHERS & BLANKETS.

A dump is kept at the Corps Main Dressing Station H.27.c.2.8. Application for requirements should be made to the D.D.M.S. Only under exceptional emergency will the O.C. issue without this authority.

7. STRAGGLERS. Any men who come down to the Advanced Dressing

Stations without being able to produce some authority from either the Medical Officer or other Officer of his Unit should, unless obviously sick or wounded, be handed over to the A.P.M. who has made arrangements to have such men taken over at the Advanced Dressing Stations.

8. GASSED CASES. Gassed cases will be sent as heretofore to the Corps Main Dressing Station.
9. The Walking Wounded portion of the Corps Main Dressing Station H.Q. 24.c.2.8., with tents, has been placed at the disposal of D.D.M.S. Xth Corps from 22-10-17.

The following is a detailed account of the system in operation at present.

(1st Anzac Corps Central Bureau.

PROCEDURE.

The wounded (stretcher cases) almost invariably arrive at C.C.S. with Field Medical Cards filled in at A.D.S. under supervision of an M.O.

The Walking Wounded in normal times arrive with Field Medical Cards, same having been supplied at Main Dressing Station, but in busy times the walking wounded (in the majority of cases) arrive without Field Medical Cards and for this purpose 8 clerks have to be utilized at the C.C.S.'s - One by day & One by night at each C.C.S. If cards were supplied at M.D.S. it would, in my opinion, during a rush save a congestion at the C.C.S. and allow the Cases to be pushed right through C.C.S. instead of having to take the Dressing down to diagnose such cases. As per reports from various C.C.S.s it would appear that the wounded arrive without dressed "as well as ever". and I think that if Field Medical Cards were made out at M.D.S. when the wounded were being dressed the Diagnosis could be recorded and any A.T.S. injected recorded instead of having to rely on the patient's word. This would also save time and unnecessary duplication of dressing at the C.C.S.

A.F.W.3210 is made out at C.C.S. by Bureau Clerks for all cases not previously recorded by a Field Ambulance and includes all cases direct from the Forward Area.

A.F.W.3210. The following particulars are recorded on A.F.W. 3210 for each case :- Units and Division or Formation. Reg. No. Rank, Name and initials, Disease or Wounds, Injection of A.T.S. and C.C.S. to which admitted.

The A.F.W.'s 3210 are collected every two hours in slack times and every hour in busy times (during an offensive) by a runner who brings them to Bureau and hands over to a Sorter who is well acquainted with the Formations of the 1st and 2nd A.N.Z.A.C. and who sorts them into Divisions and Formations and files them in a series of pigeon Holes as under:-

At the same time recording on a Two-hourly Chart the Casualties by Division and Formations so that the Totals can be readily ascertained at and up to the previous two hours. Charts run from 6 a.m. to 6 a.m. Tables are kept at Bureau and staffed as under :-

A & D Books and returns for the 2nd A.N.Z.A.C. are compiled alternate by Clerks of the 1st & 4th Division when their Division is not in the Line. (2nd A.N.Z.A.C. is now represented at this Bureau)

Prisoners of War and Other Colonial Formations, also Chinese Troops are recorded by one clerk each of 2nd & 5th Australian Divisions.

Other British Formations (all U/K troops) A & D Books & A. 36 are compiled by three clerks (loaned from VIII Corps) and 1 Australian and A.F.W.3185 is made out by 2nd & 5th Aust. Div. Clerks engaged on "Other Colonial Formations".

Four Clerks from X Corps (2 from 5th and 2 from 21st Divisions) one each by day and one by night - keep separate A & D Books for their Divisions and compile the figures required for their A.F.W. 3185.

A.F.W.3210. are collected and after being put up in Division and Other Formations pigeon holes are collected by their respective Divisional Clerks and entered in Divisional A & D Books by one Clerk and immediately entered on A.F.A 36 by a second clerk who files them in a series of pigeon holes representing the Units of that Division. From these pigeon holes the figures for 3185 are obtained daily at Noon, the Total Numbers of 3210's Sick and Wounded balancing with numbers of Sick & Wounded entries in A & D Books since the Previous Noon. The 3210's are then put in envelopes addressed to the O/C of the Unit concerned and

Handed in to Orderly Room where a covering memo as under is added. viz 51
"The attached A.F.W. 3210 represent personnel of your Unit who have
passed thro' books of 3rd Aust. Field Ambulance and have been evacuated to
C.C.S's shown thereon unless otherwise stated, for 24 hours ended noon

These envelopes are then sealed and sent to A.D's.M.S. of respective Divisions daily at 4.30 p.m. with other data. They are then passed from A.D's.M.S. to Signals for delivery to destination and if the Service is thorough there should be no reason why the various O'S.C. should not receive their casualties for 24 hours ending noon, each evening. In the cases of Other Formations the packages are posted. - The number of advises to Units sent out Daily vary from 450 km in quiet times to 700 in busy times.

RETURNS.

A.F.A.36 is compiled for 24 hours ending Midnight- in Triplicate for Colonial Troops and singly for Other British Formations (excepting X Corp when a Duplicate is made out and sent to A.D's.M.S. of 5th and 21st Div for information). and despatched to D.A.G.BASE daily for all British Trps, by registered post and to O in C.Prisoners of War Section. LE HAVRE in the case of German Prisoners.
For Australian Troops (1st ANZAC) duplicate & Triplicate A.F's A36 are sent to A.D's.M.S. of each Division concerned , the former for transmission to AXEL Adm.H.Q. A.I.F. LONDON and the latter for his own information.
Duplicate and Triplicate A.36 for (2nd ANZAC) and other Colonial Formts (Canadians, Sth Africans etc.) are sent to A.D.M.S. 2nd Australian Div. for disposal.

A.F's.W. 3185. are compiled as follows :- Clerks from A.D's.M.S. Office of 1st 2nd & 4th Divisions and a Sergt Clerk from the 5th Australian Div. are responsible for the consolidation of these returns.
All Australian Field Ambulances less three in the Forward Area, viz;- A.D.S. Lying Wounded . A.D.S. Walking Wounded and Main Dressing Station, render their 3185's and in the case of those Ambulances running Divisional Rest Stations A.F.W. 3185 are rendered for the Rest Stations in addition, to CORPS CENTRAL BUREAU where the figures of each division are dissected by the A.D.M.S.Clerk of the Division concerned and consolidated with those already taken from the 3210's i.e. the cases which have passed through the Books of the Bureau. Thus each 3185 sent to the A.D.M.S. for signature prior to submitting to the D.M.S. 2nd ARMY AND D.D.M.S. 1st ANZAC is a complete record of the Casualties of that particular Div. for the 24 hours from Noon to Noon. To this is attached the 3185 rendered by the Field Ambulances of his Division including the Rest Stns 3185 so that the A.D.M.S. concerned knows exactly what Formations have been treated by his own Ambulances and what Formations are in his Rest Stations.

Omms. II Army Replying to your letter No 5003/17.

I beg to report that there has been no difficulty in carrying out the new method in the case of the walking wounded with the assistance of the staff supplied by the Field Ambulances.

The lying wounded have, with few exceptions, come with Field Medical Cards as before and this has relieved us of considerable extra work and inconvenience.

Both walking and lying wounded have arrived here with wounds practically as well dressed as ever before.

We are not in a position to check comparatively the time taken from time of wounding to arrival here.

I desire to make the following comments and suggestions:-

1. In a heavy rush of walking wounded 12 clerks were required instead of 6 provided by Bureau in order to prevent congestion. This was especially the case when Im. Cards were not made out at the C.C.S.
2. The number of walking cases admitted to C.C.S. by Ambulance lorries during the time the C.C.S. is admitting 100 lying cases, may vary from 50 to 400 and therefore there should be some system of regulating this number of walkers. (I would suggest that lorries be directed to C.C.S. in turn in the same way as are the Shuttle trains)

So far as my observations go the scheme has worked very satisfactorily especially from the standpoint of the welfare of the patients.

In accordance with your instructions No.M 505 dated 24th September 1917 I have the honor to submit the following report.

The basis of the report will be the Medical arrangements No 5 issued on 15/9/17 by D.D.M.S. 1st A.N.Z.A.C. and will point out where changes have been found necessary from time to time and which have been reported to you as they were made.

Para 3 sub para (a)

The clerk detailed to fill in A.F.W. 3210 requires to have had experience in dressing wounded as although serious cases are supposed to get A.F.W. 3118 (Field Medical Cards) at the Advanced Dressing Station, in action 50% do not.

A.F.W. 3210 is filled in by Central Bureau Clerk at C.C.S. before patients are seen by Medical Officers. The Diagnosis is therefore left to the clerk in these cases and also the walking cases who become stretcher cases at the C.C.S.

With an experienced Clerk this works quite well in practice.

Sub-para (b) note (ii) Waiting Tent.

Here a clerk from the Central Bureau Staff sees that the A.F.W. 3118 are correctly filled in and in the case where there is on card supplies one, the Field Ambulance diagnosis being left blank and records done of A.T.S.. In the absence of the Ambulance Official Stamp the number of the Field Ambulance is written on the card of all cases admitted to C.C.S. All cases admitted to C.C.S. will be recorded on A.F.W. 3210 which will show the number of the C.C.S. admitting them these are periodically collected by a ^{runner} ~~runner~~ from the Bureau and sorted into their respective Divisions for which purpose a set of labelled pigeon holes is kept in the Bureau

The Proforma "S" which should be kept up to date by the sorter showing number of casualties by Divisions from hour to hour.

The staff required for the central Bureau must be men with some experience in clerical work and must write a good clear hand.

There must be a reserve to call upon in a rush as the C.C. Stations double and triplicate their dressing room staff and more clerks are required to keep pace with them. Men also get fatigued with the eye strain and are apt to make mistakes and must be relieved as often as possible.

The clerks working in the C.C.S's should get their meals there.

The conditions at REMY SIDING have been ideal for statting the Bureau as all the C.C. Stations are in a block and therefore the returns are easily and rapidly collected and clerks easily supervised and a D.R.S. is directly opposite which can distribute D.R.S. cases to their respective D.R.S's

The staff required to carry on a Central Bureau for a period in which there are continuous heavy casualties should be :-
