

Appendices to A.D.M.S. New Zealand Division. School of Sanitation inspected and the course of instruction discussed. It was evident that the School is doing a great deal of good. Called on the D.M.S. Second Army with reference to the unusual number of cases of Shell-Shock occuring in the Third Australian Division and measures for it's prevention were discussed. It was agreed that it was a matter for the Division to deal with. The steps taken by the Division on the advice of the D.D.M.S. II Anzac Corps were reviewed by the D.M.S. who approved and agreed that there was evidence that these were already acting well. An inspection was made of the Third Australian Divisional Rest Station and of the Billets of the 3rd and 4th Sections of the Third Australian D.A.C. Lectured on Shell-Shock, Malingering, Neurasthenia at II Anzac Corps Medical Officers School. Visited the Artillery Waggon Lines In the Third Australian Division. Steps to ensure better sanitation were taken. A visit was paid to the area of the 25th Division. Visited Neuve Eglise, Advanced Dressing Station at Kandahar Farm. The road at this Station is a single way pave and requires widening. The dressing station is a very fine one. PROPOSED SYLLABUS

for

COURSE OF SANITATION.

FIRST DAY.

Lecture - Aims and objects of sanitation.

Practical Work - Incinerators (faeces, refuse, manure).

SECOND DAY.

Lecture - Measures necessary for combating disease.

Practical Work - Latrines and urinals.

THIRD DAY.

Lecture - Cleanliness (personal and general), disposal of refuse, destruction of fleas and lice.

Practical Work - Grease traps, refuse receptacles, ablution benches and basins. Practical demonstration of disinfection of a billet and dug-out.

FOURTH DAY .-

Lecture - Comfort of troops, light, ventilation, heating, beds, etc., under varying conditions of dug-outs, cellars, billets in houses, barns, hutments and tents; destruction of rats, flies and mosquitoes.

Practical Work - Bed construction, night urine pails, candlesticks, stoves, straw mats, glass substitutes, paths and drainage.

FIFTH DAY.

Lecture - Cookhouses and food protection (flies, rats, etc.).

Practical Work - Field ovens, meat safes, food covers.
