

DIVISIONAL HEADQUARTERS,

9th November, 1916.

1st Australian Division.

I have heard that it is suggested that our division should prolong their stay in the Trenches. As A.D.M.S. I feel it my duty to express my opinion that to keep the men longer in the line is to brook disaster from a medical point of view.

A big majority of the men have never been dry since the 27th of last month and while in the trenches are standing in mud and water, sleep being out of the question. Owing to the fact that they were hurried down from the North and then conveyed by bus to the front, they have - many of them at least - been without hot food for the same period and longer.

It is generally admitted, I think, that our men have worked hard in all areas they have occupied but this has only been done by sapping their strength, and it has been done without what one might term a rest.

In addition to the above reasons I know that the men do not think they are having what they term a "fair deal" and to keep them in the line longer than Imperial Divisions will merely accentuate this idea and will end by breaking their spirit and thus rendering them more liable to disease and sickness.

When it is considered that many of the Australians have not experienced a winter for three years and are not accustomed to this climate I do ~~not~~ think they should be dealt with carefully at the present time.

1. The Second Australian Field Ambulance will be relieved by the Fourth Australian Field Ambulance in the front line. Relief to be completed by 8 a.m. on 14th instant, under arrangements to be made between respective O. C's.
2. The bearer division of the 3rd Aust. Field Ambulance which moved to POMMIER Camp today will move to D.12 D. on the morning of 15th instant and will come under the orders of O.C. 3rd Aust. Field Ambulance.
3. The bearer division of the 1st Aust. Field Ambulance will move to the Corps main dressing Station on 13th instant and on 14th instant proceed to D.12 B. where it will come under the orders of the O.C. 1st Aust. Field Ambulance.
4. The 2nd Aust. Field Ambulance with all transport and ambulances remaining with them, will move on the 14th instant at 1 p.m. to Corps main dressing Station BECQDEL and will move at 8 ^a m. on 15th instant to BOIRE where it will join 1st Aust. Infantry Brigade group.
