

With reference to your F6/51 of 1st Inst. and G.H.Q. and 5th Army correspondence re food economy.

In my oponion the most important thing is that the exact ration (as closely as possible) is drawn. The amount of bully beef

going to waste has been enormous. G.R.O.2012 should be strictly carried out.

- (2) Biscuits should be issued to men as required, not to scale, and demands should be in accordance with requirements.
- Special Officers appointed to supervise the food question. Following is a extract from No. 3. Aus. Field Ambulance Corps Orders of 3-5-1917.

"Capt.L. May will be responsible for the supervision of water supply, and of cooking, messing, and use of f food supply."

Personal talk to the men, e.g. extract from No.3 A.F. Amb. (4) orders 3-5-1917.

"The seriousness of Great Britian's position with regard to the shortage of sea freight is no doubt realized by all.

Shortage of sea freight necessarily means a deficiency of food supplies in the United Kingdom. The Authorities are continuing to supply troops with an extremely liberal ration, and in return it should be a point of honour with all ranks to reciprocate and actively assist in the economy of foodstuffs and prevention of waste."



- (5) CO-operation of cooks- this is usually possible. The saving of dripping is quite easily effected and should be done by every unit behind the line.
- (6) Careful observation of the incinerator by the Orderly Officer and report to the Officer Commanding and Quartermaster of signs of superfluity of food.
- (7) More close supervision of the Quartermaster's Department by the Officer Commanding than is usually considered necessary or possible.
- Training of cooks and close interest in thier work by Officers and encouragement and help given.
- (9) Any indication of lack of care in allowing for overdrawn rations should not be permitted to pass without investigation. When food in procurable locally by purchase by the men there is sometimes some waste of Army rations.
- (10) A small issue of sauce or pickles would probably lead to less waste of bully beef.

(11) En my opinion the only serious habitual waste of foodstuff

has been:-(1) Bullybeef. 2. Biscuits. 3. Fat. 4. Iron rations. the two former only when issued-as is often done-without discrimination. The last when issued to the men and notheld by the Quartermaster until required.

The high percentage of cases already discharged to duty from Rest Stations is worthy of note as showing that a large number of cases sent away were of a mild type.

The R.M.O. 2nd Battn informs me that all but 2 of his cases occurred in two compandes. Owing to the position of the outposts held by these two companies the men in thum could not come back to HERMIES in small batches for foot treatment - a centre for which he had established in that town. The other two companies were able to avail themselves of this treatment with the result indicated.

The 4th Battn suffered most during the perbod it held a similar position on our right flank.

Recognising the difficulties likely to be met in an attempt to continue the Camphor Treatment, massage with whale oil was specially mentioned in this Office Circular to all R.M.Os dated 13/4/17, Np. T 13/125.

MONTHLY SANITARY REPORT.

A.D.M.S., 1st Australian Division.

for month ending May 25th 1917.

PHYSIQUE.

No deterioration. General Health has improved considerably due to living under better conditions of weather. For two days after coming out of the line, sick wastage increased above normal. This was to be expected as it is known that many men who are sick when fighting is in progress, delay reporting sick until relief.

BILLETS & CAMPS.

On 28th April the Division was withdrawn from the in line and billeted and camped in "M" Area, but returned almost immediately, to assist the 2nd Australian Division in the operations against BULLECOURT.

On the 7th May the Division was again withdrawn

from the line to "M" Area.

On 23/24th May the Division moved to rest billets

in BAIZIEUX Area.

Accommodation was a mixture of tented camps and billets in ruined villages &c. until arrival in the Rest Area.

Fine wealther conditions have made satisfactory

accommodation more easily obtained.

Hutted Camps occupied in BAZENTIN Area were very dirty but the Sanitary condition was improved.

BATHING.

Practically all the men were bathed soon after withdrawal, in their camps, as weather confitions were suitable for this :-

Baths were in FREMICOURT, Capacity 1 Bn per day.

CLOTHING.

All troops have been provided with clean clothing.

FOOD & COOKING. Good. Rations have been augmented by Comforts purchased out of Battalion Funds.

WATER SUPPLY. Master Sixty Water Duty men were transferred from forward area to water points in "H" area.

LATRINES.

The work of providing Public Latrines has been progressing steadily. Battalions have had difficulty in procuring seats.
