

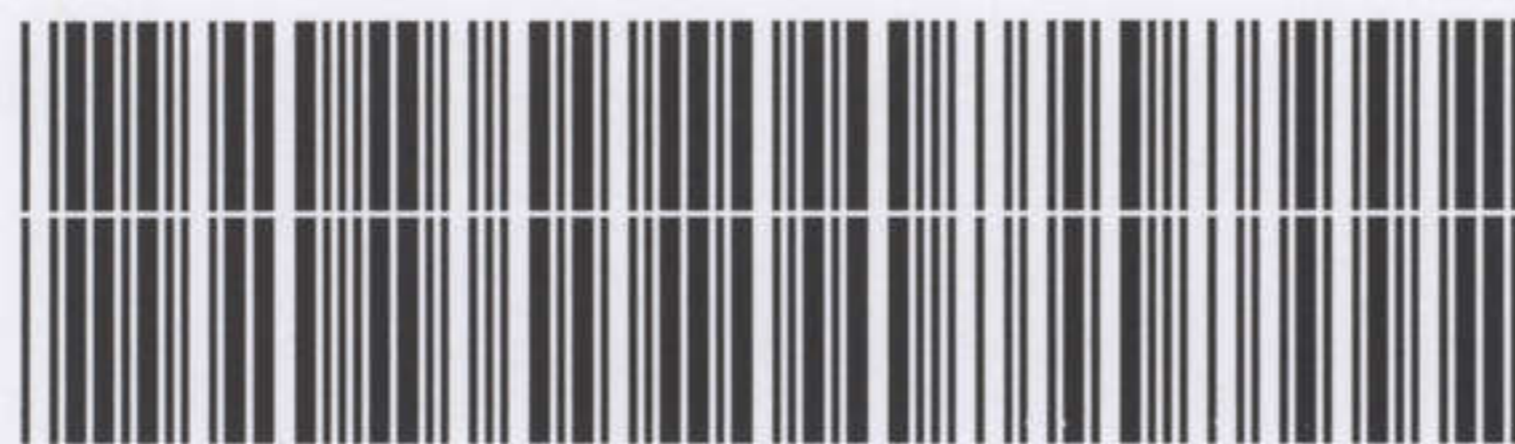

MOASCAR</u> :- Memo received from C.O. 2nd A.S.H. asking that additional A.A.M.C. Other Ranks Personnel be sent to reinforce his Unit.
