

So far most of the bubldings are only partly constructed Bessaneau Hangars are being used at present pending the completion of brick hangars. It will be some considerable time before these buildings are ready for occupation.



The undercarriage was crashed and the machine stood on its nose damaging both bottom planes. 2. The pupil Cad t F.B. Conroy was flying Avro Mono D142 and the right hand tyre came off after the aeroplane had landed, the machine swerved and then slowly went on to its nose.
