

Park House	15.6.	17	No. 30 Training Squadron established from personnel of A.F.C. Depot, No. 1 Camp, Parkhouse, moved from Parkhouse to Shawbury Aerodrome. Reveille 3 a.m. Squadron marched to Tidworth Station and entrained at 7 a.m. under Major Broun, Capt. Lang and 2/Lt. Warneford. Owing to slackness of railway authorities about 50 of the troops were left on platform at Cheltenham railway station and followed by next train under SgtMajor McLauchlan. Arrived Hadnall about 4 p.m. and the whole Squadron was fixed up with Quarters in the new aerodrome by 9 p.m.	
Shawbury	16.6.	17	Capt. Forbes M.C., an Imperial Officer in Command, 2/Lt. Warneford, A/Adjutant. All day devoted getting into stride.	
#	17.6.	17	Nothing to report, except Squadron Orders No. 1 issued.	
**	18.6.	17	2/AM King J.H.S. evacuated to Prees Heath Hospital. (Natural causes). A/Cpl. Brettingham	
II.	19.6.	17	Nothing unusual occurred. Squadron rapidly settling down.	
#	20.6.	6	Cpl. Brettingham-Moore and 2/AM Brady sent to Tern Hill for instruction in Storekeeping. Members of the Squadron had to be warned in orders relative to holding conversation with German Prisoners of whom a large number are camped here, being employed on the Aerodrome on construction. 2/AM Cronin reported as a rigger.	
11	21.6.		Four M.T. Drivers taken on strength to-day 2/AMs Day, Retchford, Schultz and Close.	
11	22.6.		C.Os. inspection at 9.15 a.m. Capt. Forbes created a good impression among all ranks. Lieut. A. Le P. Jones 2nd Battn. Hampshire Regt. reported from C.F.S. as A/Adjutant. First Orderly Room held when five men were punished for minor offences.	
11	23.6.		2/AM Tucker and 2/AM Clow taken on strength, and 2/AMs Burnell and Marshall transferred to 71st Squadron, Castle Bromwich.
