



Time flown 11 hrs. 25 mins. Flying was curtailed by the heavy rain and mist. Time flown 6 brs. 40 mins. Rain and 12th mist. All ranks with the exception of routine fatigues proceeded on usual fortnightly holiday. 13th Time flown Nil. Rain and fog. Weather very wet and misty. 

GUNNERY TRAINING.

REPORT ON WORK CARRIED OUT BY 6 TS. A.F.C. NOVEMBER 1918,

Report of the Ground and Aerial Gunnery Training of the 6th Training Squadron A.F.C. for the month ending 30th November 1918.

Ground Gunnery Training was carried out on 25 days of the month the usual Squadron Holidays and Holidays during the Armistice period occupying the remainder.

Eleven new pupils were taken en strength during the month whilst three pupils were struck off strength on preceeding to a finishing school. A fourth pupil proceeded to Gosport for Special Course on Special flying.

At the beginning of the month the pupils under instruction numbered 32, and the strength increased to ferty at the end of the month.

The month's work consisted chiefly of Range practices with RAF Tests, whilst inder instruction was given on C.C. Gear, Medel Aeroplane Ring Sight practices, and stoppages on Lewis and Vickers Guns.

During the month sixty RAF Tests were passed after several satisfactory practices at each test.

The average daily attendance of pupils was 24, being an improvement on the previous month. Pupils who had passed all tests numbered 28 and were only compelled to attend I hour per week to pass weekly test in accordance with Squadron Orders. The remainder were in daily attendance.

The classes attended Range Practices en 12 Range days and details are as follows:-

Onntwelve range days 12,250 rounds of .303 Mk. VII Amm. used, being an average of 500 rounds per pupil for the month.

Vickers: Eight range days firing 8,215 rounds.

Lewis: Four range days firing 4,035 rounds. Breakages occurred on both guns, and were rather heavy on the Vickers. Broken Companents, Vickers: - 1 split pin, firing: 3 pins

firing: 1 lockspring: 1 gland, packing.

Broken Components, Lewis: - 1 Spade grip; 1 bolt body (fractured) 1 feed arm latch.

Clay pigeon practice was also carried out by pupils, 200 rds. being firedu securing 76 hits.

The number of Instructional Hours lost by pupils was the same as previous month. 60 hrs.

WIRELESS REPORT.



During the month of November, ninety pupils (Officers and Cadets Training as Flying Officers) were instructed in Morse on Buzzer circuits, both in sending and receiving up to the required standard speed per minute.

Besides Operations on Buzzer Circuits, the pupils have been instructed in and passed out proficient on the Silent Key and Lamp, also Morse Inking Machines. Results have been most satisfactory generally, and in many cases the pupils have been so far interested in their Morse, that they have obtained speeds so high as 20 and 25 words per minute.

Punctuality and attendance at classes has been good.

The short Wave Aerial in course of construction at the latter end of last month has been completed and is quite satisfactory.

The new Instructional Hut for the Wireless Pool (Operators and Mechanics) has been completed.

Lectures on Electrical Theory apportaining to Wireless Telegraphy and Telephony, Artillery Observation, and Shoots and General Corps Squadron Wireless work for Operators and Mechanics have been given.

As the Armistice was signed early in the month, no Official Examinations have been set on the above Instruction as was intended, but nevertheless the interest and progress shewn has been good.

Up to the termination of hostilities, French, American, and British Official War News has been received ex Eiffel Tower, Paris, and copies distributed to the Squadrons.

During the latter part of the month work has been carried out in preparing apparatus for carrying out proposed Puff shoots, and Artillery Observation in co-operation with Corps Squadron Work at Leighterton Aerodrome.
