Special Order of the Day.

On the 12th August the Commanding-in-Chief takes
over command in person and Eastern Force ceases to
exist.

I took over command after the troops had been engaged
in hard fighting, hard marching, and had suffered some
casualties.

The task given us by the Commanding-in-Chief was to put
24 miles of front into a state of defence and from it
conduct an active offensive defensive.

In heat, dust, lack of sleep and general discomfort the
