WEEKLY REPORT ON ANIMALS OF 4th AUSTRALIAN DIVISION.

The Mobile Vety. Section was visited twice during the week, and animals for evacuation inspected.

Where it is impossible to see the animals of individual units it is considered that by inspecting the animals evacuated D.A.D.V.S. is able to form an opinion as to the state of the animals in the Division generally.

After considerable delay, during the week it was possible to adjust and complete the necessary arrangements with regard to animals left behind on the recent line of march. Horse Recovery Forms No. 2 were left at those places from which animals had been collected, and only temporary receipts given to the inhabitants, and where Horse Recovery Form No. 2 had been left at the rate of 2 Frs. per day, it has now been changed to the new rate of 5 Frs. per day. One animal whose unit up to the present has not been identified was collected from PHILIPPEVILLE.

No regular inspection of Units has taken place during the week.

It is very satisfactory to note that the number of animals remaining under treatment within the Division is remarkably small.

WEEKLY REPORT ON ANIMALS OF 4th AUSTRALIAN DIVISION.

The 11th Aust. F.A. Bde. was visited and animals inspected. With the exception of some of the horses of the 42nd Battery, the animals are in good condition. They are, however, not as sleek as might be expected; the very heavy coats may to a certain extent account for this, also numbers of animals are being turned loose to graze, with the result that they roll and get very muddy.

The stable accommodation throughout is good, but hardly sufficient, the animals being crowded in low roofed stables. Bedding is very scarce, and animals are being kept standing on the hard floors. The 42nd Battery have a number of animals still in the open. This Unit badly needs stables, as the animals are showing marked ill effects of the exposure they are being subjected to. Good water is available throughout the area, but troughing is needed. At present such time is likely to be wasted with watering parades.

The rest of the week has been spent examining and classifying animals for demobilisation. This is considered a large undertaking, but affords an excellent opportunity to examine thoroughly all the animals of the Division.

It will be noted from figures below that the number of injuries and the wastage generally has increased largely. With animals well housed and doing very little work, kicks may be expected to increase. Great care should be exercised by all concerned to prevent wastage from injuries.

Winge is on the increase, which is very much regretted. Unfortunately this is likely to give further trouble, as it is almost impossible to tell whether a stable is clean or Winge infected. The animals having such thick coats makes it rather difficult to detect Winge in its very earliest stages.

WEEKLY REPORT ON ANIMALS OF 4th AUSTRALIAN DIVISION.

During the week the classification of animals prior to demobilisation has been proceeded with. The number of animals classified each day is satisfactory, and it is hoped to maintain a daily average of 200 animals.

The following Units/have been completed.- 13th Inf.Bde.Group, consisting of B.H.Q., 49th Bn., 50th Bn., 51st Bn., 13th Field Ambulance, 13th Field Coy., and 27th Coy.A.A.S.C.. This Group of animals is considered very satisfactory, as they appear to have improved considerably. The following points are, however, noted.- Attention was called to the shoeing of the 51st Bn. Mules, as the feet of these animals were allowed to grow too long. The shoeing of the Horses is fairly satisfactory. It was noted that the 13th Field Coy. animals had improved considerably, and may now be said to be at their best; grooming is very satisfactory. The 13th Field Ambulance have improved considerably.

The 12th Inf.Bde.Group, consisting of the B.H.Q., 45th Bn., 46th Bn., 48th Bn., 12th Field Ambulance, and 12th Field Coy. are also in very good condition, with the exception of 12th Field Coy., whose animals appear to receive very little grooming, and are therefore very dirty.

The Pioneer Battalion were inspected and classified. The animals of this Bn. are not in a particularly good condition.

1. The shortage of Veterinary officers has for some time past been a source of trouble and inconvenience in the allotting of V.Os. to Units. The allotment having constantly to be changed and in consequence the strictest supervision is unable to be exercised in all cases. The present establishment of D.A.D.V.S., O.C. M.V.S., and three Veterinary Officers is not sufficient to enable the staff to carry out the axiom of "Prevention is better than the Cure". I therefore suggest that the staff should consist of D.A.D.V.S., O.C. M.V.S., and Four Veterinary Officers, the latter being posted as follows:- One V.O. to each Brigade of Artillery, One V.O. to Divisional Train, and one V.O. who would, depending on the disposition of Units, live at the M.V.S. or with an Infantry Brigade Hdqrs. O.C. M.V.S., V.O. Div.Train, and the spare V.O. would between them render Veterinary attention to the M.V.S., the whole of the Div. Train, Three Infantry Brigades, D.H.Q., Pioneer Bn., three Field Coys., three Field Amb., Div.Sig.Coy., and S.A.A. Section D.A.C. These Units, however grouped, are considered three V.Os. each. It is considered that the work entailed in attending these Units efficiently, however grouped, is sufficient to employ three Veterinary Officers constantly. V.Os. of each Artillery Brigade would look after the Arty.Bde. and one section of the D.A.C.

2. I consider a M.V.S. most essential. In my opinion it is the backbone of the Veterinary services of a Division.

3. I am very strongly in favour of increasing the subordinate personnel. At present in Units where no Sgt.A.A.V.C. is attached the dressing is done either by the Farriers or by a man who acts as a dresser or offsider to Sgts.A.A.V.C., whose duty it is to visit the Unit. Unfortunately it is quite often impossible for the Sgt.A.A.V.C. to visit all his Units every day; a dresser is therefore essential. The Farriers, of whatever rank, have quite sufficient to do to keep the animals of the Division well shod, and in giving instructions to those who are not thoroughly proficient. It is very rare to meet with a Unit whose horses can be said to be really well shod. I therefore suggest that in every Unit where there is an establishment of Veterinary equipment, there should also be an A.A.V.C. Cpl., L/Cpl., or Dresser as the case may be, depending upon the number of animals e.g. 1 Cpl. to Pioneer Bn., 1 Cpl. to each Field Coy., 1 L/Cpl. or Dresser to each Machine Gun Coy. Battalion, 1 Dresser to each Machine Gun Coy., and 1 Dresser assistant to Sgt.A.A.V.C. in each Battery of Artillery and Sections of D.A.C. I would also suggest that one Sgt.A.A.V.C. be attached to the Div.Train., and 1 L/Cpl. with each Coy.A.A.S.C. It would be preferable for all Dressers to be Lance Corporals. D.A.D.V.S. would then have a representative in every unit who would be conversant with all orders affecting the animals, and who would also be directly responsible to D.A.D.V.S. for reporting all irregularities.
