1ST. ROYAL GLOUCESTERSHIRE HUSSARS YEOMANRY.

Major C.E. Turner D.S.O. was appointed President of a Court of Enquiry held at Brigade H.Q.

The Regt. less details left in camp under 2nd. Lieuts. Wilkins & Townsend moved to FARA EAST Camp, preparatory to taking over the duties of the outpost line in conjunction with the Worcester Yeo. from the 3rd. Australian Light Horse Brigade, at dawn the following morning, as per Operation Orders.

Strength 12 Officers, 237 ORs, 286 Horses, 10 Mules, inclusive of "D" Sqdn. already in outpost line acting as Div. Cavalry for 53rd. Division near EL NAGILI. Stood to arms and day outposts moved out by 0300 and occupied the line without opposition. One Regt. of 3rd. A. L. H. Bde. carried out reconnaissance towards BIR-EL-ESANI. Usual enemy post of about 1 troop on HILL 630 EL GIRHEIR and about 5 troops on the EL BUGGAR ridge during the day.

Enemy harvesting party of 20 to 30 Bedouins were working W of the WADI IMLEIH near .140 and another of 40 or 50 at EL MAGAM. These parties were dispersed by long range machine gun fire: good observation being obtained at from 2900 to 3300 yds. 6 Turkish deserters from TEL-EL-SHARIA were brought in. From 1700 to 1930 60 enemy cavalry and camelmen were observed between .630 and IFTEIS. The majority of these appeared to move towards BIR GIRHEIR, but no attempt was made to follow up the withdrawl of our outposts.

The enemy ranged with artillery of large & small calibre along the WADI IMLEIH during the day. Owing to the moon being full all lights were extinguished at 2000 as protection against hostile aircraft.

Day outposts moved out to take over the line at 0300. Only usual enemy posts and patrols on EL GIRHEIR and EL BUGGAR were visible. Harvesting party of 50 camels and natives near EL GIRHEIR and another of 20 camels & 15 donkeys near

FARA EAST	3rd.J	WLy 19	17. Pt. 410 were dispersed by machine gun and Hotchkiss Rifle fire, range 2600 yds; at which range good observation and close grouping was obtained. The Post on EL GIRHEIR was increased in the evening to about the same strength as the previous day. Two heavy armoured cars were sent out to Post at Pt 510 to engage the enemy if they attempted to follow up the outposts, but no activity was shown on their part. Owing to night operations the Regt. took over the night outpost duty, the remainder of the Brigade proceeding on a special mission to KHALASA. Lt. Col. A. J. Palmer D. S. O. returned from sick leave. Lt. R. G. Anderson with a draft of 38 ORs arrived (only 3 of these were old 1st. Line men), and were posted as follows: - Lt. Anderson & 13 ORs to A Sqdn; 12 ORs. to B Sqdn_ and 13 to D Sqdn. Lieut. A. M. McGrigor sailed for leave to England.

Only the post on TWO TREE HILL found today, consisting of one troop and two machine guns owing to the 1st.A.L.H.Bde. operating on the line Pt.510 - EL GIRHEIR - Pt.730 with the 3rd. & 4th.A.L.H.Bdes. prolonging the line towards BEERSHEBA to cover a reconnaissance by the Corps Commander. During the morning only the usual working and foraging parties near Pt 410 were visible and these were dispersed by M.G. & H.A.R. fire. range 2000 yds. One Batt. enemy Infantry was observed at 1745 marching along GAZA-SABA ROAD past Pt.540 towards IRGEIG and about two Coys. going in the opposite direction at the same time. R. G. H. OPERATION OF DER NO. 2. OUTPOST ORDERS.

1. INFORMATION. Enemy by day holds the line KH, KHASIF - EL GIRHEIR - WADI IMLEIH. By night has posts along the WADI IMLEIH and at EL BUGGAR.

2. INTENTION.

The Brigade will take over the Outpost duties from the 4th A. L. H. Bde. and D. L. O. Y. 1.7.17. The Worcester Yeo, will be responsible for the line by night up to and including 3/4th and also assume day duties by dawn 4th inst. TheR.G.H.will be responsible for line by day up to 3rd inclusive and take up night duties from 4th inclusive. In the event of attack the Bde, will concentrate as far as possible on the line IM SIRI - EL PUGGAR and operate against the enemy's flank.

3. DISPOSITIONS.

Posts. By day No 1 - GOZ MARRUCK 1 troop (found by Warwick Yeo.)

2 - GOZ EL BASAL 1 troop.

3 - On 500 Contour Line 2 miles S. of Pt 510 1 troop.

4 - Pt. 510 ABU SHAWISH with post on ruins 300 yds N. of it.

5 - TWO TREE HILL, 1 troop.

Outpost H.Q. and 2 troops plus 2 sections of M.G. near GOZ EL GELETB. This line will be withdrawn at discretion of O. C. Outposts at dusk. Touch will be maintained with D. Sqdn. post at Pt. 30G, N. E. of EL NAGILI. By night - 6 Standing Patrols (strength 1 NCO and 6 men) will be placed about 1 mile E of the barbed wire in front of the Infantry line on a front from cross track E of GAMLI to half way between EL DAMATH and EL NAGILI, where track cresses the road. The exact location of these troops will be communicated to Os. C. Infantry. Touch will be kept with D. Sqdn. Post where track crosses road, N of NAGILI (H33b). One Subaltern Officer at No. 3 Post will be i/c the line. In the event of attack by body of enemys troops; patrols will give the alarm and slowly retire behind the barbed wire. The alarm will be given by firing rifles. These patrols will be posted at 1915; and at 0300 will move forward about 1 mile, If "All Clear", a report will be immediately sent to GOZ EL GELEIB and the post remain in observation until the day post pass xnem through them. As soon as No. 3 Post finds GOZ EL GELEIB "All Clear" it will report to Regtl. H.Q. and will report further on receipt of "All Clear" from other Posts.

4. ORDEPS.

D Sqdn. will take over the D. L.O. Y. Sector in accordance with Operation Order No.1 d/30/6/17. The outpost line (less D Sqdn. Sector) will be under the command of Lieut Lord Apsley with troops as detailed for the first 24 hours. For 2nd 24 hours Lieut. E. T. Cripps will be in command. One sqdn. of Worcester Yeo. will report at GOZ EL GELEIB,0800 daily to relieve 1 sqdn.R.G.H. while it is watering.

5. COMMUNICATION. 6. OFF SADDLING

The S.O. will arrange for all communications. IN CAMP ETC. All troops with the exception of 2 Orderlies (by night), will off saddle when in bivouac, but no horses will be off saddled when in the outpost line, either by

day or night. The wRegt, will stand to arms and the xxxxxxxx day posts move out at 0300.

7. LIGHTS.

No lights or smoking will be permitted in the outpost line between 1900 and 0430. In camp all lights to be

out by 2000. Regtl. H.Q. will be at FARA EAST Camp where all reports should be sent. "All Clear" reports will reach Regtl. H.Q. by 0830: 1530 and when night outposts are in position. Intelligence reports will be rendered to Regtl. H.Q. by 0900 and 2100 daily and by all Posts and Patrol Leaders as soon as they return to Camp.

- 9. AMBULANCE 1 Sandcart will be at our Regtl. H.Q.
- 10. PARADE. The Regt. will parade in marching order with two filled nosebags and tomorrows breakfast and mid-day meal on the man at 1700, E. of Camp, facing E.
- The following packs per sqdn. will be taken to FARA EAST CAMP:- Hot chkiss, Rifle and Ammunition, 2 S.A.A., 1 Tool, 1 Dixie, H.Q. and Medical. Only Hot chkiss Rifle Packs will be taken into the outpost line.
- 12. ADVANCE Lieut. & Q.M. F. C. Brain with 1 N. C. O. and 2 men per sqdn and 1 N. C. O. from H.Q. will proceed to new camp at 1630. Transport Limbers leave here 1500.
