During the Month the health of the animals remained good. The feed ration was fair till 25th when the Division started on the March to the Rhine.

Before starting all the horses in the Division were inspected and any that were ^{not} fit for a long & heavy march, were evacuated through the M.V.S. Only sound animals in good condition being taken on the march, hence the large number of that passed through the M.V.S. Had it not been for this long march before the Division very few horses would have been evacuated. The majority of cases were Debility viz: Horses not in good enough condition to stand the severe hardships of a long march. There were a few kicks & contusions that had to be evacuated owing to there being no time to treat them or rest them after the Division Head started.

The trucking was accomplished without any accidents.

The first part of the march was done by Train. The M.V.S. entrained at "Pont Remy" & detrained at "Bertry". The journey lasted 26 hours
