

## FEBRUARY 1918.

February.

The peninsula and island of RUJM - EL BAHR (114.V.17.b.) no longer exist having
been crossed by a rise in water level. The
greater part of the Eastern coast of the DEAD
SEA is impassable. The mountains of MCAB
fall very steeply into the water, and there are
long stretches of cliff.

2nd.

An officer deserter states that the 600 cavalry which were based on JERICHO left there on the 26th January for MADEBA and KERAK. Five refugees from JERICHO confirm this, and state that they were accompanied by 20 mile mountain guns.

3rd. PALESTINE FRONT.

Distribution of enemy camps.

ORGANISATION.

Railway. Reliably reported that the standard (broad) gauge line is now completed through the TAURUS, and that through trains are now run between HAIDAR PASHA and ALEPPO.

6th. PALESTINE FRONT.

R.F.C. report considerable movement of horses and men was observed on the north bank of the NAHR - EL - FALIK, also many tents and shelters.

B. Summary of Aerial Reconnaissance, during January.

Throughout January traffic on Dead Sea continued. During the last week a certain amount of movement from the HORDAD bridge towards JERICHO observed. Towards end of month a marked decrease ofmotor transport on the roads took place, but there were a large number of motor vehicles at the parks and refilling points near NABLUS and RAMIN (098.D.20) Large increase of camps behind TABSOR Defences. The chief centres of railway activity were at TUL KERAM and MESSUDER station (098.D.35.a)

/ 17th

February.

Slightly increased aerial activity in Eastern Sector by enemy

S.W. of MEDINA on 6th instant 15 Turks killed and 12 captured. Prisoners state that FAKH-REDDIN PASHA G.O.C. HGF left MEDINIA on 6th instant for Syria.

18th. Hostile Artillery.

Unusual activity by night in Eastern
Sector.

19th. A Turkish officer captured on 19th reports no German or Austrial troops in JERICHO.

Agent reports that JEMAL PASHA recently instructed MADERA sheikhs (143Q.16) to provide 500 for patrolling to S. to protect convoys. Western Desert.

A Light Cav. Patrol (No. 3 under Lt.Moore) carried out a 12 day reconnaissance towards KIRRA from DAKHLA. Covered 670 map miles (total nearly 1000) furthest point reached being 300 miles westwards. Heavy sand impeded further progress when near Tropic of Cancer.

20th. Eastern Sector.

At 0715 the enemy was observed retreating in disorder from TALAT ED DUMM (1139 13)
Troops totalling 300-400 Infantry and 40-50 vehicles moving E. to JERICHO and NEBI MUSA.

Mechanical transport seen approaching GHORAMYEH Bridge from both E. and W. and continued movement of all transport towards JORDAN and crossing by road and pontoon bridges.

At 1630 NEBI MUSA was held by enemy with 5 guns and M.G's.

At RUJM EL BAHR the biggest shed and a large boat were on fire. No signs of reinforcements moving down JORDAN valley or on SALT road for 15 m. E. of river.

Reputed that road at KHAN HATHRURAH has been blown up. (113 G.13)

22nd. PALESTINE FRONT.

Eastern Sector.
Inhabitants of JERICHO state that 20003000 Turks with 8 guns crossed the east bank
of the JORDAN between the night of the 20th
and morning of the 21st instant.
