

GENERAL CONDITION OF ANIMALS FOR MONTH OF FEBY.

Condition of the animals of the Division especially the Mules remains good. Debility in its last year sense is non-existent and this in spite of the fact that many of the mules were not clipped till the end of November.

So far the lowered ration has not adversely affected the animals, as the loss is being balanced to some extent by greater care in feeding and the utilisation of salvaged feed such as Turnips.

No ill effects have yet been obsefved from the use of the Metal Plates issued to prevent Picked up nail. OPHTHAEMIA has not occurred to the extent as in the previous month, and apart from OPHTHAEMIA and MANGE there is practically no disease in the Division worth mentioning.

MANGE Appendix The spread of Mange is becoming serious. It is present in a most virulent form and constant work and supervision will be required to eradicate it. The Division has been asked to prohibit the movement of horses from one Unit to another or one Section of a Unit to another and to draw the attention of all ranks to the necessity of explicilty carrying out the directions of the Veterinary Staff. The S.S.O. has been asked to obtain a large supply of quicklime for the purpose of whitewashing all stables in the Division. This has been carried out and the work is progressing satisfactorily. There is no doubt in my mind that with one exception these outbreaks are due to horses being unwittingly placed in contaminated stables. In the Units first attacked viz: The 14th &15th Field Coy. Engnrs. the disease appears to have been got under control as no fresh cases have occurred for some time. Dipping has been carried out in the Division during the month and the 51st Battery, the worst affected Unit in the Division is now undergoing its third dipping. The last lot of remounts obtained in January have been a bad investment for the Division as many had not been clipped in the early winter or autumn. When these animals become attacked by Mange it may be present for some time and spread widely on the body before any sign is apparent and this they act as centres of infection, whereas with the old animals of the Division, which are all clipped the disease is observable almost from the start. Every lays experience convinces me that clipping in the autumn and early winter is an essential of good horsemastership under present conditions. Total evacuations for Mange during the month. /./...
