

The inspection of animals lame, blind, and showing signs of Crimalmia is now being carried out and lists are being prepared. A large number of animals of this Division show signs of having suffered from OPPHALMIA.

A case of EPIZOOTIC LYMPHANGITIS was found amongst these animals on 9th.inst.and was destroyed together with 7 contacts, 14 others died or were destroyed.
