



The horses of this Brigade have fully recovered since leaving Hill 70, showing the water during this time was plentifull and the good effects of the extra 21bs of grain in ration. The 3rd A.L.H. Bde at Bir-Malha, Horses fit and well. The 1st A.L.H. Bde and 6th Mobile Veterinary Section move from Hod Amara Arnussi to Geherat. Ayreshire R.H.A. Battery arrive at Mazar from Bir-el-Abd. New Zealand Mtd Brigade 1st line Camels (Acoy) are overworked and are releived by a section from



l, Arish.	25th 25th 25th 25th 38t	D.H.Q. move to Beach at R1, Arish. 1st A.L.H.Bde one mile East of R1.Arish 3rd A.L.H.Bde at Bir-el-Masaid. and New Zealand Mtd Bde at Bir-el-Masmi. The horses are on Mobile ration(Oats 121bs Bran 31bs) and are looking tucked up and tired but otherwise fit. Capt Geyer returns to duty. A.D.V.S.inspects 3rd A.L.H.Bde horses which were low in condition to commence with ,so show the effects of the recent operations. The horses and Camels have gone through the operations without any great difficulty. Capt L.L.Paterson reports to Cairo for embarkation to England. Capt Rait reports for embarkation to New Zealand. The animal ration has been returned to the full rate and as a result the horses have greatly improved The weather is extremely windy and cold so that the two blankets per horse are very necessary.
