Owing to shipping troubles, the party selected for the American Irrigation Tour was further delayed, and did not sail until the 26th August.

The Denmark Party returned to England after a most instructive tour. Owing to shipping troubles at Copenhagen this party was also delayed - one party returning via Newcastle and the remainder per H.M.S. "Greenwich" on the 30th August, via Portsmouth.

Applications for Early Repatriation and Non-Military Employment shew a considerable falling off, but Discharges and Extended Leave are well up to the average.

Checking and submitting these applications for decision has been continued, and Returns shewing the numbers dealt with under the various headings are attached.

Returns of Personnel on N.M.E. shewing the numbers approved, completed and still engaged are attached.

Arrangements are practically completed for the American Irrigation Party, and it is anticipated that they will embark at Liverpool on the S.S. "Celtic" on the 10th instant.

Checking and submitting applications for decision carried on.

Universities -

Few original 540's have come in, but there are still some applications for extension, and many questions arise in connection with men on N.M.E., also University matters in general, such as Status of Australian graduates and undergraduates in England and on return to Australia, the new Ph. D degree A.C.I. 280, the Imperial Education Committee, and the Universities Bureau of Empire.

Vacation courses continue to be arranged, and men are attending Summer Schools at Oxford, Cambridge, St. Andrews, Bangor and other places. There has been some difficulty in selecting courses appropriate to individual needs, and in arranging them when selected, as Schools are running concurrently in widely distant places, and men often wish to transfer from one to another. These transferences have in some cases been arranged.



Some of the men at these Schools have not been placed under AF.540, the Schools being regarded, for Service reasons as ordinary instruction Schools.

The Committee's pamphlet on the Universities of Australia, written for the Imperial Education Committee, and intended for the information of British Service men wishing to take University courses in Australia, is now going through the press, and should shortly be ready for distribution.

Favourable reports have been received of the successes of these of our students who have already sat for examinations; several have taken degrees, and others have been granted extensions which will give them the necessary residential qualifications for degrees that may be taken later.

The position of Overseas Scholars, whose scholarships extend into 1920, needs further consideration.

#### Technical -

There now remain only 20 applications for N.M.E. held in this Section, 10 representing applications from members of the A.I.F. now arriving from Egypt. Applications from these members are being dealt with on their merits and it is considered that G.I.20 may be extended to meet deserving cases. A few applications have been received from members re-enlisted in Australia for Escort Duty on Transports. These applications are not being considered.

Work now consists of clearing up the various sub-sections. Many queries have arisen in connection with the early arrangements of the sections. Adjustments of these in many cases entails a considerable amount of work.

Applications for extensions have fallen off and very few cases have to be dealt with.

#### Agriculture.-

The tour to Northampton and Cheshire from July 14th to July 26th was most successful and instructive.

The tour to the North of Scotland, which terminated on the 29th inst., was one of the most successful that has been carried out by this Service.

In addition to the men on N. M.E. with Lt. Boydell, a party of 10 O.R.'s from Sutton Veny made a tour of some of the large London Leather Warehouses.

A special 3 months course at the Bangor University and Forest of Dean has been arranged to commence on August 9th for 20 selected men.

The animal husbandry Course at Marcschal College, Aberdeen, terminated on the 14th inst., and some excellent reports have been furnished by students.

As July 31st is the last day for the commencement of N.M.E. (with the exception of a few special cases and men coming from Egypt) there are very few cases to be dealt with.

There are numerous applications for extension, but these are only recommended in very special cases.



Lectures -

Owing to progress of demobilisation civilian lecturers for the Depots are no longer required, and after this week the work will be performed by the A.I.F. lecturers.

Lt. J.H. Vaughan of this Section has been lecturing to British troops in the U.K. on Australia.

General -

The total authorised expenditure for period ending 26.7.19 amounts to £14,412. 9. 8.

Strength - 2 Other Ranks struck off strength during period under review, and 1 Officer and 3 Other ranks taken on.


4. 1.D.3. Non-Military Employment (Industrial).

Applications for N.M.E. have been very few, but there are one or two  
 late-comers who have been kept until now for duty, or have come from Egypt,  
 and there are still some applications for extensions, and some alterations  
 and adjustments of various kinds to be considered. The number of interviews  
 remains considerable. The various Summer Schools are now in progress.  
 It was impossible to conclude the original arrangements for the School at  
 Oxford, but a few of our men are there. The School at Cambridge has been  
 unable to carry out its complete programme. Saltburn can take no more  
 applicants, but room may still be found at Aberdeen. Progress Reports are  
 generally good, and sometimes very satisfactory. We continue to hear of  
 more than the expected results being obtained and of the right work being  
 done. One of the men placed by us is to read a paper at the meeting of the  
 British Association in September. Another has obtained from University  
 College, London, Certificates of Honour in Experimental and in General  
 Psychology, having gained the number of marks in each subject qualifying for  
 a prize. Certificates have been prepared for the students who have been  
 attending the lectures of the Council of Legal Education. Our men could  
 not be admitted to the examinations of this body, but the certificates show  
 what courses each man has attended and it is hoped that they will be of  
 great value to the recipients on their return to Australia. The Law  
 Society (Solicitors) invited our men to sit for its terminal Examination.  
 One of them received high recommendation, and two certificates of distinction  
 for his work in Real Property (89%) and Personal Property (87%). The list

of men who have examinations to come is being carefully checked for the purposes of a final recommendation in these cases. The proposals of the Imperial Education Committee for the foundation of an Imperial Education Bureau are being considered by the British Government. Study discussions have brought a good deal of work on this section, without definite result. Reports from Students in France have been checked and compiled into one document for quickness of reference and sureness of control.

Technical -

There are 25 applications for N.M.E. now held by this Section, representing applications from A.I.F. members arriving from Egypt.

The work of clearing up the Sub-sections is proceeding and is well in hand.

Applications for extensions show a further falling off and only very special cases are being considered.

Agricultural -

There are no tours in progress nor are any more to be arranged.

The Minister of Defence has approved of extension of N.M.E. of 18 Officers and O.R.'s until 22.12.19., to make a special study of the textile trade.

A number of men have arrived from Egypt, and are being placed on stock and stud farms and in Woollen Mills.

Extensions of N.M.E. are only being granted in very exceptional cases.



October, '19. He has asked the Brig-General i/c Administrative Headquarters, A.I.F. if he is prepared to accept the responsibility of the supervision and embarkation of such personnel in the event of leave being granted. He does not estimate there will be more than a hundred such cases. A Roll is being prepared in anticipation of all personnel granted leave expiring after 31.10.19. This roll is by months and shows location and date of expiration.

SUB-BRANCH I.D.I.d.

Returns: Usual Returns have been issued regularly.

Administration by Area Officers: Men on N.M.E. are frequently given instructions by Area Officers to report here on a specified day for cancellation of leave. When they report there is no apparent reason for such action having been taken, and without a recommendation by the Area Officer concerned, it is not possible to immediately take definite action regarding marching out.

Granting of Leave by Area Officers: The difficulties regarding granting of leave by Area Officers after N.M.E. expires, is still causing considerable inconvenience; one case is quoted:-

Lieut. J. INGLIS, 3rd. D.A.C., was on leave according to records here, in Bradford, to 6/8/19. On 22/8/19 his 540. was received from I.D.2. with letter from Area Officer, London, dated 7/8/19 stating that Lieut. Inglis had been granted 14 days leave by the Area Officer, London, pending decision by Director-General of Education re an extension.

By telephone on 22/8/19 it was ascertained that the actual application for extension had not been received by I.D.2.

It is not necessary to draw attention to the irregularity of such a procedure.

Delay in Reporting to Queries: The delay by Area Officers in replying to queries from this Department frequently causes much unnecessary correspondence. Several instances could be quoted of three reminders being sent.



Personnel Reporting back from N.M.E: Sufficient care is not taken by some Area Officers when reporting men A.W.L. Frequently men report here, either at expiration of N.M.E. or for cancellation, and it is discovered they have been shown A.W.L. Often these men deny having ever missed any time at their place of employment, and evidence is not seldom produced, or obtained, proving their regular attendance. When men are instructed to report here for any purpose they should at least be given seven (7) days warning, to enable advice from Area Officer reaching the various Departments. A specified date for reporting here should invariably be given.

D.29 Forms: During the week 1,427 forms in quadruplicate have been dealt with and distributed to I.D. or Headquarters, A.I.F.Depots in U.K. Tidworth, 5.D., and Records.



No.12477 T.H.SMITH, 2nd.A.M.F.Coy.; is a case that came to notice recently. This man was reported on 15/7/19 absent from his place of employment from 8/7/19. His pay was at once stopped. He reported today on completion of his N.M.E. and stated that he was away with the consent of the firm, and that the Inspecting Sgt. only questioned a workman in the yard who did not know Pte. Smith of whom enquiries were made.

No.12250. Dvr. JACKSON, 2nd. B.A.C.: is another case of a man reported by Area Officer as not having commenced at his job; Stating further that the Employer was out, but the information was obtained from his servant. This case is being followed up.

No.6120 L/Cpl. McINTYRE.A. 1st. Bn. This man was on leave from 29/5/19 to 29/8/19 with pay and Subsistence Allowance. On the 1st. instant a communication was received from 5.D. requesting that cancellation be effected of his N.M.E. as McIntyre had already embarked for Australia although his Pay-book is held by 5.D.

Attention is drawn to the fact that considerable confusion can arise by reason of men being embarked for Australia while still being on N.M.E.

To obviate such confusion all men on N.M.E. returning to Australia should obtain a Marching Out State to enable records to be completed.

SUB-BRANCH 1.D.1.a. EARLY REPATRIATION:

Applications: New Applications received: - 15 . This is a decrease of 7 over corresponding period report No.25. Applications received from Director-General - 13. This is a decrease of 16.

Rolls of Approved Applicants: Rolls 113 and 114 have been issued. Total approved applicants - 29. This is an increase of 10 over corresponding period report No.25.

Rolls of Applicants NOT Approved: Roll No.35 has been issued. Total Applicants Not approved - 7. This is an increase of 7.

SUB-BRANCH 1.D.1.b. DISCHARGES:

Summary of work done by this sub-branch during the period under review is attached.

Ruling 27. Might something definite be arrived at regarding the policy concerning this ruling. It has been the practice for this branch to write to all applicants who did not definitely state that they were returning to Australia, and to ask them whether they agreed to take their discharge under the terms of this ruling. Cases now vary so much we are no longer able to do this, as it may be ruled that an applicant who is able to produce evidence that his case is sufficiently deserving may be told that this ruling will not apply whether he be returning to Australia or not. It is suggested that it be left solely to Colonel Durrant to decide whether the ruling shall apply or not, according to the individual merits of the application.

SUB-BRANCH 1.D.1.c. LEAVE ALL REASONS:

Summary of work done by this sub-branch during the period under review is attached. Fresh applications - 12. Approved - 21. Passes Issued - 15. With reference to the outstanding "Approved" cases. A Nominal Roll has been taken to A.I.F.Hqrs. to ascertain what men had sailed to Australia. Steps are being taken at "Records" to find present whereabouts of others.

SUB-BRANCH. 1.D.1.d.

Returns "C" and "D" have been regularly issued. Extra returns for 1.D. The work of this section is still hampered by the fact that A.I.F. Forms 540 are distributed to other branches, and the enormous amount of correspondence which comes forward for action could be dealt with much quicker if 540 papers were readily available.

SUB-BRANCH. 1.D.1.e.

During the week an Officer detailed from Headquarters, A.I.F. Depots reported to this Department with typed Nominal Rolls of men in Groups and Depots awaiting finalization of N.M.E. These were marked up with latest records held and arrangements made for all men whose N.M.E. has been approved to be marched out forthwith. The number of passes issued during week totalled 221. This represents 4 extensions and 117 new cases. The number of 540's held in Sections total 1239 this is a decrease of 163 held during preceding week.


