

W. 10	1st to 31st August 1919.		Owing to shipping troubles, the party selected for the American Irrigation Tour was further delayed, and did not sail until the 26th August. The Denmark Party returned to England after a most instructive tour. Owing to shipping troubles at Copenhagen this party was also delayed - one party returning via Newcastle and the remainder per H.M.S. "Greenwich" on the 30th August, via Portsmouth. Applications for Early Repatriation and Non-Military Employment shew a considerable falling off, but Discharges and Extended Leave are well up to the average.



Vacation courses continue to be arranged, and men are attending Summer Schools at Oxford, Cambridge, St. Andrews, Bangor and other places. There has been some difficulty in selecting courses appropriate to individual needs, and in arranging tham when selected, as Schools are running concurrently arranging tham when selected, as Schools are running concurrently arranging distant places, and men often wish to transfer from one in widdly distant places, and men often wish to transfer from one to another. These transferences have in some cases been arranged.

Some of the men at these Schools have not been placed under AF.540, the Schools being regarded, for Service reasons as ordinary instruction Schools.

The Committee's pamphlet on the Universities of Australia, written for the Imperial Education Committee, and intended for the information of British Service men wishing to take University courses in Australia, is now going through the press, and should shortly be ready for distribution.

Favourable reports have been received of the successes of these of our students who have already sat for examinations; several have taken degrees, and others have been granted extensions which will give them the necessary residential qualifications for degrees that may be taken later.

The position of Overseas Scholars, whose scholarships extend into 1920, needs further consideration.

Technical -

There now remain only 20 applications for N.M.E. held in this Section, 10 representing applications from members of the A.I.F. now arriving from Egypt. Applications from these members are being dealt with on their merits and it is considered that G.I.20 may be extended to meet deserving cases. A few applications have been received from members re-enlisted in Australia for Excort Duty on Transports. These applications are not being considered.

Work now consists of clearing up the various sub-sections.

Many queries have arisen in connection with the early arrangements of the sections. Adjustments of these in many cases entails a considerable amount of work.

Applications for extensions have fallen off and very few cases have to be dealt with.

Agriculture .-

The tour to Northampton and Cheshire from July 14th to July 26th was most successful and instructive.

The tour to the North of Scotland, which terminated on the 29th inst., was one of the most successful that has been carried out by Whis Service.

In addition to the men on N. M.E. with Lt. Boydell, a party of 10 O.R.'s from Sutton Veny made a tour of some of the large London Leather Warehouses.

A special 3 months course at the Bangor University and Forest of Dean has been arranged to commence on August 9th for 40 selected men.

The animal husbandry Course at Marcshal College, Aberdeen, terminated on the 14th inst., and some excellent reports have been furnished by students.

As July 31st is the last day for the commencement of N.M.E. (with the exception of a few special cases and men coming from Egypt) there are very few cases to be dealt with.

There are numerous applications for extension, but these are only recommended in very special cases.

Lectures -

Owing to progress of demobilisation civilian lecturers for the Depots are now longer required, and after this week the work will be performed by the A.I.F. lecturers.

Et. J.H. Vaughan of this Section has been lecturing to British troops in the U.K. on Australia.

Universities -

Applications for N.M.E. have been very few, but there are one or two late-comers who have been kept until now for duty, or have come from Egypt, and there are still some applications for extensions, and some alterations and adjustments of various kinds to be considered. The number of interviews remains considerable. The various Summer Schools are now in progress. It was impossible to conclude the original arrangements for the School at Oxford, but a few of our men are there. The School at Cambridge has been unable to carry out its complete programme. Saltburn can take no more applicants, but room may still be found at Aberdeen. Progress Reports are generally good, and sometimes very satisfactory. We continue to hear of more than the expected results being obtained and of the right work being dome. One of the men placed by us is to read a paper at the meeting of the BBITish Association in September. Another has obtained from University College, London, Certificates of Honour in Experimental and in General Psychology, having gained the number of marks in each subject qualifying for a prize. Certificates have been prepared for the students who have been attending the lectures of the Council of Legal Education. Our men could not be admitted to the examinations of this body, but the certificates show what courses each men has attended and it is hoped that they will be of great value to the recipients on their return to Australia. The Law Society (Solicitors) invited our men to sit for its terminal Examination. One of them received high recommendation, and two certificates of distinction for his work in Real Property (89%) and Personal Property (87%). The list

of men who have examinations to come is being carefully checked for the purposes of a final recommendation in these cases. The proposals of the Imperial Education Committee for the foundation of an Imperial Education Bureau are being considered by the British Government. Study discussions have brought a good deal of work on this section, without definite result. Reports from Students in France have been checked and compiled into one document forq quickness of reference and sureness of control.

Technical -

There are 25 applications for N.M.E. now held by this Section, representing applications from A.I.F. members arriving from Egypt.
