

Sir.

I am commanded by the Army Council to address you on the subject of the Stores and Equipment now available for issue in this Country in replacement of the equipment and other stores handed in to the Imperial stocks in France and Egypt by Australian formations and units.

The question of finding accommodation for stores in this Country is particularly pressing and very heavy expenditure is involved in providing the necessary personnel for looking after such stores. Moreover, the necessity for freeing for trade purposes accommodation now occupied as Military Storehouses is very urgent. Consequently it is imperative that all stores which are not required for the future maintenance and War Reserves of the Army should be disposed of by sale or otherwise, without delay.

as you are aware, the general position is that, as a result of the capitation rate arrangement, your Government became entitled on demobilization to demand from Imperial stocks without charge the stores and equipment for a certain number of units and formations in a serviceable condition. It has always been understood that your demands would not correspond exactly with the stores to which you are thus entitled, but that your Government would formulate their demands according to your post-war requirements, and that the Council would, subject to any necessary financial adjustment, do their best to meet those demands.

No complete programme of the equipment which you require has, however, yet been formulated, though in the case of certain stores, demands have been made.

The Council are therefore most anxious to attain a clear understanding with your Government on the following points:-

- (1) The exact list of formations and units the equipment of which you are entitled to draw under the capitation rate agreement;
- (2) A full list of the equipment and stores which you wish the Imperial Government to supply.
- (3) The ports to which this equipment should be delivered and how it should be consigned.

I am to point out that, if no demands are received from you, the Council may be forced to dispose of certain classes of stores as surplus to Imperial requirements; in such a case the credit to be allowed to your Government would necessarily be limited to the value of that class of stores at disposal rates. It is thus important to you, for financial reasons, that your demands should be formulated at the earliest possible moment.

with the object of reaching finality on this urgent question, I am to request you to appoint a representative to attend a Conference at this Office (Room 249) on Monday next October 13th at eleven o'clock, but the Council trust that you will inform them of your full demands in all classes of stores in anticipation, if possible, of the Conference.

with reference to the Conference held at the War Office on the 13th inst. at which representatives of the Dominions were present, the Chairman (Gen Elliston) pointed out the advisability of having responsible Officers attached to Imperial Issuing Depots for the purpose of taking over all Stores packed and ready for shipment.

that the G.O.C., A.I.F., has approved of the above proposal, but that it is understood the Stores will be placed on Rail or Lighter by the Depots concerned, and that threafter the responsibility for safe custody would rest with the Dominions.

acquittance will not be given until the Stores have been landed in Australia, and checked in detail, and that the Officers detailed for the above duty will have no authority to sign any documents other that Way Bills, Carriers Notes and Receipts for the number of packages placed on transport.

It is intended that the duties of these Officers will be to keep Records of:-

- (a) Number of packages dispatched.
- (b) Package markings etc.
- (c) Truck Number etc.

#### (d) Dates of Despatch.

The receipted Vouchers will be returned by Consignees in due course and discrepancies of any importance obviously due to incorrect packing will be taken up by Discrepancy Reports in the usual manner.

#### 12.10.19 to 18.10.19

Normal routine work has mainly engaged the attention of this Branch during the past week.

On 13.10.19 the Director attended a Conference at the War Office convened for the purpose of ascertaining the requirements of the various Dominions in Stores and Equipment, and when delivery of such would be taken. . Copy of proceedings, (which have been submitted to the Commandant, A.I.F. Headquarters) is attached.

At the above Conference, the Chairman-(General Elliston)pointed out the advisability of having responsible Dominion Office: attached to Imperial Issuing Depots for the purpose of taking over all Stores packed and ready for shipment. The approval of the G.O.C., A.I.F., having been obtained to this proposal, the Secretary, War Office, was informed addordingly, and a letter recommending the appointment of another officer (in addition to the three already appointed) and six Other Ranks, was addressed to the Commandant, A.I.F. Headquarters. The Commandant's approval to the above was obtained on 18.10.19.

Report re Conference held at War Office 13.10.19. The Conference took place under the Chairmanship of General Elliston and included representatives from the War Office and each of the self governing Dominions, Australia's representatives being Colonel T.J. Thomas, Chief Paymarter, and Major C. Speckman, M.C., Director 4.D. It was intimated by the Chairman that extreme pressure was being brought upon the War Office to dispose of its surplus stores and Equipment, and that the chief object of the Conference was to ascertain :-The requirements of the Dominions in this regard. (a) (b) When delivery would be taken. In regard to (a) the Conference was informed that the known requirements for Australia were the full Equipment for five Dismounted and Two Mounted Divisions, less certain sections which were tentatively withheld, and that delivery would be taken as soon as shipping was available. It was further informed that no information was available regarding Lines of Communication Units and Corps Troops, but that cabled advice would be immediately sought. (Note - this has been done.) In relation to Divisional Equipment which has tentatively not been demanded, the Conference was informed that the reason for not demanding same was that a proposal to manufacture locally was at present under the consideration of the Australian authorities who would not be in apposition to arrive at a decision until it was known what credit would be given to Australia by the War Office for items short-drawn. To enable this to be decided, it was agreed that there should be furnished to the War Office. List of Units for which Australia is entitled to draw Equipment or obtain credit in lieu. List of Units for which Equipment will be demanded. (This is to be sumbitted as soon as obtainable.) (c) List of items which it is proposed to short-draw. (d) List of items (approximate) which it is proposed to over-draw. (Lists (a), (b) and (d) are in course of preparation.) 3. It was decided that Dominions would take delivery at Depots at which the Stores and Equipment are held, and that there-after the responsibility for safe custody would lie with the Dominions. The Imperial Authorities will pack and place Equipment on Rail, and Dominions tomake all arrangements for transport other than from Depot to Rail. 4. The presence of Inspectors to superintend packing and take delivery was asked for by the War Office. This was agreed to . (Sgd) C, Speckman. Major. 15.10.19. Director, 4. D.
