

In connection with the Issue of Mobilisation Stores for shipment to Australia, it is understood that in some cases new articles of horse furniture have been packed with part worn articles in packages marked with a yellow band. As this special marking is an indication that the contents of the package must be subjected to treatment by the Quarantine Department in Australia, I shall be glad if you will be good enough to ensure that in future new and part worn articles be marked separately, and that cases containing the latter only be marked with the yellow band.

I would take this opportunity to remind you that all stuffed articles of harness and saddlery, including "Funnah pannels", "neck straps and "Packsaddlery pannels" should be new, otherwise they will not be admitted into Australia unless subjected to the treatment laid down by the Department of Quatantine which would probably render such articles unserviceable.

It would greatly assist this Department if, where part worn horse furniture is issued, the letters "p.w." were added to the designation of the items concerned when Issue Vouchers are being prepared.

With reference to the fortnightly Report, vide your Headquarters Circular dated 11th inst., I beg to submit the following.

1. ACTIVITIES.

The activities of this Branch during the past few weeks have been mainly confined to matters of a routine nature, the whole of our Demands for 5 Infantry and 2 Cavalry Divisions having now been submitted to the Royal Army Ordnance Department.

The Staff of this Department are employed as under:-

- (a) Headquarters.
2 Officers, 7 Other Ranks and 3 Lady Typists.
- (b) Depot Staff and Liaison 2.D.
6 Officers, 18 Other Ranks.

The duties of the personnel employed under Sub para (a) are:-

- (i) Receipt, checking and marking up of Office Copies of Intermediate Demands from approved copies supplied by Imperial Issuing Depots.
- (ii) Receipt, checking and marking up of Intermediate Demands and records from Issue Vouchers supplied by Depots.
- (iii) Liaison between 2.D. and 4.D. handing over copies of Issue Vouchers etc to 2.D. for necessary action to be taken for shipping arrangements.
- (iv) Compilation of Schedules etc covering Stores shipped by 2.D. for despatch to Australia.

(v) General correspondence dealing with alteration in Mark and Pattern of Stores as supplied by War Office and Issuing Depots, also outstanding matters concerning financial adjustment between A.I.F. and Imperial Authorities

The duties of those employed under sub para (b) are-

(i) Preparation of Lists shewing Stores, package Numbers and marking of Equipment to be shipped.

(ii) Taking over, checking and Railing of Stores from Imperial Issuing Depots.

The Staff under sub para (b) have been specially asked for by the War Office, who insist upon a clear acquittance being given at time of taking over. (This course was agreed to after an assurance had been obtained from the War Office that Discrepancy Reports for any obvious instances of incorrect packing, disclosed on detailed check of the stores at final destination, would receive consideration in the usual manner.)

2.

PROGRESS OF FINALISATION.

The only outstanding matters of importance yet to be settled are-

(i) Preparation of Demands for 60-pdr. and 6-inch Howitzer Equipment. This matter cannot be proceeded with until a reply has been received from the War Office as to the amount standing to our credit for those Units which were handed in in France, and which it is not desired to re-equip. A detailed Statement was submitted to the War Office in December last, but up to date no favourable reply has been received.

(ii) Question as to whether we are entitled to a Free Issue of S.A.A., 18-pdr and 4.5-inch Howitzer

Gun Ammunition. This matter has been repeatedly referred to the War Office, but no reply has been received to date.

(iii) Numerous communications have been despatched to the War Office on the subject of a Free Issue of Steel Helmets. These helmets have been demanded for all Units of the Post Bellum Army, but the question of payment is still in abeyance.

SHIPMENT OF STORES.

The bulk of the Stores for 2nd. and 3rd. Military Districts have now been reported as being available for issue at the Issuing Depots, and up to date practically the whole of the Equipment for 2nd. Military District has been taken over and shipped.

18-pdr. Gun EQUIPMENT (Mark IV.)

Under instructions issued by General Birdwood, and the Minister for Defence, half of our Artillery Units are to be equipped with the latest Mark of 18-pdr Gun, and although Demands for these Equipments have been submitted, it is not anticipated that they will be available for issue before the end of this year. Defence Department are already aware of this arrangement, and fresh contracts are being opened up by the War Office, so as to be in a position to fulfil our Demands.
