

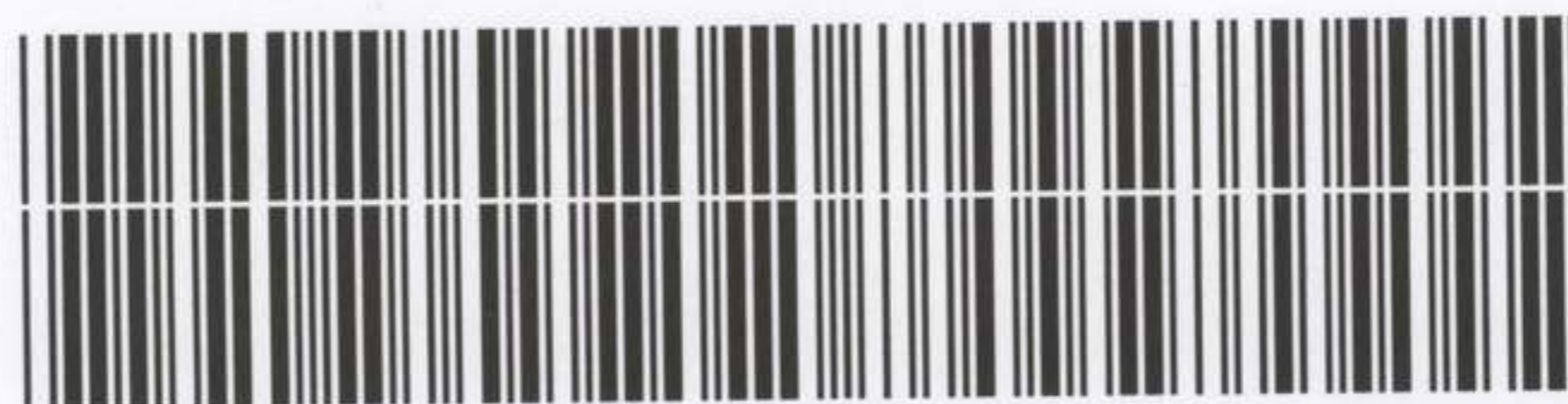

	1 st		The Bde was relieved from HILL 60 Sector YPRES area at 2120. The enemy fired 3 77 mm shells at Ypres town which caused 8 casualties. 100 shells killed 70 Poles wounded. The relief was carried out without a casualty.	
	2 nd		The Bde was taken by train from YPRES to BRANDHOEK. Thence by march to Hutment Camp.	
	3 rd		Arrived at Camp about 0230. The day was spent in churning up. a draft of 42 reinforcements joined the Bde a number of the men being members of the 43 rd Bde.
