19. POSTAL CENSORSHIP.

Regimental censorship of letters will be discontinued forthwith. Correspondence will still be liable to examination at the Base and all ranks are reminded that the censorship orders are still in force, except as regards those orders cancelled by G.R.D. 5682.

If the examination at the Base shows that breaches of the Censorship Orders are common in any units, it will be necessary to re-impose regimental censorship on those units.

2. All letters and postcards must bear a censor stamp, except those posted in accordance with the latter portion of Censorship Orders para 30.

3. All letters and postcards will bear in the left hand bottom corner of the address side the name and rank, if any, of the writer. They will be handed closed to the officer in charge of the censor stamp and will not be opened by him except for the purpose of identifying writers who have failed to comply with this order.

4. The issue of Green Envelopes will be discontinued forthwith.

5. Regimental censorship of parcels and telegrams will be maintained as heretofore.

6. For the purpose of interpreting "Censorship Orders for Troops in the Field" the term "franking" will be taken to mean the endorsement of the name and rank of the writer, as indicated above, except as regards parcels.

STANDING ORDERS (PROVISIONAL).

1. APPLICATION.

These Orders apply to all Troops coming under the administration of the Commandant.

2. HOURS OF WORK.

Hours of work and Parade hours will be published from time to time.

3. ROUTINE.

4. SICK PARADE.

Sick Parades will be held at School Hospital at 0730 and 1730 daily. The sick will parade under a N.C.O. from each Divl. Wing, who will have sick reports prepared and hand same to Medical Officer. Officers sick will be notified to the M.O. by School Commanders, on a sick report form.

5. ROUTINE ORDERS.

Routine Orders are published daily and circulated to all concerned.

6. DISCIPLINE.

- (a) Troops are not to cross ground which is wired off.
- (b) No explosives are to be thrown, or rifle or revolver shooting to be done, unless authorised by an Officer of the School Staff. Detonators, Bombs or any live ammunition or other explosives must NOT be kept in huts. ALL explosives found in the School Area must be sent to the School Orderly Room immediately.
- (c) It is forbidden to kick footballs about within the lines.
- (d) Gambling is forbidden. Bridge may be played for points not exceeding 1 franc per 100.
- (e) Shooting at, or otherwise catching or killing game is strictly forbidden.
- (f) The School Camp is "Out of Bounds" to all civilians, except with the authority of the Commandant. All ranks are asked to assist in enforcing this Order.
- (g) Electric light installation must not be interfered with.
- (h) The strictest attention must be paid to saluting by all ranks at all times.
- (i) Tipping is not permitted.

7. BOUNDS.

The following are out of bounds to troops, except when they are strictly on duty :-

- All Cookhouses.
- All Officers' Messes and Quarters.
- All Magazines, Stores and Store Rooms.
- Q.M. Store.
- Carpenters Shop. Engineer Yard.
- Dining Rooms and Recreation Rooms after 2130.
- All Offices.
- Medical Inspection Rooms.
- Lecture Halls.
- Stables.
- Theatre (except for concert practice).
- Electric Lighting Engine room.
- The landing grounds of the French Aerodromes.
- All the Dykes along the Coast.

8. LEAVE.

- (a) No man may leave Camp in working hours, without permission from School Headquarters.
- (b) Outside working hours, the local villages (including Le GROTOY) are in bounds, (no pass being necessary).
- (c) For RUE and other places outside 3 miles radius from the School a pass signed by the Adjutant is required. RUE must be cleared by 2100.
- (d) Leave Pass forms are obtainable at Orderly Room. Passes must be filled in and handed in to the Orderly Room for the Adjutant's signature at 1800 the night previous to the day of leave.
- (e) Leave to the United Kingdom is granted on allotment from Corps in the order of the School Roster.
- (f) All passes must be returned to School Orderly Room on completion of leave.

9. QUARTERS. Beds

- (a) Huts, , kits, kitchens and all surroundings in the Student Officers and Staff Lines are to be ready for inspection by 1000. In all other lines by 0900.
- (b) Kits and beds are to be made in School pattern and the Camp is to be clean in every detail.
- (c) This tidiness is to be maintained up to 1245. Cleanliness and Sanitation at all times.
- (d) Rifles are to be placed only in the racks provided.
- (e) The senior N.C.O. or man in each hut will be appointed Hut Commander.

10. DRESS.

- (a) Australian HATS are to be worn on parade with brim turned up. Other Ranks must not wear caps at any time. Puggarees will not be worn.
- (b) "Parade Dress" will mean Rifle, side arms, Belt and Pouches (or bandolier).
- (c) Instructors and Assistant Instructors will wear belts on parade.
- (d) Trousers are not to be worn on parades or on duty, or when walking out of the School Area. Mounted Officers and men only may wear puttees reversed.
- (e) Gum boots are forbidden on parade.
- (f) When walking out, Officers are to wear belt and carry a cane.
- (g) N.C.O.s of the rank of Sergeant and above are to wear belt and side arms.
Other Ranks are to wear belt.

11. MESSSES.

Mess Rules are to be posted in messes. These are standard and issued by the Commandant.

12. CANTEENS.

- (a) All goods must be paid for cash down.

- (c) A price list signed by the Commandant will be posted to the Canteen, and the prices set out therein will be strictly adhered to.

- (b) They are responsible for the upkeep and cleanliness of their respective huts and appliances.
- (c) They will keep daybooks, showing daily takings.
- (d) Receipts will be issued by them for all payments.
- (e) A gratuity not exceeding 10% of gross takings may be handed to them at the end of each month.

14. BATHS.

Allotments will be notified from time to time. Underclothing will be changed at the Baths when it is available.

15. BATMEN.

All Batmen are available for duty as detailed by the Adjutant.

16. FIRE.

Orders in case of Fire are to be posted in all Huts.

17. OFFICIAL TIME.

To be checked daily at 2000 hours from Orderly Room Clock.

18. POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS.

Letters are to be address^{ed} as "AUSTRALIAN Corps Central School, FRANCE" and the name of Unit to be put in brackets. All letters for post will be collected from Post boxes at 1400 daily, censored by the appointed Officers on the same evening and despatched on the following morning.

Letters are NOT to be posted in Civilian Post Offices.

19. PAY.

Pay is issued fortnightly.

20. CAMP STORES.

When any Camp Stores are broken or damaged the fact must be reported to the Quartermaster, so that the article may be replaced or repaired.

Stores will not be moved from one part of the Camp to another without the authority of the Quartermaster.

Ablution Basins will not be removed.

21. ISSUE OF UNIFORM.

The hours for the issue of clothing are as follows :-
 Saturdays and
 DAILY (Sundays excepted) 1700 - 1900.

Issues will not be made at any other hours. The old article must ALWAYS be returned on the day new issue is made.

22. AUDIT OF ACCOUNTS.

The following Board of Auditors are constituted :-

- (1) Permanent Board of 2 Officer Instructors responsible for :-
 - (a) the continuous monthly audit of the A/Cs of -
 - (i) The Canteen.
 - (ii) Permanent Staff Messes.
 - (iii) Tailor, and Hairdresser Establishments.

- (2) The above Board plus 2 Student Officers appointed at beginning of each Course, responsible for a monthly Audit of all Accounts of Student Officer and N.C.O Messes.

The permanent Board is responsible for submitting a combined "Monthly Report of Schools Audit" to the Commandant by the 3rd day of each month. The Boards of Audit shall have access to the Books of all Messes and Canteen at all times.

23. WOOD-CUTTING.

No trees or bushes are to be cut in the Schools Area without the express direction of the Engineer Officer.

24. DYKES.

The greatest care must be taken to prevent damage to the Dykes between the Camp and the Sea. Any damage may help towards causing floods during the winter.

25. DUTIES.

The following duties will be detailed in each Division :-

- Orderly Captain of the week.
- Orderly Subaltern of the Week.
- Orderly Sergeant of the Week.
- Orderly Corporal of the Week.

The duties of the Orderly Captain will be :-

- (1) He is responsible to the Commandant for :-
 - (a) The general discipline of his Division.
 - (b) The issue to his Division of all orders and instructions from School H.Q.
 - (c) The punctual attendance of his Division on parade and at work.
 - (d) The state of the Messes and living quarters.
 - (e) Tattoo Roll call.
 - (2) Such other duties as may be notified.
- The Orderly Subaltern, Sergeant and Corporal will be under the orders of the Orderly Captain.

The following duties are laid down for the Adjutant, Quartermaster, Engineer Officer and Messing and Finance Officer :-

THE ADJUTANT.

- (1) He is responsible to the Commandant for the School Records, correspondence, Routine Orders, Leave and Duty Rosters and all the general office work of the School.
- (2) He will ensure that Standing Orders are kept up-to-date and are brought to the notice of all concerned from time to time.
- (3) He is responsible for the general discipline of the School and must bring all irregularities to the notice of the Commandant.

DUTIES OF THE ADJUTANT (continued).

- (4) He is responsible that the daily routine laid down in Orders is properly and punctually adhered to.
- (5) He is responsible for all ammunition and explosives.

THE QUARTERMASTER.

- (1) The Quartermaster is responsible for all Hutments, Tents and other quarters, and for the allotment of them to Officers and
- (2) He is responsible for rations, forage, clothing and all other stores except Engineer Stores, Ammunition and explosives.
- (3) He is responsible that rations are always of sufficient quantity, and must immediately report any inferiority of quality to the Commandant.
- (4) He is responsible for all mechanical and horse transport and no transport may be used without his authority, except that the Adjutant may detail the Officers chargers for duty.
- (5) He will keep the Baths in good working condition.
- (6) He will inspect the Camp in company with the Medical Officer each day and report any irregularity, in writing, to the Commandant.

THE ENGINEER OFFICER.

- (1) The Engineer Officer is responsible to the Commandant for all Engineer Stores.
- (2) He is responsible for all constructional work at the School.
- (3) No trees or timber of any kind in the vicinity of the School are to be cut down without his authority.
- (4) He is responsible for the precautions for fire prevention laid down in School Fire Orders, namely :-
 - (a) The siting of all stoves, fireplaces, stovepiping, etc.
 - (b) That all wood-work within 3 feet of above is properly protected.
 - (c) That stoves set on wooden floors are set on raised frames to permit of at least one inch air space between iron sheathing and floor.
- (5) He is responsible for the maintenance of an adequate water supply.
- (6) He will be in charge of all pumping plant, lighting sets and other machinery.

FINANCE AND MESSING OFFICER.

(A). MESSING.

- (1) Take charge of all Messing in School, i.e.,
 - Staff Officers' Mess.
 - Student Officers' Mess.
 - Staff Instructors' Mess.
 - Student Other Ranks Mess.
 - General Duty Block Mess.
- (2) See that "Weekly Diet Sheets" are prepared and kept up to date.
- (3) See that all food is properly prepared, cooked and served.
- (4) To be responsible to Q.M. for cleanliness of Messes, Mess crockery, Cookhouses and cooking utensils and report in writing all losses or breakages occurring in same.
- (5) Ensure that all water is chlorinated as required by the M.O.

25. DUTIES. (continued).(B) FINANCE.

- (1) Is responsible to Commandant for conduct of all business of School's Canteen and Regimental Trust Account.
- (2) Collect and enter all monies into Regimental Trust Account. Credit all cash taken by Regimental Institutes.
- (3) Is responsible that all necessary returns are duly rendered to A.I.F. Headquarters, United Kingdom, vide A.I.F. Orders.
- (4) Will allocate according to means at disposal goods to supplement Messes for General Duties from Regimental Funds.
- (5) Will conduct Mess Committee of Student Other Rank Messes and advise as to purchases to be made with monies collected as determined by such Committee.

AUSTRALIAN CORPS CENTRAL SCHOOL.ORDERS FOR PARADE.

When "MARKERS" is sounded, the Students will assemble by Divisions on the edge of the Parade Ground.

The Orderly Sergeant of each Division will report to the R.S.M. as marker. The Parade will fall in on the Parade Ground in close column of Platoons (Divisions) at 7 paces interval.

Officer Instructors will move about smartly 10 yards clear of the Right flank until given the command to "Take Post".

Divisional Orderly Officers will move with Officer Instructors until the Parade is handed over by the R.S.M. to the Adjutant, when they will take up a position 10 yards to the flank of their Divisions, in line with the front rank facing their Platoons, and stand at ease.

When "ON PARADE" is given by the R.S.M., the Students will move on to the Parade Ground, in quick time, with sloped arms, and take up their position in their Divisions. They will then order arms correctly, take up their dressing by the right, then stand at ease and stand easy. There is to be no talking after the command "ON PARADE".

Divisions will fall in in two ranks, two paces between ranks, P.T. Instructors acting as Platoon Sergeants will be 2 paces in rear of the centre of the rear rank of their Platoons. W.O. and Sgt. Instructors in line with the Platoon Sergeants, dividing the frontage of the platoon equally between them.

PARADE FALLING IN.

On the command "PARADE" from the R.S.M., the Parade will stand properly at ease.

On the command "FALL IN" from the R.S.M., the Orderly Sergeant of each Platoon will spring to Attention, take one and a half paces forward in quick time and turn to their right. The guides will then be dressed by the R.S.M., who gives "MARKERS STEADY", upon which the guides will turn to their front.

RIGHT DRESS.

The R.S.M. will then give "RIGHT DRESS", upon which the remainder of the Parade will spring to attention, take a short sharp pace forward, count a pause equal to two paces of quick time and then turn their head and eyes sharply to the right, count another pause equal to two paces of quick time, then take up their dressing with short, quick steps. The right guides looking straight to their front.

After taking the pace forward, the Platoon Sgts. will turn to their right and move smartly to the right of the front rank of their platoons, halt, turn about, and take 2 paces of 30 inches to the rear and see that the right hand man of their rear rank is at the correct distance, they will then turn to the left and move out 5 paces from the inner flank of their platoons, halt, turn about and dress by their right and then dress the front rank. They will then turn to the left, take 2 paces to the rear, halt, turn to the right and dress the rear rank of their Platoons. They will then turn to the right, take 2 paces forward, halt and turn to the left.

- 2 -

As soon as No 1 Platoon Sergeant sees that all the other Platoon Sergeants are in their places, he will give "No 1 PLATOON, EYES FRONT" and the Platoon Sergeant of No 2 Platoon will give "No 2 . EYES FRONT". Platoon Sergeant of the rear Platoon will give "No PLATOON, EYES FRONT".

On the last giving "EYES FRONT", the whole of the Platoon Sergeants will move off together to the rear of the centre of their Divisions, halt, turn to their right, order arms and take up their dressing by the right.

STAND AT EASE.
CALL THE ROLL.

The R.S.L. then gives :-

"PARADE, STAND AT-EASE, STAND EASY.
"CALL THE - ROLL".

On the last sound of the word "ROLL", the Orderly Sergeant will spring to attention, slope arms and move in quick time to 3 paces in front of the centre of the Platoon and call the roll, the Students answering by replying "HERE".

The Orderly Sergeant will then move off in quick time to a position 10 paces in front of the centre of the Parade, moving by the left flank to report to the R.S.L. On arrival there he will halt and turn to his front, order arms, and stand at ease.

When the Orderly Sergeants are all present, the R.S.L. will give :-

"PLATOON SERGEANTS - ATTENTION".
"ARE YOU PRESENT No 1 PLATOON".

and after the Platoon Sergeant has replied,

"No 2" and so on.

The Platoon Sergeants will reply "PRESENT" (or one absent, or two absent, as the case may be) "SIR".

The R.S.L. will then give :-

"SLOPE ARMS"
"LEFT TURN"
"JOIN YOUR PLATOONS, DOUBLE MARCH".

They will double round the outer flanks to the Right of their Platoons, halt, turn to their front, order arms, take up their dressing by the left, and stand at ease.

The R.S.M. then gives - "PARADE - ATTENTION", hands over the Parade to the Adjutant and reports "PARADE PRESENT SIR" (or according to reports).

The Adjutant then gives - "ORDERLY OFFICERS - TAKE POST", upon which the Orderly Officers will take a pace forward, turn to the front salute and fall in, 2 paces in front of the centre of their Platoons.

TELL OFF.

The Adjutant then gives :-

"PARADE, STAND AT - EASE"
"TELL - OFF".

upon which the Platoon Sgts. will spring to attention, slope arms, turn to their left and move off in quick time by the outer flank to the front of their Platoons, halt 2 paces in front of their Orderly Officer and salute, report "PLATOON ALL PRESENT (or otherwise) SIR", then take post 2 paces on their Orderly Officer's right, facing the Platoon.

The Orderly Officer will then turn about and the Platoon Sergeant will prepare his Platoon for inspection, giving :-

INSPECTION.

"ATTENTION"

"PLATOON WILL FIX BAYONETS, FIX - BAYONETS"
"REAR RANK, ONE PACE STEP BACK - MARCH"
"REAR RANK - RIGHT DRESS".

The Platoon Sgt. of each Platoon will measure 3 paces (heel to heel) and see that the right hand man of the rear rank is at correct distance and after dressing the rear rank from his right hand man to the right hand man of the next Platoon, gives :- "REAR RANK, EYES FRONT".

The inspection will be carried out by the Orderly Officer accompanied by the Platoon Sgt. and Orderly Sgt carrying note-book and pencil. After the inspection has been completed the Platoon Sgt will move out in quick time to the same place as before in front of their Platoons and give:

"PLATOON WILL UNFIX BAYONETS, UNFIX - BAYONETS"

and when completed :-

INSPECTION OF ARMS.

"FOR INSPECTION, PORT - ARMS".

On the command "FOR INSPECTION, PORT - ARMS" all will push forward safety catch and raise the knob of the bolt, but will not withdraw it. They will then watch the Platoon Sgt. The Platoon Sgt, on seeing that all are ready will turn his head smartly towards the right flank. This will be the signal for the whole platoon to withdraw their bolts simultaneously. They will then pause for 1 second, then bring the right hand smartly to the butt clear of the bolt, fingers pointing downwards, thumb pointing towards the muzzle.

Each Student, when the Inspecting Officer has passed the file next to him, will, without word of command, ease springs, order arms, and stand at ease.

The Platoon Sgta will then give, from the same position as before :-

"No.... PLATOON - ATTENTION"
"CLOSE RANKS - MARCH"
"REAR RANK, RIGHT - DRESS"

The Platoon Sergeant dressing and giving :-

"REAR RANK, EYES - FRONT"

The Platoon Sergeant will then prove his Platoon by giving :-

"No.....PLATOON, BY SECTIONS - NUMBER"
"FORM - FOURS"
"FORM TWO - DEEP"
"PLATOON WILL RETIRE, ABOUT - TURN"
"FORM - FOURS"
"PLATOON WILL ADVANCE, ABOUT - TURN"
"PLATOON, RIGHT - DRESS".

The Platoon Sergeant dressing both ranks and giving :-

"No PLATOON, EYES - FRONT"

He will then salute his Platoon Commander and take post 2 paces in rear of the centre of his Platoon, in quick time, moving by the left flank of his Platoon.

The Platoon Commander will give :-

"No PLATOON, STAND AT - EASE".

The Adjutant then gives :-

"PARADE - ATTENTION"
"SLOPE - ARMS"

The Officer Instructors will then take up their positions 10 yards to the flank of the front rank of their Platoons, facing inwards, and stand at ease.

The Adjutant will then hand over the Parade to the Senior Officer present, who will give :-

"INSTRUCTORS TAKE POST"

upon which the Officer Instructors will spring to Attention, take a pace forward, pause, turn to their front, pause and salute.
