





REPORT ON OCCURRENCES DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL -

Owing to the Military situation the General Routine of the School was considerably interrupted.

No students being available the nucleus instructional Staff were instructed in a Course of Technical weapons.

The Xth.Corps School moved in on the 11/4/18 and were accomm-odated with the whole of its Staff & most of its Equipment, and, while
awaiting developments, the Officer instructors of both Schools acting in
liaison recommendated the country E. of the School & reported on the state
of existing Defences & sited new Defence Lines & Strong Points.

On the 12/4/18 the Commandant decided to have the personnel of the two Schools formed into a Composite Company and by 2.p.m. this was effected and their training was commenced. The Company consisted of 4 Platoons of 55 men each most of whom were Class "B" men, the balance being made up of all available N.C.O. Instructors and some 52 N.C.O's from 39th. Division who had been undergoing a "Gas" refresher Course.

At 4.15 p.m. the same day Orders were received that this Company should march out at 5.p.m. and, owing to the arrangements that had already been made in anticipation, the Company was reported "Standing to" and ready to march out at the hour named. The marching out was delayed however until the Transport arrived at about 1.a.m. on the night of the 12th/13th.

This Transport was insufficient to accommodate the whole Company so that No.4. Platoon was unable to march out.

No.2. Platoon was commanded by Lt.T.B.KEILLOR M.C. whose report on subsequent Operations is appended.

On the 13-4-18 the VIIIth. Corps School marched in with all personnel but with very little Equipment - this School was accommodated in the Signal School Wing until they marched out again on the 27/4/18.

The Composite Company returned from the Front on 22-4-18. and arrangements were made for the reception & training of 16 Officers and 110 O.Ranks of the 77th. American Division who arrived at the School on the 28-4-18.

The Training was allotted as follows :-

Xth.Corps 60 Students for Infantry Instruction.

Aust.Corps School 6 Officers 12 O.Ranks for L.G.Instn 8 : Bombing : 2 : & 8 : Intellace.

The Officers Orderlies being trained in a special Course as "Runners"

Capt.H.O.ROBERTS, Lieut.G.McGOWAN, & N.C.O. Instructors were lent to the 39th.Division, B.E.F. as Signalling Instructors to train American Troops in a centralised Signal Training Area.

On the 27-4-18 No.587 C.S.M. WARD T. - an A.G.S. Instructor attached to the School Staff - was killed while passing an ammunition limber which was blown up by the accidental explosion of its contents.

REPORT BY Lieut.T.B.KEILLOR M.C. of the Aust. Corps Schools on work carried out by the Composite Company of the Xth.Corps & Aust.Corps

This Company was formed on April 12th. of all details attached to the above-mentioned Schools & proceeded under command of Captain STAPLES M.C. of Xth.Corps School to ST JANS CAPPEL by M.T. to report to Major-General PINNEY of the 33rd.Division for duty.

On arrival at ST JANS CAPPEL the Company was drafted into a Composite Battalion composed of the various Army & Corps Schools Staffs under command of Major LOCKHART of the 22nd.Corps School.

The situation then in that area was such that it was decided to move forward in support to the 33rd Division who up to that time had had to bear the brunt of the German attack in that Sector.

The defensive line on that date ran through BAILLEUL - METEREN - MERRIS - VIEUX-BERQUIN.

During the term of duty with the 33rd.Division the Composite
Battalion were in close support to the Middlesex Regiment,
New-Zealand Regiment, Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders, & South Stafford
Regiment and work consisted of holding & digging of defensive lines
in the BAILLEUL - METEREN Sector.

No fighting took place with the Company & casualties were as follows :-

1 Killed

2 wounded

4 missing.

The Company were relieved on April 19th. & moved back to billets at BOESCHEPE. On the 20th. the march was resumed & after resting at STAPLES on the night of the 20th. the Company arrived back at School on April 22nd.

On completion of duty the Composite Company were complimented by Major-General PINNEY, Commanding the 33rd. Division, on the very excellent work carried out by the Unit.
